Woolworths Marketplace Development at Vincentia NSW.

I can remember the meeting which took place in the Vincentia community hall, one Tuesday evening at 7.30 pm on the 16th February 2012. The hall was packed to bursting point and so many more concerned people, jostled for the best advantage points outside of the hall. You may wonder why! So many people were attending the hall, it was very hot, with windows and doors wide open, but! We could not care, Woolworths were coming to town, well! Their speaker Mr Patrick Hall, Woolworths Project Manager for the Vincentia Marketplace, to be constructed on the already commenced clearing of the allocated land for development.

I and so many of us, listened with excitement, as the Project Manager spoke of the construction plan, that would bring wealth and prosperity to the whole of the Bay & Basin and would also encourage tourism to the Shoalhaven, far and wide, as many Big W shoppers would flock to spend their money on the wide range of merchandise at their disposal.

7500 sqm full size big W— same as Dapto & Shellharbour.

4200 sqm full line Woolworths supermarket.

1450 sqm Aldi.

5500 sqm Specialty Shops (45 stores).

Parking for 9500 cars. (Correction 950 cars).

Building in bush design.

Community area, Natural lighting, solar panels & LED Lights.

Water quality Treatment, High ceilings and best practice design.

As if this wasn't enough to encourage the community, the prospect of 500 jobs that could be created, was but another plus in the hat with all of the other benefits.

This is what Mr Hall said then! So what has gone terrible wrong since then?

In an article written by DAYLE LATHAM of the South Coast Register July 23, 2012, 8:39 a.m. Mr Latham reported that: "Mr Hall said the development was challenged by the cost of road works required for development consent. "It's in the order of \$17 million to complete the road works that council wants us to. "In light of that we are looking at ways and working with council to potentially stage development to reduce the scope of the road works to make it viable for the community," he said.

In essence, the developer is looking at options to reduce the size of the centre and stagger development. "That way, we can work with council to reduce the scope of road works to something more manageable and appropriate for the centre," he said. He said the scope of the road works required by council was unprecedented, compared to other sites around the country. "But we are working with them to make sure we get the right outcome for community. The last thing we want is a bottleneck, so there is a balance that needs to be achieved," he said.

Mr Hall said the road works had originally been based on forecasted population growth figures done in 2006, which had not been achieved. However he confirmed Woolworths was definitely going ahead with the development and was committed to the project. He added there had recently been a lot of strong support from the community. "Traditionally there has been some push back and objections from the community, but more recently there has been a quiet majority coming out and wanting to see the development happen," he said. Mr Hall said he would like to see the development progress as soon as possible; they were just waiting to resolve the road work issues with council".

I would have thought, given the location of the proposed Big W within the Shoalhaven and the population growth in the Bay& Basin, it would have been prudent of the Shoalhaven Council, to have seen the benefits of the Big W in a major developing community, without the prospects of local job incentives, to have such quality development and job opportuni-

ties, injected into our communities, without council having to come up with alternative ideas, to provide employment in such fast growing towns of the Shoalhaven. The Jervis Bay Road / Naval College Road has in the past been notorious for its bends and narrow roads and although it is used by the many, why is so much attention put on WOLLWORTHS?


