



Buying and selling a property can be complicated. Fortunately when it comes to sorting out your water and sewerage services, things get a lot easier.

What do I need to do?

If you're using a Solicitor or Conveyancer to look after the settlement process then you don't need to do anything – they will organise everything on your behalf.

You should have them arrange a Special Water Meter Reading as part of the property settlement.

Who do I need to inform?

Whether you're buying or selling you don't need get in contact with us yourself because all notifications, final meter readings and bill calculations are handled by your Solicitor. They will also inform the Land and Titles Office of a property's new owner's details.

Will my water be disconnected?

Shoalhaven Water does not disconnect water and sewerage services at the time of sale.

Water Tips from Shoalhaven Water

- Collect rainwater for garden use in tanks and containers.
- Upturned bottles and cans with small holes can act as slow release drip irrigation to the base of shrubs and trees.

CCTV – Shoalhaven Safer Suburbs Funding November 2014

The grant funds have been accepted by Council.

The Regulation to the Personal Information and Privacy Protection Act (PIPPA) prevents Council owned CCTV from being used to film private property. Sanctuary Point and East Nowra shopping precincts where it was proposed for CCTV to be installed are both private property, therefore at the moment Council cannot go ahead with CCTV at these locations.

Council has written to the Premier requesting a change to the Regulation and have been advised that the matter is now with the Attorney Generals Department.

In the light of the recent alleged Armed robbery in Sanctuary Point and St Georges Basin Shopping Centre around 6.15 pm 26th January 2015, as a concerned citizen for what happens in my town and those of our close proximity and understanding that the matter regarding what should be a small change of wording to the regulation, was first addressed to the Premiers Department in October 2014, perhaps, as in other cases where CCTV has aided Police in their investigation, CCTV installed at Sanctuary Point, may have deterred the crime or aided our Local Area Command in their investigation.

If you also believe in expressing your concern for the long wait from the NSW Attorney General Department, you may also want to voice your concern as to what implications, may be experienced with the present or future use of all CCTV cameras, as an aid that may be discontinued to prove useful as a deterrent to commit, or aid in identifying perpetrators after they commit crime in our Towns and Villages... Wherever we call home!

Writing to the Attorney General



How do I write to the NSW Attorney General?

The NSW Attorney General is the Hon. Brad Hazzard MP.

The Attorney General's role and responsibilities involve advising the Government and Cabinet on legal, constit issues.

Please note that the NSW Attorney General cannot:

- provide you with legal advice about your private legal matters
- · intervene in or overturn the decisions of a court or tribunal
- · comment on matters which are outside his portfolio responsibilities
- deal with complaints about judicial officers, which is the responsibility of the Judicial Commission of N
- deal with complaints about lawyers, which is the responsibility of the Legal Services Commissioner.

When writing to the NSW Attorney General, please remember to:

- include your postal address (PO Box or street address)
- · briefly outline what you are concerned about and what you are hoping to achieve
- provide relevant case numbers and/or dates, locations and names.

underside of the yellow duck.


Moona Moona Park is transformed into a playground of excitement and bargain hunting through

From On the Beat – NSW Police Crime Prevention



The person that invented Beer and Spirits must have been drunk at the time, and I wonder if he or she ever realised what a problem for society Intoxicating Liquor has become. Most of us can get together and have a drink with friends before going home with the wobbly boots and wearing the Beer goggles. However there is always the few that wreck it for the many; people who drink and become so affected by liquor that they either hurt themselves, hurt other persons and or damage property. This is

not what the community wants or needs and it is certainly not what Police and other community stake holders want either.

Alcohol related offences occur on a daily basis in our community. Assaults, malicious damage and general street offences occur as a direct result of persons consuming intoxicating liquor. This Calender year there have been thousands of alcohol related incidents in the Shoalhaven alone. What can be done about it?

In 2011 a report conducted by the NSW Auditor-General stated that alcohol abuse costs NSW taxpayers more than \$1 billion dollars a year, this equates to \$416 per household. (About 9 boxes of beer) A breakdown of those costs is provided below:

--Police \$372.4 million

--Courts \$24.9 million

--Prison \$76.9 million

--Child protection services \$91.1 million

--Out-of-home services \$149.6 million

--Intensive family support \$22.4 million

--Health system \$87.3 million.

What can be done about it? Well, Police cannot issue a penalty notice to adults for drinking alcohol in an alcohol free zone/prohibited area, it is not an offence. However, your Alcoholic Beverages can be seized and forfeited to the crown. Imagine having your best bottle of Moet being poured down the drain. It hurts to think about it. "Oh the humanity".

You might then say, "Big Deal". Then I will say" Section 632 of the Local Government Act, 1993 reads as follows;

(1) A person who, in a public place within the area of a council, fails to comply with the terms of a notice erected by the council is guilty of an offence.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units.

Considering that a penalty unit is \$110 then your decision to drink in an alcohol free zone/ prohibited area could potentially cost you a trip to Nowra local Court as well as\$1100. (27 cases of stubbies and 2 large packets of Potato chips). It's your move. Just remember that although it is the Local Government Act, and is enforced by the Local council Rangers, Police are authorised Persons under the act and can also charge you.

We all live in this Community. Let's try and make our community a safer and better place to live by not drinking a skin full every time we go out. Observe the alcohol free zone/prohibited areas. All you good people out there and there are lots, if you see anyone consuming intoxicating liquor in the alcohol free/prohibited areas, being antisocial or well intoxicated, please contact the Police.
