The name of WAYNE WALKER has been assigned to the newly purchased vessel and if this

vessel is only half as reliable as its namesake, it also will be destined to perform with the dignity and reliability of experience, required of all members of Marine Rescue NSW.















On another issue... Here are some early plans of the new home base for the Sanctuary Point Men's Shed, which may be changed after community ideas are sought, on other plans which will be suggested by the Men's shed at a later date.







In the interest of public safety, I have included the following information, which I received in an email from CDC who is the Centres for Disease Control and is the national public health institute of the United States.

As New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia ban on commercial Solariums (Sun beds,) come into force on the 31st December 2014 and the Australian Autumn is now in the 2nd month, it would represent an increase in the use of other means of tanning the body, with the belief that indoor tanning is safe.

I believe as concerned citizens, if you see something that is Wrong, we should try to do something to correct the problem or minimise the danger... Hopefully! Someone who reads this, may have second thoughts about using tanning beds, or at least will have another view to consider!

The Burning Truth



A lot of people believe indoor tanning is safe. The truth is, tanning beds injure thousands of people each year badly enough to go to a hospital, and that's just the beginning. People who indoor tan damage their skin, often getting wrinkles, warts, rashes, and dark spots. They may even get skin infections, cataracts in their eyes, and—most dangerous of all—skin cancer, including deadly melanoma.



Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States, and unlike almost all other kinds of cancer, the rates are climbing. This is definitely not a trend you want to follow. Avoiding indoor tanning and protecting yourself from the sun when outdoors are the best ways to reduce your chance of getting skin cancer.

CDC's new Burning Truth communication initiative encourages you to keep your skin healthy and beautiful for life by protecting yourself from too much exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays from the sun and tanning beds.

Know the Burning Truth about these tanning myths—

A Base Tan Is Not a Safe Tan. There is a common misconception that a tan acts as the body's natural protection against sunburn. The Burning Truth: A tan is the body's response to injury from UV rays, showing that damage has been done. A "base tan" only provides a sun protection factor (SPF) of about 3 or less, which does little to protect you from future UV exposure.


Tanned Skin Is Not Healthy Skin. Some people believe the tanning bed gives them a "healthy glow." The Burning Truth: Whether tanning or burning, you are exposing yourself to harmful UV rays that damage your skin. In fact, every time you tan, you increase your risk of melanoma. The truly healthy glow is your natural skin colour.

Controlled Tanning Is Not Safe Tanning. You may have heard that indoor tanning is the safer way to tan because you can control your level of exposure to UV rays. The Burning Truth: Sensible indoor tanning is a myth. Indoor tanning exposes you to intense UV rays, increasing your risk of melanoma—the second most common cancer in women between 20 and 29 years old.

When these trees are removed, I will consider that this issue has been resolved, not only by the determination of Concerned Citizens of the Shoalhaven, But, by the current Mayor, Councillors and a General Management Administration who are listening to the people of the Shoalhaven! And for this... We thank you!

Proposed Bay and Basin Skate Park locations announced

Shoalhaven City Council has decided on the locations for proposed skate parks in the Shoalhaven following this week's Extraordinary Meeting.

Council is seeking funding for two local skate parks and Stage Two of the Learn to Ride facility at Shoalhaven Heads through the Australian Government's Regional Development Funding program.

Federal Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis MP made a commitment to the funding earlier this year.

As such, Council will be submitting a funding submission for the following local projects -

- Local youth park (including skate park upgrade) at Francis Ryan Reserve, Sanctuary Point.
- Local skate park at Yulunga Reserve, Manyana.
- Stage Two of the Learn to ride facility at Jerry Bailey Reserve, Shoalhaven Heads.

The Extraordinary Meeting also saw Council identify a further \$650,000 in its Long Term Financial Plan for the delivery of a 'District' Skate Park at the Bay and Basin Leisure Centre.

Mayor, Joanna Gash said Council had engaged with the local community through both social media and a well-attended community forum in determining the locations of the proposed skate parks.

"Council has received a lot of positive support for the proposed skate facilities within the Bay and Basin area," said Clr Gash.

"I would certainly like to thank all of the local residents that took the time to have their say on the proposed locations via social media or attended the recently held community forum.

"Council has seen the success of skate and youth parks in other locations throughout the area and I'm sure a similar facility will provide a very well utilised amenity for local residents in these areas."

"By identifying additional funding within the Long Term Financial Plan, Council will also be able to deliver on the District Skate Park at the Bay and Basin Leisure Centre."

The identification of a District Skate Park location will also allow Council to seek and apply for grant funding opportunities.

Further consultation will commence shortly to assist Council in developing a concept design for the local youth park and upgrade for Frances Ryan Reserve as well as the local skate park at Yulunga Reserve, Manyana.
