"A re-elected Baird Government would construct a new Police Station in the Bay & Basin. The current Police station at Huskisson, after 35 years of service, will be relocated to a new site."

On the 29th January 2016, I

received confirmation from The office of the Hon Shelley Hancock MP, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, Member for South Coast, who confirmed;

"The NSW Government is committed to building a new police station for the Bay and Basin area in the Shoalhaven Local Area Command.



The Bay and Basin Police Station project business case has been approved by the NSWPF Investment Committee and a project time line is in development.

The 2015-16 Budget includes funding of \$1.4m for project activities including site acquisition and the commencement of planning of this major project.

Work on the identification of a site is in progress but a site has not yet been finalised. The NSW Government is committed to ensuring our police have the resources they need for generations to come."

A Guide to Resuscitation

A AIRWAY	CHECK, OPEN AND CLEAR AIRWAY IF BLOCKED, Roll onto side, support head, clear mouth and airway.	REMEMBER, PHONE 000 Ask for assistance, phone '000' or mobile '112' for an Ambulance.	
	B BREATHING	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'YES' Position person on their side, and ensure the airway remains clear. Continue to monitor breathing.	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'NO' Turn person onto back. Support head and jaw. (A slight head tilt may be necessary to open airway) Give two breaths.
C COMPRESSION	CHECK FOR SIGNS OF LIFE If no response and not breathing, give 30 compressions in centre of chest.	CONTINUE TO GIVE 2 BREATHS AND 30 COMPRESSIONS Only stop to check casualty if they start breathing normally. Continue until emergency services take over.	
	HAND POSITION	ADULT 2 hands (one on top of the other), in centre of chest	CHILDREN 1 or 2 hands in centre of chest
COMPRESS	1/3 the depth of chest

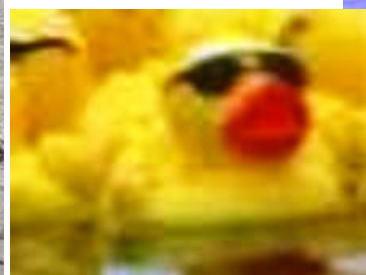

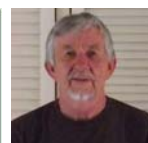

Federal Government 'Bridges' the Gap

Federal Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis MP, says the timber bridge over Duck Creek on Naval College Road at Worrowing Heights, which we all call Jervis Bay Rd, will be replaced with a concrete bridge following a Federal Government grant.

“\$750,000 has been allocated to the project as part of the Bridges Renewal Program Round 2,” says Mrs Sudmalis.

“The program supports vital upgrades to local bridges like this one.”

“The Federal Government is working hard to provide safer road travel with grants such as the Bridge Renewal Program.

“I congratulate Shoalhaven City Council for submitting an application and that was of a standard that gained approval.

“The grant was based on community need and this will mean a safer, more reliable road access for residents and tourists alike,” adds Mrs Sudmalis.

The total cost of the project is \$1.6 million. The power poles need to be moved and the new bridge will be built just downstream.

Mrs Sudmalis has made the announcement this morning onsite with Shoalhaven City Council Mayor Joanna Gash and Councillors.

SAFE KEEPING OF FIREARMS



From On the Beat – NSW Police Crime Prevention

The time has come. If you are the owner

of a firearm I am sure that you have been waiting in anticipation for this week's episode of On the Beat because as promised I have some info about the safe keeping of your Fire Sticks. There are a number of levels for the storage of firearms which includes Pistols and believe it or not, Cannons. The most common is Level 1 which covers the gun categories of A and B. All licence holders (Guns) in NSW are subject to the general requirement for safe storage of firearms under Part 4 -Section 39 of the *Firearms Act 1996*. Any person in possession of a firearm must take all reasonable precautions to ensure the firearm is kept safely, is not lost or stolen and does not come into the possession of an unauthorised person.

Section 40 of the Act provides mandatory minimum requirements for the safe keeping and storage of Firearms held under a Category A & B licence as follows:

* When any firearm is not actually being used or carried, it must be stored in a locked receptacle of a type approved by the Commissioner of Police and that it is constructed of hard wood or steel and not easily penetrable.* If the receptacle weighs less than 150 kilograms when empty, it must be fixed in order to prevent its easy removal.

* The locks of such a receptacle must be of solid metal and be of a type approved by the Commissioner.

* Any ammunition for the firearm must be stored in a locked container of a type approved by the Commissioner and that is kept separate from the receptacle containing any such firearm. Failure to meet these requirements is punishable by a fine in excess of \$2200 and/or 12 months imprisonment. The minimum standards for the locking mechanisms of a safe/receptacle are as follows:

* The locks must be solid metal lock/s have a minimum of 100 key changes; or be PIN activated; or have biometric (fingerprint) activation, and;

* The door should be fitted with a minimum three point locking mechanism (or similar) which secures the door to the receptacle at various points around the door to prevent entry to the receptacle.

* If the safe requires the fitting of an external lock (i.e. padlock), the lock must have a minimum body width of 40mm, a hardened steel shackle and have a minimum of 100 key changes.

In the past there have been a number of Gun safes in the area that have been the locker type. The flimsy metal ones that can be jemmied open very easily. Ask yourself "Is my Gun safe solid enough?" Remember it cannot be easily penetrable. You may have got away with it on your last Safe storage inspection but the next time you may not be so lucky. Please do the right thing and get decent security for your guns. There have been a number of guns stolen from property's lately all over the state. Consideration should also be given in relation to responsible control at all times which is stated in the act as far too many premises have been broken in to while people have been on an extended holiday or working away. Consideration should be given to having your firearms secured at another location where reasonable control is maintained. Do your bit and beef up your security before the Licensing Sergeant comes and makes you do it. Now, if you haven't gone to sleep, have a gander at the pictures of good secure Gun safes.
