#### Frenchy's sell-off plan fails community

Team Gash candidates are worried for the future of community buildings following a suggestion by Graham French, from Greg Watson's New Shoalhaven Independents team, that council assets should be sold off to fix the region's roads.

Mr French told Win News that Shoalhaven City Council-owned assets could be sold to cover the cost or road maintenance in the city.

Mayoral candidate Joanna Gash has questioned the viability of such a statement.

"He wants to sell off some of council's assets to pay for roads, but what happens when the next round of road repairs are due - will he want to start selling our community halls and swimming pools?" she questioned.

"Graham French is fixated on roads, but there's more to running a council than roads. "The current council has injected \$50 million into local roads projects and there is a schedule of works planned for the next two years.

"Selling council's assets to fund roads is a ludicrous statement that could place our community facilities at risk.

"What's the point of having the best roads if people have nowhere to go and no-one wants to drive here because we have no community assets to offer, like parks, pools, civic centres, sporting complexes and libraries?

"Over the past four years we have made a concerted effort to improve our city's roads and footpaths and, with 1732 kilometres to cover, it is a big job but as always we are committed to getting the job done.

"Do people want to see a never-ending spiral of asset sales to fix our roads? – I don't think so." Mrs Gash is concerned that Mr French's statement could lead to his team's support for the recently released Ross Report which recommended the sale of community halls.

"The report has created a great deal of concern after misleading letters stating that council is to close specific community halls," she said.

"I can assure you this has not been adopted by council and Team Gash does not support the closure of any community halls or the sale of community assets."




#### PALM BEACH and RAY BROOKS RESERVE

#### SURVEY INDICATES RESIDENTS HAPPY WITH COUNCIL

Residents are increasingly satisfied with Shoalhaven City Council's performance according to an independent survey released this week.

Research by the Illawarra Research and Information Service (IRIS) has revealed people were 87 per cent satisfied with council in 2016, up from 82 per cent in 2014.

Mayor Joanna Gash said the survey results, published in council's end of year report, also indicated the community's sense of personal wellbeing and safety have also improved.

"The results indicate the community's support for participation in council decision making and appreciation of council supported events," Cr Gash said.

"Those surveyed were pleased with council's ongoing support for our community volunteers and health and wellbeing outcomes."

Cr Gash said this positive outcome recognised council's commitment to community consultation since the engagement of a dedicated Community Consultation Body liaison officer, the attendance at CCB meetings by councillors and regular councillor inspection tours.

"We are pleased that residents can see that we want to be involved in the issues on the ground, to meet people in the townships where they live and to hear and understand what needs to be done to improve their quality of life," Cr Gash said.

"I'm also very encouraged that the majority of our community is feeling safer and with a better sense of wellbeing than a few years ago.

"I thank all local agencies, council's Community Services Team and the hundreds of volunteers and event organisers that make the Shoalhaven such a beautiful and vibrant place to live."

#### New focus on veterans

August 15, 2016

A new focus on mental health and unemployment among veterans and defence personnel is expected to have major benefits for the local area, according to Federal Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis.

She said the government had tasked the National Mental Health Commission with reviewing the suicide and self-harm prevention services available to veterans and Australian Defence Force members.

"One suicide is one too many and our community must address mental health issues together," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"The Government has announced an additional \$192 million to tackle mental health challenges across our nation and \$46.4 million specifically for veterans and Defence personnel to access free mental health treatment.

"This review will improve our understanding of mental health challenges and lead to better treatment for our veterans and the wider community.

"This is an issue right across Australia and a particular concern for our local veterans on behalf of their colleagues," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"This is an issue we have to tackle together — all of us need to be more aware of the challenges of mental illness and the debt we owe to our service men and women.

"The government is committed to action on veteran and ADF suicide and is working with the wider veteran community to achieve this."

Mrs Sudmalis also welcomed Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull's plans to host the first Prime Minister's Veterans' Employment Initiative in November, looking for ways for businesses to better use the skills of veterans and assist former Defence personnel transition to civilian employment.

"The Australians who have served in our armed forces have developed skills and leadership qualities that would be valuable to any business," she said.

"The Prime Minister's Veterans' Employment Initiative will bring business leaders and veterans face-toface so we can develop ways to effectively utilise this talent pool.

"I encourage the region's business leaders in to think about the skills offered by our veterans and how they could use them.

"They can send their suggestions to me directly at <u>ann.sudmalis.mp@aph.gov.au</u> and I will take these to the Employment Initiative event in November," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"Improving post-service opportunities for our Defence personnel is good for the economy, good for individual businesses and good for veterans."



#### From On The Beat - NSW Police Crime Prevention

#### On the Beat with Senior Constable Anthony Jory.

Today we are going to learn about locking mechanisms in vehicles.

There are a few tools that you will need when unlocking and locking a car door.

A key ring: This is required to put your car key on to.

A car key: This is required to be put on a key ring.

Once you have the car key on the key ring, you must decide what you want to do with the vehicle. If you are going to drive the vehicle, you will have to approach it first.

If you have electric locks, push the open padlock icon on the black part of your car key and the doors will unlock.

If you don't have automatic locking, place the key into the driver's side door lock and turn anti clockwise, you are then able to enter the vehicle and drive to anywhere you want.

When you have made it to your destination, get out of your vehicle. Once outside your vehicle face the door.

For automatic locking, push the closed padlock icon on the black part of your car key and the doors will lock.

If you don't have automatic locking, place the key into the driver's side door and turn it clockwise.

You will find that the car door is locked from this point on.

Repeat this sequence every time you go out in the car and when you return to your home.

Remember: Do not Drink and Drive.
