I believe, the Sanctuary Point Men's Shed Should be back home in Sanctuary Point where they rightly belong!

On the 1st August 2012, I had the privilege, to have received an invitation to visit the Sanctuary Point Men's Shed at Woollamia road Falls Creek and although they have a wonderful facility, in a grand location within the Shoalhaven, their facility is on private property and although permission to use the facility, has been graciously allowed by the property owner, who is also one of their many dedicated members, I would be pleased to see Council timing, funding and approval be given, that could see the Sanctuary Point Men's Shed be relocated in an appropriate facility within the Clifton Park Reserve in Sanctuary Point.

Much speculation has been given to Clifton Park over the years and is a location fairly central to the residents of Sanctuary Point. I have heard of a recommendation from the community, to set up a space for a community garden, where ownership could be provided by the residents, to provide their time and labour to create a variety of living plants to enhance the natural beauty and allow vegetables, flowers, shrubs and trees to grow in harmony and give pride to the many who would visit the park, to toil the soil, or simply use the facility as a recreational enjoyment.

With the Men's shed also located near the Gardens, I have been told of the realistic possibilities, of the Men's shed providing the solar power to run the Solar Pumps for reusing the rain water collected from the roof and used in the watering of the living plants in the garden. Visits to the gardens could coincide with visits to the men's shed and provide the running costs to sustain both the men's shed and the community gardens. This is just the thoughts and speculations of what could be done! But; what a wonderful thought if ... the speculation became a reality and we had a Council who could make it happen!

Sure it's nice to have a Mobile Command Post and other forms of Police vehicles to respond to the hot spots, when and where they occur and of course I know of the professionalism and dedication of the majority of our Police enforcers and some of the thankless duties they are called upon to contain, I grew up with a brother, who gave thirty three years of his life with the NSW Police Force! ... How much time will you give and encourage our Police to Make the arrests?
