


lifeguards on duty, you swim in between these flags, while you are under their care. Our Lifeguards are very well trained to save lives, so you be

Swan Lake Artificially Opened Illegally

19 January 2022

An artificial opening at Swan Lake was carried out by members of the public on 12 January 2022. NSW Department of Primary Industries - Fisheries were alerted and will be enacting their compliance functions. Council Rangers have also been in the area carrying out investigations as the artificial opening of the lake is an illegal activity as these works were not carried out in relation to the water trigger levels and Entrance Management Policy (EMP).

The intervention works created a 20-30-metre-wide channel, which poses a public safety risk. People need to be made aware of the danger this has created. The channel, when opened by natural means or by Council (under licensed conditions in accordance with the EMP), is located to the south adjoining the rock platform. This does not typically create a channel like the one that has formed from the recent artificial intervention.

Pending rainfall and tidal behaviours, it is expected that the sand bar will re-establish in four to eight weeks and return Swan Lake back to its natural form. The entrance cannot be closed using any further artificial intervention. In the meantime, signs have been posted by Council to alert the public to the swimming hazard.

Shoalhaven City Council Manager of Environment Services, Dr Michael Roberts said, "This channel, between Swan Lake and the ocean, has resulted in the lake artificially opening at too low a water level and in unsuitable conditions. This may lead to significant adverse environmental impacts on Swan Lake, such as low oxygen levels, associated fish kills as well as a significant swimming hazard."

"It is an offence to open coastal lakes, or lagoons, using machinery or by hand, without a licence and could result in penalties of up to \$220,000 per offence." Dr Roberts stated.

Council operates an <u>Entrance Management Policy</u> for Swan Lake, and other coastal lakes in the Shoalhaven region, with licenses from various State Government Agencies.


This Policy allows Council to mechanically open Swan Lake to the ocean with an excavator to prevent flooding of low-lying properties surrounding the lake when the water level rises, typically following a large rainfall event, to a specific trigger level.

\$ 652,000 For Flood Management Across South Coast

Parliamentary Secretary and Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock has welcomed new funding of \$ 652,429 for local floodplain management through the NSW Government's Floodplain Management Program grants.

Mrs Hancock said the grant, awarded under the 2021-22 Floodplain Management Program, will help Council better understand and manage local flood risk and exposure in the region.

Each year Councils can apply for grants through the NSW Government's Floodplain Management Program to fund important projects for local councils to assess and understand flood risk and help reduce flood impacts on their local communities.

"This is a continuation of the NSW Government's investment to support councils, which have the primary role of managing flood risk in their communities."

The grants help with flood risk management studies, as well as the implementation of works to reduce risks such as flood levees, flood gates, warning systems, house raising or purchase in high risk areas.

The 49 projects funded under the 2021-22 Floodplain Management grants program, which total \$9.54 million, are in addition to the 208 ongoing projects valued at \$49.64 million being implemented from previous years' funding rounds.

The new grant projects will enable local councils, county councils and other government bodies with floodplain risk management responsibilities to undertake priority projects.

Each application was assessed by a DPIE technical specialist and then by the independent State Floodplain Mitigation Assessment Committee (SFMAC) for feasibility and overall worthiness using assessment criteria.

Road Work Upgrade - Wool Road, Old Erowal Bay

3 February 2022

Shoalhaven City Council are undertaking road works on Wool Road and Mernie Street at Old Erowal Bay.

The Wool Road and Mernie Street Channelised Right Turn Lane Project is part of Council's 2021-22 Roads Delivery Program. The project is the result of a successful grant application 2020 under the Federal and State Government Stimulus Commitment for Safety Work.

Paul Keech, Director of City Services said. "The delivery of road upgrades often causes some inconvenience for the Community. Be assured that Council staff always try to minimise the impact where possible."

"The lane closure at this site is unavoidable given the scope and nature of these works."

"I would like to remind everyone to pay attention to the road work speed limits that are in place at this location, for the safety of motorists and workers onsite. I appreciate your patience for the duration of these important road work upgrades." Mr Keech said.

The project began in early January and is expected to take nine weeks to complete. The works are being completed under a Traffic Control Plan, which includes the lane closure.

Cancer Moonshot Launches in 2022 with Bold New Vision

Dear partners, colleagues, and friends:

We all know cancer screening is important for the early detection of disease, better health outcomes, and saving more lives. Many of you work with us through our <u>national programs</u> to extend these benefits to millions of people.

Today, the White House underscored the importance of cancer prevention and early detection by making it a national priority and cornerstone of the new <u>Cancer Moonshot Initiative</u>. The President's Cancer Panel also released <u>"Closing Gaps in Cancer Screening: Connecting People, Communities, and Systems to Improve Equity and Access."</u>

As many of you will remember, the Cancer Moonshot Initiative was first launched in 2016 by then Vice President Biden to accelerate progress in cancer research. The heightened focus on cancer prevention and screening in the 2022 relaunch of Cancer Moonshot initiative is a clear acknowledgement of the impact our work is having through <u>communities</u>, <u>employers</u>, and <u>families</u>.

As part of the Moonshot, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services made a commitment that supports these new Moonshot objectives: accelerating efforts to nearly eliminate cervical cancer through screening and HPV vaccination, with a particular focus on reaching people who are most at risk.

We look forward to collaborating with you in the months and years ahead as we continue working toward realizing these goals. We'll have more to share about DCPC's Moonshot work as the initiative unfolds.

SOUTH COAST WELCOMES NEW MEDICAL INTERNS

Parliamentary Secretary and Member for South Coast, Shelley Hancock MP today welcomed the appointment of 74 new interns across the Illawarra Shoalhaven Health District.

This year, 1,073 new medical interns are joining the NSW Health system - a record number of new starters and the most of any state or territory in Australia.

Mrs Hancock said the new interns would boost the local health workforce at a pivotal time in the ongoing COVID-19 response.

"Our community owes a huge debt of gratitude to our local health teams who have worked around the clock to keep us safe, especially over the past two years," Mrs Hancock said.

"I am incredibly pleased that these new interns have the opportunity to learn from the world-class doctors and play a significant role in navigating the challenges of this unprecedented, world-wide pandemic."

Interns are medical graduates who have completed their medical degree and are required to complete a supervised year of practice in order to become independent practitioners.

The new doctors who commenced orientation this week will be entering a training program with networked hospitals throughout the state, providing formal and on the job training.

They receive two-year contracts to rotate between metropolitan, regional and rural hospitals to ensure the diversity of their experience. They also join different units in each hospital, including surgery and emergency medicine. In the largest ever health workforce boost in the state, the NSW Government has invested a record \$2.8 billion to recruit an additional 1,060 doctors, 5,000 nurses, 880 allied health staff and 1,360 hospital support staff over a four year period.

New BOCSAR publication: Improving police risk assessment of intimate partner violence

Link to report summary - <u>Improving police risk assessment of intimate partner vio-</u><u>lence</u>

The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) has today released a paper that compares the performance of four statistical models in predicting intimate partner re-victimisation in NSW.

Past research has found that the NSW Police Force's domestic violence risk assessment tool, the DVSAT, is a poor predictor of re-victimisation. This study evaluates four intimate partner re-victimisation prediction tools to identify an alternative model that performs well in the NSW context.

Findings: The best performing model in the study uses 16 variables identified in the National Risk Assessment Principles developed by Australia's National Research Organisation for Women's Safety (ANROWS). The study also finds that the optimal model can be simplified to only five predictors with only a small loss of predictive power.

The five best performing indicators were:

- the victim's history of domestic violence reports
- the perpetrator's history of domestic violence convictions
- pregnancy and new birth
- victim's self-perception of risk
- the perpetrator's misuse of alcohol or drugs.

This study demonstrates that a risk assessment instrument with a small number of variables can assist in identifying victims who are most at risk of future intimate partner violence.
