Firstly sorry for any cross posting, you may get this email twice.

Hello to all interested in the proposed Anson St development. We are requesting your attendance at the upcoming Court meeting to be held (at this point in time) at the Anson St site for the proposed flats development. It would be great if there were a lot of people attending to support community members who are speaking against the proposal. Please let others know about it as the more people the better, it will show the community concern... I may have missed some people.

We have been warned that it is a Court of Law and those people present cannot speak out of turn, or interrupt.

This is to advise you that the 'Conciliation Conference' will be held at the Anson St site on Friday 13th January, 10.30 AM. This is part of the Land & Environment Court processes that will see 6 community members speak to the Commissioner on their reasons for objecting to the proposal.

In the letter received from Council it states:

'Residents submissions are made on-site. Submitters are to provide their full name and address when speaking on-site and be mindful that their submissions may become evidence in the proceedings.

Submissions must therefore be provided in the same manner as if they were being given in a courtroom and be truthful and helpful. There should be no interruptions or interjections so that those attending the on-site inspection can fully understand the matters raised by the submitter".

Basin Villages Forum has been assisting the local community prepare for this procedure and there will be 6 speakers (as suggested by the Court) at the onsite meeting.

It is possible that the venue could be changed due to inclement weather and there has been a request for the Court to go down to Blacket Park on the shores of St Georges Basin but this is not a definite at this stage.

As soon as there is other news I will email it around.

We cleared a safe area in two hours on Christmas Eve, as you can see from these photos, in




I believe we did a splendid job and I congratulate the other volunteers for putting themselves out, to

GREEN LIGHT FOR THE MOLLYMOOK INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND

Shoalhaven City Councillors have agreed to provide additional funding of up to \$850,000 to the All Ages All Inclusive Playspace at Mollymook Beach. The Mollymook Inclusive Playspace will be the first of its kind in the Shoalhaven and will showcase the region as an inclusive community, aiming to create a space where all ages and abilities play and socialise, side by side.

Council has been working towards the installation of all-inclusive play equipment at Mollymook Beach Reserve to replace the existing playground since 2015.

The development of the Inclusive Playspace will incorporate shared pathways, inclusive play equipment for all ages (including seniors play), shade, seating, tables and a Changing Places amenities building, all within a fully fenced area. The space will incorporate all access play design principles and an all access pathway network throughout the park, connecting car parks with a disabled toilet, beach access, café and adjoining accommodation.

The Playspace will be of universal design, meaning products and buildings will be accessible and usable by everyone, including people with disabilities. Universal design provides one solution that can accommodate people with disabilities as well as the rest of the population. It also gives attention to the needs of older as well as younger people, women as well as men and left handed as well as right handed persons.

Council has also incorporated a bespoke 'Pigeon House Mountain' as the centre piece of the Play Space in recognition of this significant landmark in the Southern Shoalhaven.

Within the region, 6.9% of the population require assistance which is higher than the NSW average of 4.9% (2011 Census). This play ground works in creating an inclusive community for all residents and visitors.

The additional funding allows Council to now go out to tenderfor the completion of all stages of the Inclusive Playspace in accordance with the endorsed Council Master Plan.

Council is working closely with the Touched by Olivia Foundation to secure additional funding for the playground through sponsorship and donations.

MONTHLY COLUMN OF THE FEDERAL MEMBER FOR GILMORE





I welcome the announcement from Telstra of improved mobile coverage in Vincentia, and the rollout of the 4GX network in Moruya Heads and Tomakin.

Regional communities like ours depend on reliable mobile coverage to work, study and stay in touch with family and friends.

Those days of telling your guests about the one spot where if you stood on a ladder, bent your head left, and turned the phone sideways for a chance at mobile reception are thankfully coming to an end.

It's fabulous to see Aussie telcos continuing to invest in coverage, reliability and speed in areas like ours. In particular, I'm pleased to see the steady rollout of the 4GX network across Gilmore, which lets locals experience reliable mobile services just as fast as those on offer in Sydney.

Telstra have also announced a backhaul upgrade and additional 8Mbps ADSL port for Minnamurra village, and additional ADSL2+ 20Mbps ports for the Ulladulla exchange, to be installed in coming weeks.

These announcements go hand in hand with the Coalition Government's commitment to improving mobile coverage across regional and rural Australia under our *Mobile Black Spot Program*, On 1 December 2016, the Minister for Communications announced that round 2 of the program will deliver a further 266 new and upgraded mobile base stations across the country, including the installation of a new Telstra macrocell base station at Woodhill near Berry.

Across both rounds, the Coalition is delivering new mobile coverage to 31,000 homes and businesses across 86,000 square kilometres through 765 new mobile phone towers.

My wife and myself are both members of SCAT (Safer Communities Action Team) and recently I was approached by residents alongside of a Stormwater system in Sanctuary Point,



which discharges the stormwater, below a concrete pathway, then out into an open filtering system and then into the St Georges Basin Country Club, Golf Course Watering system.

The concern of the residents, are primarily one of a safety issue, as they are often confronted by the sound of skateboards being used on the path, which has been constructed by Council over the Stormwater pipes and when the public wants to take photos of the Kangaroos on the Golf Course, they front up with their children,





who play with their skateboards, while their parents are pre-occupied taking photos of the kangaroos and the fear that one day, a child will hit the concrete wall at the end of the path and will be catapulted over the concrete wall, possibly head first into the Concrete Filtering system below.













Closing off of this thoroughfare as a temporary solution, should be considered before a more permanent solution makes the system safer for all concerned!

From On The Beat - NSW Police Shoalhaven Crime Prevention



On the Beat with Senior Constable Anthony Jory

I promise this "On The Beat." episode will have nothing to do with taking valuables out of your vehicle, locking cars, locking your house or securing your credit cards. I won't even mention anything about drinking too much intoxicating liquor or failing to guit a licensed premises or dobbing in a dealer.

I have already mentioned these topics in one or more of the 82 episodes of On The Beat that has been published over the last couple of years. So while I was trying to think of a topic for today, my mind wandered off. First I imagined a monkey playing the cymbals but then I imag-

ined summertime with endless days of fishing, skiing or just cruising around in my 130ft motor yacht (I told you my mind was wandering).

Back to reality now and I want to tell you about boat security. Many people have boats. From the humble tinny, to the not so humble big marlin catcher, however they all have a number of things in common.

They can all be broken into and/or stolen. Therefore there are a few tips for security of your vessel such as:

- Security devices installed on boats should be resistant to water, salt and humidity.
- **Locks:** Marine dealers carry special exterior hatch locks. When fastened with a quality padlock, one of these improves security.
- Windows: To enhance window security, locksmiths carry a variety of special, small locks and fasteners, which can be used to increase the security of other types of windows. For sliding windows, place a length of doweling in the track to prevent the window from being forced open.
- If your boat is kept in the water, use a marina with fulltime security and/or good lighting.
- If you are leaving your boat for long periods of time, ensure that someone else is able to check your boat on a regular basis.
- If you can, store your trailer in a locked garage, secured boat storage facility or mini□ storage stall.
- If the trailer is stored at home, put it in the back or side yard, out of sight.
- If storing in an open driveway or carport, park another vehicle or other large object in front of the trailer.
- Consider removing one trailer wheel or using a wheel lock.
- Secure the trailer to an anchored object with a good quality chain and lock.
- Purchase a good quality trailer hitch lock and use it even if stored inside.

When you take the boat off the trailer and park the trailer at the local boat ramp, make it hard for the crooks to take the trailer by locking the hitch using a hitch lock or padlock to do it.

Remember: Do not Drink and Drive.
