



TIME TO SAY GOODBYE




Your Community Bank

UPDATE ON THE ST GEORGES BASIN, SUSSEX INLET, SWAN LAKE AND BERRARA CREEK COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM - BOATING STUDY

Shoalhaven Council is undertaking a Coastal Management Program (CMP) for Sussex Inlet, St Georges Basin, Swan Lake and Berrara Creek. A CMP is a long-term strategy for managing the coastal regions in the face of future climate risks and will provide the framework and strategy that will be used to manage our coastlines and estuaries.

Stage 1 of the project, the Scoping Study for the entire Shoalhaven open coast and estuaries, is now complete. As part of Stage 1, you may recall that a series of public workshops and dropin sessions were held and submissions were received. Among other issues, the consultation identified that boating and navigation are key issues of concern to the community.

Stage 2 – *Now commencing* – the purpose of this stage is to understand the issues that affect the environmental, social, cultural, and economic values of St. Georges Basin, Sussex Inlet, Berrara Creek, and Swan Lake.

Boating Study

As part of this project, a study on boating facilities within Sussex Inlet, St Georges Basin Swan Lake and Berrara Creek is being undertaken to assess:

whether there is sufficient capacity for vessels; a need to improve existing facilities; an ability to reduce conflict between water users; and opportunities to reduce the impact of boating on the surrounding environment.

As part of this study, Shoalhaven City Council is seeking input from the community through a survey and community drop-in sessions.

Please find attached a questionnaire on boating facilities and issues within the St Georges Basin/Sussex Inlet area. Council would greatly appreciate if you could complete the questionnaire on behalf of yourself/organisation. If your organisation wishes to provide separate feedback on boating and navigation issues in the area, that is also welcome.

Aunty Val shines a light on St John

VAL Dempsey was stunned when she was named ACT's Senior Australian of the Year. After 50 years with St John Ambulance, she's no longer just a kid from Narrabundah.

At five foot and "a half inch", Valmai Dempsey is by no means a tall woman. But she says that when she first put on her St John Ambulance uniform 50 years ago, she stood tall, albeit "shaking in her boots".

The Canberra grandmother known far and wide as Aunty Val has been honoured as the ACT's 2021 Senior of the Year for her dedicated decades of service with St John.

To say she was surprised is an understatement. "I was one of four nominees and when I saw the calibre of the others, it just blew me away," she told *The Senior*. "I thought how does a kid from Narrabundah get rung up and told something so absolutely amazing? "I guess it's not where you come from but where you choose to go to."

Val said she wanted to be part of St John's from an early age.

"What wouldn't inspire a young girl who's ready to save the world, who dresses her dolly in white, and walks around wanting to bandage everything more than this marvellous uniform?

"I remember going to the St John's parades as a 10-year-old and thinking, my God, they're wonderful."

Too young to join, Val was taken under the wing of a local lady named Beryl Box.

"She was a wonderful woman, a triple-certificated nursing sister who used to go out dressed in her St John's uniform.

"I was gobsmacked. She used to drive a Morris Minor - one where the indicators came out the side. She said, 'Get dressed in your school uniform, you're going to be the first St John <u>cadet</u> and I'm going to look after you'.

"And she did. We used to go up to Cotter, which was a popular picnic area. And she would sit in the old St John's log cabin hut and treat people. We had a lot of drownings in the rivers in those days. She was so inspiring. And I said why do you do this? And she said, I just like helping people."

NEW GENDER EQUALITY DASHBOARD

Member for South Coast, Shelley Hancock has welcomed the launch of the NSW Government's Gender Data Dashboard, an online tool that will shine a light on women's experiences across a range of key areas.

Mrs Hancock said the new online database provides up-to-date statistics on topics such as the gender pay gap, maternal health and higher education completions for women.

"Knowledge and information are powerful tools and this dashboard will allow everyone to see where we are doing well and those areas we should continue to prioritise,"

"For example, it shows us that since 2010 more women than men have completed undergraduate and postgraduate degrees.

"It also shows us where women are experiencing unacceptable difficulties and danger – such as in the areas of domestic and sexual assault.

"The online database will also allow students and researchers to bring fresh new insights into projects by enabling them to easily filter information, generate interactive graphs and download slides and photos." Mrs Hancock said.

Minister for Women Bronnie Taylor said the new dashboard brings together publically available data in one place for the first time, transforming the way people access and use it.

"This tool will not just inspire conversations about issues affecting women, it will help the government and non-government sectors work together on effective solutions." Mrs Taylor said.

The NSW Gender Equality Dashboard will be updated throughout the year and presents more than 20 headline measures, which track women's progress across economic opportunity and advancement, health and wellbeing and participation and empowerment.

NSW Prison Population at five year low

Release Date: Thursday 4 November 2021

NSW Custody Statistics: Quarterly update September 2021

The number of adults in prison fell by almost 10% in the past two years due to COVID 19 influences – a five year low for NSW.

In September 2021 the prison population was 12,254, a 1,268 person decrease from 13,522 in the prepandemic period of September 2019.

Between September 2019 and September 2021:

- The total number of adult prisoners fell 9.4% (down 1,268)
- The number of male prisoners fell 8.6% (down 1,080)
- The number of female prisoners fell 19.4% (down 188)
- The number of Aboriginal male prisoners fell 2.3% (down 75)

The number of Aboriginal female prisoners fell 9.2% (down 29)

"We saw a sharp drop in prisoner numbers during both the 2020 and the 2021 NSW lockdowns" said Jackie Fitzgerald, Executive Director at BOCSAR. "This is an abrupt change from pre-pandemic patterns during which prisoner volumes increased steadily for many years."

"The suspension of court operations and concern for prisoner welfare in relation to COVID 19 means fewer people have been incarcerated. This change has meant that the prison population is now lower than it has been since 2015" commented Ms Fitzgerald.

As offending levels and the criminal justice system return to normal, BOCSAR anticipates the adult prison population will return to pre-COVID 19 levels during the next 12 months.

"Unfortunately the COVID-related fall in the prison population has been less significant for Aboriginal men and women. This means that the problem of Aboriginal over-representation remains very concerning."
