From the office of the Shoalhaven Local Area Command.

As a result of ongoing 'hoon' and traffic related issues in Shoalhaven's Bay and Basin area, a traffic operation was conducted over the nights of 18 - 20 August 16 (inc.) using resources from Huskisson/Nowra General Duties and Nowra/Ulladulla/Wollongong Highway Patrol.

The operation targeted traffic/hoon associated offences with excellent results achieved including: Charges - 4 x Low Range PCA, 6 x Mid Range PCA, 3 x High Range PCA, Pursuit (Skye's Law), Suspended Driver, Unlicensed Driver. In addition 204 mobile RBT were conducted, 7 defects, 2 defect notices and 2 warning enhancement notices issued, 49 Traffic Infringement Notice's, 2 x vehicle searches, 1 x move on direction and 2 drug detections with Court Attendance Notice's issued.

Intelligence obtained from social media indicates the strong police presence in the area had a significant impact on the activities of suspects involved in the hoon type of traffic offences including burnouts and street racing in the area.

There will be further operations in the future.

Australia's unpaid carers will next week spend an amazing 36 million hours caring for family members or friends who are frail or aged, or have a disability, mental illness, chronic condition or terminal illness.

And they will do the same the week after, and the week after that.

While it is hard to count up the hours carers contribute to our community, Federal Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis, is calling on everyone to show the region's carers how much they count during National Carers Week 2016.

"There are thousands of carers in the Gilmore electorate, and they help hold together the community in the various towns and villages in our region," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"The vast majority of this unpaid care takes place within the family home, strengthening bonds of understanding and compassion between people, between generations and maintaining the family as the strongest and most important building block of a caring society."

Mrs Sudmalis said she had met many carers who had revealed the joy, the fulfilment, and sometimes frustration that accompanied their roles.

She said she was hoping to hear from more, so she could tell their stories in Parliament.

"National Carers Week in October 16 to 22, which is a Parliamentary sitting week, and I would love to read stories from our local carers into the Parliamentary record," Mr Sudmalis said.

Get on board Gone Fishing Day

Local residents have the opportunity to be part of Australia's first ever National Gone Fishing Day will take place on October 16, a day for everyone to get out on the water and celebrate our love of fishing

"Clubs in Sussex Inlet and St Georges Basin have registered to participate in this fun local event so everyone in the local area has the chance to be involved and enjoy a day of fishing," said Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock.

"Gone Fishing Day events would be held in 44 locations across NSW on October 16, Basin Lure & Fly Club and Sussex Inlet Bowling Club Fishing Club successfully applied for funding to run community fishing activities for this event.

"About 850,000 recreational fishers go fishing somewhere in NSW each year, many in and around the Sussex Inlet/Bay and Basin area.

"The level of interest in community grants has been fantastic with the NSW Government providing \$65,000 in funding to support the day's activities from the NSW Recreational Fishing Trust.

"I encourage all our local fishers, and especially non-fishers who would like to give it a try to get involved and experience how much fun fishing can be for the whole family." Mrs Hancock concluded.

The NSW Government has removed the requirement to hold a recreational fishing licence on Gone Fishing Day to encourage new participants to take part in this event.



MONTHLY COLUMN OF THE FEDERAL MEMBER FOR GILMORE





We live in a special part of the world.

As the Federal Member for Gilmore I am aware of the generosity of people in this region. Representatives from a range of organisations including the Red Cross and Salvation Army have regularly told me how donations in Gilmore are above the average for other parts of the nation, however I was not prepared for what I saw during a recent visit to the St Vincent De Paul warehouse in South Nowra.

Under the stewardship of St Vincent De Paul regional centres manager Rod Douglass, the warehouse that was opened earlier this year is already bringing in huge amounts of donated clothing and other items. In fact there is so much donated that after the best is kept for resale at Vinnies shops throughout the region, there is enough left over to fill a shipping container each week during the warmer months, and fortnightly during winter.

About 16 to 18 tonnes of clothing is shipped overseas where it is distributed through organisations including World Vision and Oxfam to people in need in some of the world's poorest nations. Cutlery, crockery, cookware and other assorted bric-a-brac that is excess to local need is also sent overseas, while Vinnies at South Nowra is in the process of shipping out 180 new computer desks to schools in Fiji that were damaged in a recent cyclone. This work is carried out by a team of 360 volunteers and Work for the Dole participants, who put in close to 3500 volunteer hours each week.

The volunteering effort and local generosity really is changing lives across the globe, and of course changing lives at home too, with Vinnies helping out people who are in need. It is also having a major impact on the lives of people helping out in the warehouse, who are building new friendships, confidence, skills and connections in their local communities. That is one of the great things about volunteering – it creates new connections, friendships and networks that are such a vital part of an enjoyable life, as well as giving people a sense of achievement and belonging.

Recently I have been able to thank many local volunteer groups for the contributions they make to our community, as well as passing on thousands of dollars in Federal Government grants to help with things including buying new equipment and upskilling volunteers. However it has become obvious that there are times our local voluntary organisations are working on projects in isolation, unaware that other groups are trying to achieve similar things.

My office is working on helping volunteer organisations connect and work together, and I'm asking all organisations to email their contact details, and any projects they are working on, to ann.sudmalis.mp@aph.gov.au.

From On The Beat - NSW Police Crime Prevention

On the Beat with Senior Constable Anthony Jory.

When to call the Police to an accident - Picture this, you are driving along in your car on a lovely summer's day. Your partner/spouse is quietly sitting in the passenger seat and the kids are sitting quietly in the back seat studying. The only image you have in your head is a circus monkey

banging cymbals to circus music.

You are driving to the speed limit and being careful. Suddenly a car comes from your right and crashes into your car. The bonnet crumples, steam comes out of the engine and the car is pushed to the side of the road. The other vehicle is also in similar shape but luckily nobody is injured in either vehicle. You and the other driver are able to move both vehicles off the road. At this time you ask yourself, "Do I have to call the Police?"

Police will attend any crash where the answer is 'yes' to one or more of the following:

Is anyone trapped, killed or injured, or

Has anyone involved failed to exchange details, or

Do any drivers appear affected by alcohol or drugs, or

Are police needed to direct traffic or deal with hazards,

Does a bus or truck need to be towed, or

Are there hazards present (eg. leaking fluids, damage to power poles/structures, etc), or Are there any other issues requiring police attendance (e.g. aggressive/criminal etc).

Generally police will no longer investigate 'tow away only' crashes, however they will retain discretion to investigate traffic offences detected in any type of behaviour crash and take action against offending drivers where they deem it appropriate. So if you and the other driver exchange particulars, nobody is injured, and nobody appears to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol and there is no danger, you generally don't need to contact the police.

P.S (There is no such thing as kids sitting quietly in the back seat studying) or at least I've never seen it.

Party Time - It's almost time for the end of school celebrations to kick off. Most of the celebrations include private parties. These parties bring underage drinkers and intoxicating liquor together which could have devastating consequences.

There are no laws against having parties, however if you supply any person under the age of 18 with intoxicating liquor and you do not have the permission of the parents you are committing an offence and could face an \$11,000 fine and or 12 months in the big house.

Depending on the type of incident, the consequences could even be worse.

Remember: Do not Drink and Drive.
