Shoalhaven Entertainment Centre ANNOUNCING VENUE UPGRADES

We have some exciting news! The Shoalhaven Entertainment Centre is set to undergo major upgrades ensuring that it remains the region's state-of-the-art performing arts and conference venue.

Plans for the upgrade include improvements to maintain compliance with the Building Code of Australia, re-design of the Centre's Encore Café & Bar, and a new a loading dock shelter to increase the accessibility of equipment to the venue in all weather. Sound, lighting and audio-visual systems will also be upgraded.

The upgrade works will require the Centre to be closed from December 2020 with expected completion in May 2021.

This announcement does impact a number of shows scheduled for the venue. If you have booked to a show that's been affected, you will receive a separate email regarding your options. Please wait to hear from us as we are exploring alternative options now that the refurbishment timeline has been confirmed.

Fairer Go For Retirees

Retirement village residents across the South Coast will be protected by new laws that increase safeguards around the sale of their property and provide early access to their financial entitlements to meet the cost of moving into aged care.

Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock said that under the changes the NSW Government has increased accountability and transparency in the retirement village sector.

"We have introduced a raft of new reforms that will improve access to exit entitlements, make the transition to aged care easier and cap the period of time residents pay recurrent charges for general services," Mrs Hancock said.

"This is about creating a fairer retirement village market for our local retirees. These new laws will assist them with a level playing field.

"We know that residents often have to wait for quite a long time for their premises to be sold before they receive their exit entitlements, which can place a heavy financial and personal burden on them and their families.

"This is simply not good enough, so we've changed the rules so they can access these payments sooner, making it cheaper and simpler to move out."

Mrs Hancock said the NSW Government is also making it easier for retirement village residents to transition directly into aged care.

"More than 60 percent of residents transition from villages directly into aged care accommodation. However, under the status quo, many can't afford these costs if their unit does not sell quickly," Mrs Hancock said.

"Under the reforms, the operator will need to cover a portion of the estimated sale price and pay this directly to the aged care provider, allowing a seamless transfer."

Also included in the new laws is a requirement that if a unit remains unsold after six months in metropolitan areas or 12 months in the regions, residents will be eligible to receive their exit entitlements if the village operator has not taken reasonable steps to facilitate a sale.

"The NSW Government is putting power back into the hands of residents and making sure they are not taken advantage of," Mrs Hancock said.

Look out before you step out for a safer Shoalhaven

Shoalhaven City Council has partnered with Coastal Waters Retirement Village on a pedestrian road safety campaign with the aim to reduce the number and severity of casualty crashes involving pedestrians in the Shoalhaven LGA.

Each year, more than 1500 pedestrians are hit or injured on NSW roads. From 2015-2019, there were 4 fatal and 18 serious injury casualty crashes involving pedestrians in the Shoalhaven LGA. 31% of the pedestrian casualties were aged 60 and over.

In light of these findings, Coastal Waters Retirement Village sought to collaborate with Shoalhaven City Council on introducing pedestrian safety improvements throughout the Village after seeing the Look out Before you Step Out Campaign which aims to increase awareness of pedestrian safety.

The campaign, funded by Transport for NSW creates awareness at high pedestrian activity locations to remind pedestrians to stop and look before crossing the road. Mayor Amanda Findley supported the collaboration between Council and Coastal Waters Retirement Village.

"The Look Out Before you Step Out message is something that we can all get behind, to ensure pedestrian safety is at the forefront of our mind when out and about.

"The vinyl decals installed at Coastal Waters Retirement Village help to raise awareness of the 'Look out before you step out' rule for pedestrians when crossing the road and when using a mobile phone when walking in the Village," Mayor Findley said.

Michael Deane, Coastal Waters Village Manager embraced the program after collaborating the campaign idea with employees Michael Burke and the staff at Coastal Waters to target locations of high pedestrian activities within the Coastal Waters Retirement Village.

"Coastal Waters Retirement village comprises of 359 two and three bedroom villas and is home to over 500 residents. 15 different streets and parades flow throughout the village and the various footpaths and crossings that intersect each other effectively make up its own walking track of more than 4 kilometres when used by residents as exercise routes.

The Senior New Migraine Therapies for Five Million Australians

Sadly, almost five million Australians get

regular migraine headaches, yet there are few effective medications to prevent or treat these debilitating episodes. In addition, many prescribed medications are not specifically developed for migraines and can have other side-effects that can cause further issues.

Clinical research in Australia is run by medical specialists and professionals and includes advanced check-ups and the latest support and advice not normally available - commonly known as the "clinical trial advantage". Participants get first access to therapies often years before they are available from GPs or chemists. Many clinical research projects include scans and tests - all free of charge. Most are open to people aged 18-70 and include regular visits to local migraine clinics.

One of the challenges in developing new therapies is that people don't know there are clinical trials for their medical condition on now near them. To support people joining studies travel costs including taxis are usually covered, with some trials even covering flight charges!

According to the Nation Institute for Aging some of the benefits of a clinical trial include:

- You may get a new treatment for a disease before it is available to everyone.
- You play a more active role in your own health care.
- Researchers may provide you with medical care and more frequent health check-ups as part of your treatment
- You may have the chance to help others get a better treatment for their health problems in the future.
 You may be able to get information about support groups and resources.

According to Australian Clinical Trials:

"Trials also offer the hope of developing better interventions or tests for a particular disease or condition, so that even if a trial does not provide a benefit for an individual, it may provide benefits for others with the disease in the future. As a patient participant, even when you receive the highest quality care, you may also benefit from additional support and attention provided by clinical trial staff who understand your disease or condition."



Scamwatch radar alert

Watch out for online shopping scams this holiday season

Losses to online shopping scams have increased 42 per cent this year, and Scamwatch is warning Australians to be careful when buying gifts this holiday season.

Scamwatch has received over 12,000 reports of online shopping scams so far this year, with almost \$7 million in reported losses.

"More people have been shopping online this year due to COVID-19 restrictions and scammers are now targeting people doing their Christmas shopping, including in the Black Friday and Cyber Monday sales," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard said.

"Scammers create fake websites that look like genuine online stores, offering products at very low prices and victims will either receive a fake item or nothing at all."

"They also post fake ads on classified websites, often claiming they are travelling and someone else will deliver the goods, but the item never arrives and the victim can no longer contact the seller."

Losses on classified websites, such as Facebook Marketplace and Gumtree, have increased by 60 per cent this year, to \$4.5 million.

Reports of online shopping scams involving consumer goods, such as shoes, phones, computers and toys, continue to be high. But the most common thing people were trying to buy when they were scammed was puppies and other pets.

People aged 24 and under reported the highest number of scams involving phones and computers.

"Watch out for popular products being sold at prices much lower than on other websites and sellers requesting payment through direct bank transfer or crypto currency," Ms Rickard said.

"Take the time to consider who you are dealing with and don't be pressured by special offers."
"Do your research by checking independent reviews of online stores or the seller's history on classified websites."

Another scam to be aware of if you have made recent purchases online is fake parcel delivery notifications via text message or email.

"Australia Post will never ask you to click a link to enter your personal details, nor will they ask for credit card details or a fee to deliver your packages," Ms Rickard said.

"If you have been the victim of a scam, contact your bank as soon as possible and contact the platform on which you were scammed to inform them of the circumstances."

Most financial institutions offer a charge back service for credit cards and will dispute a credit transaction with the merchant if they still exist.

NSW Criminal Court Statistics July 2015 to June 2020

Today the NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research is releasing NSW Criminal Court Statistics July 2015 to June 2020.

The excel data file shows:

Finalised court appearances

2019/20 recorded 120,656 finalised criminal court appearances, down 13.6% from the previous year (139,636 in 2018/19). The significant decline is largely due to changes to court operations to protect the safety of court users during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Finalisations were lower in each jurisdiction. In the Local Court the number of finalised court appearances was down 14.0%, from 128,623 in 2018/19 to 110,622 in 2019/20.

The offence type with the largest decline was Traffic and vehicle regulatory offences, down 27.3% (11,833 finalisations) from 43,270 in 2018/19 to 31,437 in 2019/20. This reduction is largely due to the drink and drug driving reform implemented in May 2019, which moved first time low level drink driving and drug-presence offences from court to an Infringement Notices (fine) process.

COVID-19 measures introduced in the Local Court included postponement of defended hearings, sentencing matters likely to result in a custodial penalty and first listing of summary matters involving no bail considerations.

COVID related changes in the higher courts included suspension of new jury trials, and specifically in the District Court, of new judge alone trials, sentencing hearings, arraignments and readiness hearings for defendants awaiting their court appearance in the community,

Bail

The proportion of defendants bail refused at finalisation increased in the District Court and Local Court over the past two years.

In the District Court 32.6% of defendants were bail refused at finalisation (up from 27.4% in 2018/19). In the Local Court 7.6% of defendants were bail refused at finalisation (up from 6.6% in 2018/19).

Sentencing

The proportion of proven offenders sentenced to imprisonment increased from 2018/19 to 2019/20 from 11.1% to 11.3%.

In the District Court 70.4% of proven offenders were sentence to imprisonment in 2019/20 (up from 63.0% in 2018/19).

In the Local Court 9.1% of proven offenders were sentence to imprisonment in 2019/20 (up from 8.0% in 2018/19).

The rise in imprisonment is partly due to the changing case mix of matters finalised in the second quarter of 2020.

Court delay

The median trial time from committal to outcome in the District Court in 2019/20 was 371 days and stable in the 24 months to June 2020.

The median time taken to finalise defended criminal matters in the Local Court increased in 2019/20, up from 198 days in 2018/19 to 213 days. It appears likely that the COVID-related postponement of Local Court matters has contributed to the observed increase in time to justice in that jurisdiction.

When travelling, stick to the speed limit and or the road conditions. Buckle up including the kids. Check that your vehicle is roadworthy and check your trailers and boat trailer before towing. Remember if you have a big night on the grog, you may still be over the limit the next day. What would you do without a licence?
