





# New name and brand for the Art Gallery

The aboriginal word for Nowra the 'Black Cockatoo' has been the inspiration for the new rebrand of the renamed Shoalhaven City Arts Centre and Regional Gallery.

Over the past 13 years, the Shoalhaven City Arts Centre and Regional Gallery has become a creative hub for the Shoalhaven community and wider regional area. The Gallery provides a professional space for housing the Shoalhaven City Art Collection, supporting and showcasing local artists, exhibiting the best local, regional and national art for our community, showcasing events, workshops and providing creative enjoyment.

Shoalhaven City Council decided to rebrand the Gallery to the Shoalhaven Regional Gallery Nowra to showcase the local area and our local talent. The new branding reflects and confirms the gallery's commitment to visual arts, artists and communities of the Shoalhaven.

The logo design is inspired by Nowra, the Aboriginal word for Black Cockatoo. The feather signifies our unique location through the inclusion of colours found in the Black Cockatoo's tail feather and the colour palette of the Shoalhaven coast. The feather is also a versatile artistic tool creates a connection to artists and artmaking. The blue underscore represents the familiar natural feature of the Shoalhaven, water. The rebrand was designed inhouse through Council.

Mayor Councillor Amanda Findley said, "The Regional Gallery, is committed to providing a vibrant and engaging public program designed to further community relationships and continue to fulfil the role as the 'go to' arts hub."





#### **Pet Registration Reminders**





Is your cat or dog registered on the NSW Pet Registry? As a requirement of the NSW Companion Animals Act all dogs and cats over six months in age must be registered. Shoalhaven City Council will be issuing reminder registration notices to local pet owners who have a dog or cat that is older than six months of age and not lifetime registered.

Microchipping and registration is a two-part process which enables dogs and cats to be recorded on the NSW Companion Animals Register or the new NSW Pet Registry which replaced the Companion Animals Register.

Registering is easily completed online at <a href="www.petregistry.nsw.gov.au">www.petregistry.nsw.gov.au</a>. You can update your address and contact details, claim an existing pet, change ownership of your pet and pay lifetime registration fees online. However, if help is needed to register your pet please contact or visit Shoalhaven City Council. The register is administered by all NSW councils on behalf of the State Government.

Council's Unit Manager for Ranger Services, Michael Jarman said, "It is a requirement that all dogs and cats are identified with a microchip by 12 weeks of age or prior to the animal being sold or given away (whichever occurs first)."

"Pet owners should be aware that their cat or dog needs to be microchipped by 12 weeks of age and then also registered at six months. A penalty notice can be issued for failing to register your animal or for failing to notify Council when your details have changed. This includes updating details if the animal changes address, changes ownership, goes missing or dies."

If a pet or pet owner's circumstances change, information must be provided in writing to Council within:

Fourteen days of any change to the registration details, that is if a pet owner moves or changes phone numbers or a dog or cat is adopted by someone else

Twenty-eight days of the dog or cat dying

Four days of the dog or cat going missing

Lifetime registration in NSW is a one-off payment and can be completed at Council's administration offices in Nowra and Ulladulla.

The fee schedule for NSW lifetime registration is:

Un-desexed dog/cat \$201

Desexed dog/cat \$55

Animal not desexed under 6 months of age\* \$55

Desexed dog/cat sold by eligible shelter not owned by Pensioner \$27.50

Desexed dog/cat owned by a pensioner \$23

Dog/cat owned by a recognised breeder \$55

Dog/cat owned as an Assistance Animal FREE

\*Enables pet owners intending to have their cat or dog desexed to access the discounted registration fee. The pet must be desexed and the Pet Registry updated before the pet reaches 6 months of age. If desexing does not occur, then the additional fee of \$146 applies. Where the pet is not desexed or the additional fee not paid, the registration is cancelled and penalties may apply.

## One only - New single use unisex toilet coming to Clifton Park

The following photo of the toilet and explanation as to Why! Council are using them, has been copied from Council Web Site



## Single use unisex toilets

#### Why:

- **Equality access for all everyone** treated equally as a person regardless of gender or disability
- Parents or carers can take children and persons with disabilities of opposite sex into same toilet
- Persons feel safer using single use toilet
- In low utilisation areas just one toilet is required and all share
- If there is a choice of two or more toilets
- Persons with a disability that have either right or left side restricted movement are able to use the toilet with a grab rail that suits. Two persons of the same gender can utilise the toilet at the same time, rather than a toilet sits vacant and a person waits
- Council has single unisex toilets (no-shared all gender) at a number of locations throughout the Shoalhaven.

The kiddies playground in the smaller part of Clifton Park, has an isolated little piece of equipment, that is rarely being used in its present isolated position. The relocation of this piece of equipment back into the larger Clifton Park, being

utilised by the Community Garden, Learn To Ride Track,

The Sanctuary Point Men's Shed and the Dog Walking compound, would materialise an empty piece of Land, that with the expertise of Shoalhaven Council Planning Department, if it was to be re zoned as residential and appropriately sold as such, would probably raise in excess of \$300,000 that could offset the funding of a proper toilet block, in a village of over 7,000 residents and who knows how many tourists, who visit with their children. And Guess What! One less Park to Maintain... Elementary My Dear Council!

#### Steal from motor vehicles

Steal from motor vehicles have been a bit of a hot topic this week with a number of incidents in the North Nowra area.

The facts are simply this. If you leave your car unlocked and your valuables within the vehicle in full view and a thief wanders up your driveway and looks in your car it is likely that your vehicle will be entered and the property stolen. If you have forgotten to lock your car and have no property within and a thief wanders up the driveway and looks in to your car. it is likely that the thief will move on and not even bother to enter the vehicle. If you lock your vehicle and a thief wanders up the driveway and looks into your car and there is no property within, it is again more likely that the thief moves on.

I have seen footage of this in action. In one case four persons walked up a driveway during the night. Two vehicles were parked side to side. One vehicle was locked the other vehicle was unlocked with property within. The unlocked vehicle was opened and the property stolen. Even though two different crooks tried the doors to the locked vehicle, both walked away without attempting any other action to enter the vehicle.

There have been and probably will be forever, people arguing the subject of locked v unlocked, but the fact remains if there is no property within the vehicle that is visible or likely to attract further scrutiny by an offender then the reward for the action will be removed and offences reduced.
