Have you registered your cat or dog on the NSW Pet Registry?

If you change address, rehome your pet, or if your pet has died, it is a requirement of the NSW Companion Animals Act, that all dogs and cats over six months of age must be registered and their records kept up-to-date.

In February, Shoalhaven City Council will be issuing a notice to register to local pet owners who have a dog or cat that is older than six months of age and not lifetime registered.

Registering your pet can be easily completed online here.



You can claim an existing pet, update your address and contact details, change ownership of your pet and pay lifetime registration fees online. If help is needed to register your pet please contact or visit <u>Shoalhaven City Council.</u> The register is administered by all NSW Councils on behalf of the NSW State Government.


Assistant Commissioner Joseph Cassar – Commander of Capability, Performance & Youth Command

Assistant Commissioner Joseph Cassar joined the NSW Police Force as a trainee in 1987 at the NSW Police Academy, Goulburn. He was attested as a Probationary Constable the same year, where he was stationed at Goulburn. In 1992, he commenced Criminal Investigation duties at Port Kembla, where he was later designated as a Detective. He gained experience in a number of areas, serving at the South Region Crime Squad, Drug Squad and Child Protection Investigation Team as well as Organised Crime, and Child Protection Enforcement Agency and Homicide. In 2000, he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant at Lake Illawarra and later served at Crime Agencies East Coast Squad, Crime Agencies Organised Crime Squad, Crime Agencies Gangs &

Keep your handbag with you at all times and be aware of your surroundings. Have fun, don't drink and drive and have a great weekend.

Preservation of crime scenes – If you do become a victim of crime there are steps that can be taken to help police in the collection of evidence which may lead to the

Preservation of crime scenes – If you do become a victim of crime there are steps that can be taken to help police in the collection of evidence which may lead to the identification of an offender. For example, in a break and enter it is important to not touch items or entry/exit points that could have been used or touched by the offender.
Do not clean up any broken glass, do not put items that have been taken out of cupboards away. In fact, try not to touch anything. Call the police as soon as you can. Advise police that there may well be evidence left by the offender on scene. Police and the Local Scene of Crime Officer (SOCO) will attend and be ever so grateful that you protected the crime scene to allow for the collection of evidence that may well convict the offender.
Fail to pay for fuel – Ladies and gentlemen. It is an offence in this state and possibly every other state in the known universe to pull up to a petrol station, place fuel into your car and then drive away without paying. Even if you do not mean to do it, you are risking your good name and possibly a trip to Nowra Local Court when you get caught, and many do get caught. NSW Police have a system in place whereby petrol stations report all fail to pays and here in the Shoalhaven all reports are investigated. Don't be a fool. pay for your fuel.
Remember: Do not Drink and Drive and you can Dob in a Druggie any time you like, by contacting Nowra Police or ringing Crime Stoppers. As always, in case of emergency, call (0000)
