Closure of Small Depots

March 27, 2020

Due to heightened restrictions and staff availability, the following Recycling and Waste depots have been closed until further notice.

- Kioloa
- Lake Conjola
- Bendalong
- Sussex Inlet
- Callala
- Berry
- Kangaroo Valley

Our remaining depots, West Nowra, Huskisson and Ulladulla are still open.

For the safety of our staff and the greater community we wish to remind residents that the Federal Government have directed that "All Australians are required to stay home unless it is absolutely necessary to go outside".

This applies to waste that is not essential. Waste that is not a health hazard including green waste, building waste and recyclables are not deemed essential, as this waste can be stored for a long period without creating a health hazard.

Council is asking residents to adhere to social distancing rules and minimize interactions with depot staff by not attending depots to dispose of non-essential waste.

Waste that can affect the health of the community, like food waste and animal poo is considered "essential waste" and should be placed in your red kerbside bin for collection.

Our depot staff are experiencing the same uncertainties as the rest of the Shoalhaven community through this challenging time and we ask residents to stop and consider how their activities can risk the health of staff, themselves and the community.







FUNDING BOOST FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS

The electorate of South Coast has today secured \$299,747 in funding for a total of fifteen projects through the NSW Government's 2019 Community Building Partnership Program.

CHECKING THE COURSE FOR REGIONAL AVIATION

Regional Australia boasts some of this country's most beautiful landscapes, tourist attractions and it is home to millions of people, which is why the Australian Government is seeking views on how to improve connectivity and innovation in regional aviation.

The Government has today released an Issues Paper, the first step in preparing the Regional Aviation Policy Statement.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development Michael McCormack said it's important anyone who travels on planes or through airports has the opportunity to contribute.

"The Issues Paper will help all stakeholders assess the challenges, risks and opportunities for regional aviation operators and the communities in which they operate," Mr McCormack said.

"It will identify how community access and the delivery of goods and services can be better supported to improve transport connectivity.

"The benefits the aviation industry can offer regional communities are enormous and that's why we are committed to getting our Policy Statement right."

Senator for New South Wales Jim Molan said the roles of the different tiers of Government and industry in regional aviation will be canvassed, including the provision of aviation services and airport infrastructure.

"We want regional Australians in Gilmore to benefit from all aviation programs operating in regional Australia," Senator Molan said.

The Regional Aviation Policy Issues Paper will be the first in what is expected to be a series of issues papers addressing key issues impacting the aviation industry.

The Government is accepting submissions on the Issues Paper until Friday 17 April 2020.

Submission for Proposed Alternative Layout of the Princes Highway at Jervis Bay Road, Falls Creek 2540 with a Northerly turn going under the Princess Highway.

From Shoalhaven River Bridge to Kalandar Street there are 7 sets of Traffic Lights followed by 5 Roundabouts to Western Road, namely, Hillcrest Avenue, Browns Road, Quinns Lane, Central Avenue & Western Road. Another Roundabout at Jervis Bay Road and one more at Island Point Road, will be 7 Roundabouts and so far we have only travelled less than 30 km on our journey from Nowra to the Victorian border!

I do not dispute that roundabouts are probably the cheapest method of slowing down and redirecting traffic at intersections, where high impact accidents have occurred, but! 14 locations of slowing traffic on a major Highway, within a 30 kilometre distance, in my opinion is irresponsible and will not alleviate accidents caused by human errors and traffic joining the Princes Highway from Jervis Bay Road will continue to have a long queue of frustrated drivers!

The Jervis Bay Road intersection, would probably have the perfect lay out of land to construct an underpass, under the Princess Highway. If only someone would really have a look at the terrane on the Eastern and Western side of the Highway at Jervis Bay Road, If properly constructed, there would be minimal delay to highway traffic and there would be no future slowing of traffic at the Jervis Bay Road intersection of the Princes Highway... And I also believe this would be constructed at a lesser cost than an overpass!

SOUTH COAST A NO-GO ZONE ONCE AGAIN

Only a few weeks ago, local people were crying out for the tourists to return to the South Coast after the devastating impact of the fires, but that call has once again been reversed as concerns over the spread of COVID-19 mount.

VVith Easter fast approaching. Member for Gilmore, Fiona Phillips MP has called for tourists considering holidaying on the NSVV South Coast to rethink that plan. This also means anyone who owns a holiday home and is planning to self-isolate away from their usual place of residence should simply stay put.

"Our community has been through so much over the last few months and I know it comes as a cruel blow to again be sending tourists away so soon," Floria Phillips said.

"But I cannot say this in strong enough terms – all tourists, holiday makers and other would-be travellers who do not normally call the South Coast home must stay away this Easter,"

"Vive need to make sure the health and wellbeing of our community comes first and while it would like to see harder and faster restrictions put in place to formally stop this, we all need to play our role in limiting exposure for ourselves and for others," she said.

The Gilmore MP said many local people have raised concerns about tourists visiting the area or choosing to self-isolate away from home, ignoring the Prime Minister's warnings to avoid all non-essential travel.

While it might seem ideal to self-isolate on the beautiful South Coast, health services and other infrastructure are simply not set up to cope with that additional strain and this will place everyone – locals and travellers alike – at greater risk.

Mrs Phillips said the beach will still be waiting for you when the threat has abated and tourists should simply delay their trip until it is safe to do so.

"The South Coast will be waiting for you with open arms when the time is right,"

"Please, If you are thinking about coming to the South Coast – Just stay home," Fiona Phillips said.

Council's Building and Development Services Adapt During the COVID-19 Crisis

Shoalhaven City Council is committed to providing services to the development industry and the community during the COVID-19 crisis, but most interactions with customers will be electronic or via the phone to protect the health and safety of staff and the community.

Council's CEO Stephen Dunshea said, "We appreciate the value of our construction industry in the current economic circumstances and are committed to do all we can to keep business happening and to continue to do inspections and process DAs.

"Although our Administration building is closed to the public and most Building and Development Services staff are working remotely, DAs in the system are being worked on and can proceed to determination," he said.

Mr Dunshea said, "Electronic lodgement of DAs can be accepted via our development services email, development@shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au

We ask customers to ensure that all the required information is provided when lodging a DA, to allow processing to proceed and avoid delays caused by the need to request further information. Customers need to collect consents from DA Tracking and floor plans will be emailed separately. "Subdivision and roadwork's (including driveway) inspections will continue however staff will not be interacting with site workers. If separation distances cannot be achieved or are questionable, the inspection will need to be rescheduled," said Mr Dunshea.

"Shoalhaven City Council is committed to ensuring the development sector remains operational, in a responsible manner and further changes may be necessary in response to public health advice," he said.

Watch What You Flush

Shoalhaven Water is reminding customers to watch what they flush after seeing an increase in sewer chokes. With many in the region turning to alternatives to toilet paper, Shoalhaven Water would like to remind customers that **only** toilet paper can be flushed. All other items do not break down and not only cause a choke in the sewer line but may clog customers systems causing an overflow.

Common causes of a sewer blockage include wet wipes, kitchen paper, rags, nappies, sanitary pads and tissues. Council recommend if residents feel the need to use toilet paper alternatives that they dispose of these alternatives in their kerbside red bin.

Signs of sewer blockage may include:

Toilets, basins, baths or tubs are slow to empty
Toilets overflow or fill higher than usual
Yard gully overflows when the toilet is flushed or when basins
or baths are released
Sewer access pits overflow
Gurgling noises occur in sanitary drains

From On The Beat - NSW Police Shoalhaven Crime Prevention

In the old days it was a very slow process contacting our friends and family. The only option to contact anyone before the phone was invented was by writing a letter, licking a stamp and hoping that the letter would find the intended recipient before they died of old age.

The Telephone came to our shores about August 1880 and helped to close the gap, however the biggest step in communications and connectivity to the outside world has been the Google net and social networks such as facebook. Facebook and similar social networking websites bring us closer together. We now can chat to anyone in the world, and comment on and review anything that tickles your fancy. You can upload videos on your facebook page and YouTube.

CCTV is now an affordable system that we can use to help with the security of our valuables and to dissuade offenders from committing crimes on our properties, however there are some crooks that do not care or cannot see the camera's and unfortunately for them get caught on CCTV which can be downloaded and forwarded to Police to help with the investigation. CCTV is good evidence and it compliments any other evidence that may be gleaned from a crime scene such as fingerprints and DNA. Police require evidence to lead them to the person who committed the crime and must prove beyond a reasonable doubt to a magistrate in Court that the person in front of them is guilty as charged, however the Court of Public opinion on social network sites are not held to the same standard that Police investigations are.

We have all seen Facebook videos of crooks committing crimes and the public posting names of the offenders and expressing their discontent at the actions of the alleged offender, however there are times that the CCTV is posted on Social networks before the footage is handed to Police. Placing CCTV on social networks may hinder an investigation and may also lead to persons being named and shamed who are not the offender but merely a person that resembles the crook.

NSW Police have a Facebook page (EYEWATCH) and yes, we have a local page for the South Coast PD. This is a powerful tool for us to use to identify offenders. Images of a person of interest is posted onto the EYEWATCH page, however we ask that any person with information regarding the person of interest to contact local Police or Crime Stoppers. This will ensure that any images or CCTV will be admissible in Court and the identification of the accused is solid.

When you report a crime and you have CCTV footage, please hand it to Police and resist the temptation to put the footage on social media as your first action. Have a chat to the investigator and ask if it is appropriate.

Remember: Do not Drink and Drive and you can Dob in a Druggie any time you like, by contacting Nowra Police or ringing Crime Stoppers. on 1800 333 000
