Christmas site shutdown

There will be a site shutdown over the Christmas period from **6pm** Thursday 22 December until 7am Monday 9 January 2023.

There will be no construction work during this time. Reduced work zone speed limits will continue to be enforced.

Upcoming weekend closure of Bridge Road

Bridge Road will be closed to traffic at the intersection of the Princes Highway from 7pm Friday 9 December to 6am Monday 12 December 2022 as pavement work is carried out at this location.

Motorists will be detoured via Moss Street, North Street and surrounding local roads.

Resident and business access will be maintained under traffic control. Pedestrian access will also be maintained however there may be some changes.

Boardwalk Construction - Ray Brooks Reserve, Sanctuary Point



• Project Status in progress Council is constructing an accessible boardwalk at Ray Brooks Reserve, Palm Beach, Sanctuary Point.

The project involves the replacement of the existing boardwalk, including demolition, construction, and associated concrete works. The new accessible boardwalk has been jointly funded by Council and a grant from the Australian Government - Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Fund.

During construction, vehicle access will be maintained into the reserve with short periodical delays, while pedestrian access will be diverted and sign posted along the foreshore to the nearby boat ramp and Sanctuary Point Road.

It is anticipated the project will be finalised by November 2022.

DOCTORS OF TOMORROW SET TO BOOST HEALTH WORKFORCE

The NSW Government has announced that more than a thousand medical students each year will be given the opportunity to gain hands-on experience working in paid positions in hospitals across the state.

Member for South Coast, Shelley Hancock MP said the Assistant in Medicine (AiM) initiative was an innovative collaboration between universities and the NSW Government, initially introduced in 2020 as a temporary workforce surge measure during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"The Assistant in Medicine program enables final year medical students to work part time in our public health system, carrying out a range of tasks including admitting and reviewing patients and performing routine procedures such as taking blood," Mrs Hancock said.

"The initiative is a win-win for medical students and our public health system – the students gain valuable hands-on experience, while our health system has an additional workforce to draw upon."

Since the AiM role was introduced, over 1,100 NSW medical students have worked as Assistants in Medicine in rural, regional and metropolitan hospitals, providing medical care and support as part of multi-disciplinary teams.

Mrs Hancock said the Australian-first program has had strong support from medical students, doctors and the universities, who have told the NSW Government that they want these part-time roles to become a permanent part of the health system.

"This is another example of the NSW Government finding new ways of working to benefit people right across our state, on top of our pharmacy reforms and our Urgent Care Services, which are designed to ease pressure on GPs and emergency departments," Mrs Hancock said.

"Over the past three years these Assistants in Medicine have worked across the state supporting our medical professionals on the frontline, giving doctors more time to focus directly on patient care."

NSW Health will work with universities over the next 12-months to create a permanent program that can be integrated into curriculums and the health workforce.

The NSW Government announced the largest workforce boost in the nation's history in the 2022-23 Budget with a \$4.5 billion investment over four years to recruit 10,148 full-time equivalent staff to hospitals and health services across NSW, with 3,800 of those positions in rural and regional areas.

The NSW Government is investing \$883 million over the next four years to attract and retain staff in rural and regional NSW by transforming the way health clinicians are incentivised to work in the bush.

In addition, under a joint initiative with Victoria, the NSW Government will deliver expanded urgent care services across NSW to relieve the demand on emergency departments.

Francis Ryan Reserve, Sanctuary Point



The amenities block at Francis Ryan Reserve was the subject of vandalism and arson on 16 July 2022.

Project Update This project implements the actions identified in the Community Infrastructure Strategic Plan(External link) to further develop Francis Ryan Reserve. The building design will include accessible and ambulant public amenities as well as change rooms and storage for sports groups. This development will allow for increased accessibility and amenity for sporting clubs and the community.

The Community Infrastructure Strategic Plan identifies the future development of Francis Ryan Reserve to encourage the use of the site as a recreation park. The Shoalhaven Delivery Program Operational Plan (DPOP) 2020/2021(External link) includes an action for the design of an amenities building at Francis Ryan Reserve in 2021/22.

The architect engaged on this project is developing the final design. Once the detailed design has been completed tenders will be requested for the construction of the building.10

Construction of the Bob Proudfoot Pavilion at Francis Ryan Reserve is expected to be completed in November 2023.

Work bonus boost kicks in for pensioners

From today, pensioners over Age Pension age and eligible Veterans will be able to earn more income from working without reducing their pension.

Minister for Social Services, Amanda Rishworth said eligible Australians would have the opportunity to engage in the workforce if they chose to do so at a time of workforce shortages without losing any of their income support payments.

From December 1, they will immediately be able to earn an additional \$4,000 before their Government payments are reduced.

The maximum Work Bonus income bank will be lifted from \$7,800 to \$11,800 for anyone over age pension age on an income support payment.

Minister Rishworth said the changes would provide more flexibility to those who wanted to take up extra work.

"We know pensioners do want some flexibility. A lot of pensioners don't want to work all year or they don't want to work at all, but for some that do want to work they want to do so in seasonal jobs," she said.

"Employers are calling out for experienced workers, particularly in the health and childcare sectors, so it makes sense to offer incentives to older Australians to encourage them back to the workforce and share their skills.

"Importantly, this immediate income bank credit offers flexibility to work for short periods and there will be plenty of short-term seasonal jobs coming up over the Christmas and summer period." Minister for Government Services, Bill Shorten, today encouraged people who are on limited, fixed incomes and feeling cost of living pressures to check whether they have work credits.

"These credits act as a buffer to help encourage people to take on ad hoc work, without their Income Support Payment taking a hit," Minister Shorten said.

"The festive season is a great time to pick up part-time or casual work, and Working Credit, Income Bank and Work Bonus all help Australians stay engaged in the workforce while getting some extra support.

"Each payment has different rules, but it's simple to check online if you have credits available that might offset any reduction in your payment from casual work. Just access your Centrelink account via myGov."

Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Matt Keogh said the opportunity to work more will support veterans after their service.

"The ability to undertake meaningful work has been shown to benefit veterans' mental health and wellbeing following their military service," Minister Keogh said.

"Veterans bring to the civilian workplace so many great skills gained in the ADF, this will ensure our community continues to benefit from those."

Pensioners will also not have to reapply for payments for up to two years if their employment income exceeds the income limit.

Currently their connection to social security is cancelled after 12 weeks of exceeding the income limit. As a result, pensioners will also retain access to their Pensioner Concession Card and associated benefits for two years.


