




your community...Then, you might, just have something to hide! And that's why they are here!

I believe it is promoted by the NSW Police Force, because they know that it has the potential to assist them in their enquires, when a CRIME is committed.

Why do we keep on listening to the baggers of CCTV, who underestimate the true potential of CCTV, if not for Political or other motivational purposes., them what are the arterial motives behind their objections?

I have said it before..."If I am sick, I see a Doctor," If I want to see Law and Order in my home town, I trust in our NSW Police Force, as less than that!... The disease will spread!



WHAT IS THE CCTV REGISTER?

The CCTV Register is an initiative of the NSW Police Force. The purpose of the Register is to record the location of closed-circuit television (CCTV) camera systems, and other related information, across the State.

WHY IS THERE A NEED FOR A CCTV REGISTER?

CCTV footage has become an important investigative tool for police. It is regularly used to investigate and solve, often serious, crimes and has proven to be very useful in court when used as evidence - a picture says a thousand words.

The most notable example of the importance of CCTV footage was in relation to the London terrorist attacks in July 2005. Using CCTV footage, police were able to rapidly identify the attackers and progress their investigation

The problem to date has been knowing where these cameras are located. The objective of NSW Police Porce is to establish an accurate and comprehensive register that identifies the location of as many CCTV systems as possible across NSW

HOW WILL POLICE USE THE CCTV REGISTER?

All data will be stored in a secu re databas owned and operated by the NSW Police Force. Authorised officers will be able to access the Register for law enforcement purposes eg; investigating crime.

No information will be provided to third parties.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

The mission of the NSW Police Force is to have the police and the community working together to establish a safer environment by reducing violence, crime and fear,

If your business operates a CCTV system, you can help the police solve crime by registering vour details

There are two ways you can register 1) Online via the NSW Police Force Internet Comme via the Voto Police Police Internet site. (Refer to the web address located on the reverse of this boohuse).
Manually via a 'CCTV Register Form'. These forms are available either online via the

These forms are available either online via the web address or via your local Crime Prevention Officer. Completed forms can be handed to your local Crime Prevention Officer or fax to the VIEW Team on 02 8835 7679.

WHAT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED TO REGISTER?

To register, we require

- The name and location of your business; Contact details for the owner and operator of your CCTV system; and
- Some details regarding your CCTV system (eg. number of cameras installed, areas covered by the cameras, retention period for recorded material, etc.)

The registration form should take approximately 10 minutes to complete

WHAT DO I DO IF MY DETAILS CHANGE OR IF I WISH TO HAVE

Having access to accurate information is critical to any police investigation. Should any of your details change, kindly notify us in writing via the contact details listed on the reverse of this

Registration is purely voluntary. Should you wish to have your details removed from the Register, you may do so anytime by notifying ig via the contact details listed on the reverse of this brochure.
