FREE SENIOR DIARY

Scams, elder abuse and pensions are all addressed in a free diary aimed at keeping seniors informed of their legal rights.

Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock encouraged seniors to pick up a free copy of the 'Legal topics for older people' diary to help them plan for the year ahead.

"Older people are the backbone of the South Coast community," Mrs Hancock said. "This free diary is an amazing resource for seniors in our community. It provides a one-stop-shop for information about everything from retirement villages, family finances and the pension, to elder abuse and scams."

Attorney General Mark Speakman said this publication will help seniors understand their rights during this once in a century pandemic.

"One of the hard earned lessons of this year was that when disaster strikes, it is critical that people have access to the legal help and information they need," Mr Speakman said.

Acting Minister for Seniors Geoff Lee said the 2021 diary will support seniors in countering the scourge of elder abuse.

"Older Australians across our State have a right to feel safe and to be treated with dignity. That's why this year's diary contains important information about how to identify elder abuse, and details about where you or your family can get help," Dr Lee said.

The diary will keep readers up-to-date with events like the NSW Seniors Festival, NSW Grandparents Day and 2021 school holiday periods. Importantly, it will also provide referral details to relevant legal and non-legal services that can assist older people with their concerns and provide them with avenues for support.

Diaries will be available from Shelley Hancock's South Coast Electorate Office, contact office on 4421 0222 to organise collection, other organisations such as Legal Aid NSW offices, libraries and selected community organisations will have diaries available from January 20 2021.

Distribution of the diary will focus on reaching older Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and older people living in regional and remote areas of NSW.

For the first time, Legal Aid NSW will also produce a free calendar for older people, Including useful legal information and tips.



Update on Reported Breach of Public Health Order at Ulladulla Leisure Centre - 23 December 2020

Shoalhaven City Council wishes to provide an update on the <u>reported breach of</u> the NSW Public Health (COVID19 Northern Beaches) Order 2020 on Monday 21 December 2020 at Ulladulla Leisure Centre.

Council reported the breach immediately to NSW Police and sought advice from NSW Health.

As a precautionary measure Council closed the facility on Monday 21 December and conducted a deep clean of the Ulladulla Leisure Centre on Tuesday 22 December.

After further investigation with the relevant authorities, Council is satisfied that there is no public health risk at the venue as a result of the reported breach.

Council will continue to monitor all Council facilities for COVID safety in accordance with the COVID Safe Business Plan and NSW Health requirements.

Council will re-open the facility on Wednesday 23 December from midday (12.00pm).

Current COVID-19 (coronavirus) scams

Scamwatch has received over 5170 scam reports mentioning the coronavirus with over \$6 280 000 in reported losses since the outbreak of COVID-19 (coronavirus).

Watch out for online shopping scams this holiday season Losses to online shopping scams have increased 42 per cent this year, and Scamwatch is warning Australians to be careful when buying gifts this holiday season.

Threat based scams targeting young people and Chinese community

Australians have lost over \$8.8 million to threat based scams so far this year, and young people are reporting the highest losses.

NSW Recorded Crime Statistics quarterly update September 2020

Release date: 10.30am, Wednesday 09 December 2020

Link to report summary - NSW Recorded Crime Statistics quarterly update September 2020

New recorded crime statistics show many major offences were lower in quarter 3 of 2020 compared with historic norms. All high volume property and many violent crimes fell sharply in April 2020 in line with measures to reduce the spread of the pandemic. Since then offending has increased, but in most cases is yet to return to pre-pandemic levels.

An exception to this is *sexual assault* which rose 10% year-on-year to September 2020. This is the only offence to show a significant upward trend over that period. The increase in sexual assault is due to a rise in contemporary child sexual assault reports (that is, not historic child sex reports or adult victimisation).

These 11 offences showed downward trends in the 24 months to September 2020:

Non-domestic assault – Down 7.3%

Robbery without a weapon - Down 17.1%

Break and enter dwelling - Down 18.1%

Break and enter non-dwelling – Down 20.5%

Motor vehicle theft – Down 11.0%

Steal from motor vehicle – Down 21.9%

Steal from retail store – Down 20.6%

Steal from dwelling – Down 8.7%

Steal from person – Down 36.6%

Fraud – Down 12.1%

Malicious damage to property – Down 5.8%

The five remaining major offences were stable: Domestic assault, Murder, Indecent assault, Robbery with a firearm and Robbery with a weapon not a firearm.

Commenting on the findings, BOCSAR Executive Director, Jackie Fitzgerald, said that violent crime appears to be returning to pre-pandemic levels more quickly than property crime. "Non-domestic assault is now only slightly below 2019 levels. By contrast, in quarter 3 of 2020 Break & enter – dwelling was 33% below equivalent 2019 figures, car theft was 17% lower and retail theft was 34% lower."

Who says that lightning does not strike twice? The other day I received another phone

call advising me that my compensation was in after my accident (I never had one). I said, great. After speaking with the gentleman for a matter of milliseconds I knew that the caller was trying to scam me.

Look at it logically, I have a silent number, I did not have an accident in my car, the caller did not know my name, he did not know any details of the alleged accident. He did want to know my banking details. I made it clear to the caller that he was a scammer and then I hung up the phone. That is exactly what you have to do when you receive similar calls. Lately there has been the scam I just mentioned, Tax Scams where people are told by phone or letter that they will be sued or arrested if they don't pay up. People have been receiving letters from Spain indicating that if they allow their bank account to be used to park a large sum of money, they will be well rewarded. The amount offered is in the millions.

Do not be tricked by these scams. Your money is your money and you worked hard for it. Do not be fooled by the sob stories or the promise of wealth. Do not give out your bank account details to any person. If you are contacted by anyone about financial matters and they do not even know your name then hang up. Go and have a cup of tea and a biscuit happy in the knowledge that your money is safe and not in the hands of the thieving scammers. The elderly are quite vulnerable to these scams. If you have an elderly relative or friend, talk to them about the different kinds of scams and advise them that under no circumstances should they give out their bank details over the phone.
