A Local Marine Rescue Jervis Bay Story with a Happy Ending

The following account of a rescue is provided by Marine Rescue Jervis Bay. This actual incident occurred on Friday 16th December 2022 after lunch.

At 1:47pm the Marine Rescue Base Jervis Bay (at Huskisson) received a phone call from a young woman advising that a girl on an inflatable paddle board was being swept off the beach at Iluka, Jervis Bay by strong winds and was several hundred metres off the shore.

Immediately after obtaining the necessary details of the location, people involved, nature of the problem and the observers phone number, a second call was received from a woman on the beach reporting the same incident. An immediate dispatch was sent to all volunteer call-out crew members (at 1:49pm) calling for a Rescue Vessel to be activated.

The Australian Federal Police phoned the Rescue Base at 1:50pm to provide further information. The girl's father had entered the water on a boogie board wearing a set of fins to assist his daughter. She was about 600metres off the beach. It is necessary to advise the Marine Rescue NSW Zone Duty Operations Manager in case further resources are required or the local base needs assistance. His decision was to continue existing efforts and keep him informed. Now contact was made with the Marine Area Command – New South Wales Police to provide an update on the situation.

Between 1:56pm (7 minutes after the initial dispatch to crew) and 2:00pm a crew had arrived on the Rescue Vessel "Wayne Walker" JB20 and the vessel left Huskisson at speed with the Emergency Response Lights showing. At this point a brief update was provided to the informants on the beach by the base, our gratitude was expressed and they were assured the Rescue Vessel was "flying" to the scene. On the way, the JB20 Rescue crew prepared the First Aid Kit, the Defibrillator and Oxygen in case they were needed on scene. This was rough going for the crew because the wind had picked up to 20 to 25 knots from the south, south west, swell was 1.5metres and it was a very bumpy crossing, but a fast one nevertheless.

The Australian Federal Police advised that a helicopter was activated and would hover near the people in the water to guide the Rescue Vessel JB20 to the precise location. A staging point at HMAS Creswell was selected and an Ambulance called to attend. The Rescue Vessel then communicated with the helicopter directly and communications were updated to all parties a few minutes apart.

Both rescued people were retrieved from the water at approximately 2:26pm, seated out of the wind and wrapped in "space blankets" for warmth. They were assured of their safety now and advised of arrangements for further assistance from waiting paramedics and mother/wife on shore. A handover to the Paramedics at HMAS Creswell was completed at approximately 2:40pm. The family reunion on shore was something to behold and made an indelible impression on the JB20 Rescue crew.

Everyone involved including the original informants were then advised of the successful outcome. This was clearly a Rescue Team effort with the inclusion of multiple agencies displaying outstanding co-operation leading to a *wonderful* conclusion.

MASSIVE FUNDING BOOST TO REPAIR SOUTH COAST ROADS

Liberal Candidate for South Coast Luke Sikora has today welcomed the \$500 million commitment by the NSW Perrottet Government to fix local roads, which will ensure local roads across the South Coast are repaired as a priority.

Mr Sikora said funding under the new Regional and Local Roads Repair program would be made available to Shoalhaven City Council "within weeks" to allow repair works to be carried out on local roads across the region.

"Our local road network has taken a battering following recent wet weather and it is essential that support is provided to bring our local roads back up to an appropriate standard," Mr Sikora said.

"Everywhere I go across the region so many residents raise the state of our local roads. I have taken these concerns directly to the NSW Government and I am pleased they have listened and responded with such a significant funding package," he said.

"Today's announcement by the NSW Government of \$500 million comes on top of the \$50 million already provided to regional councils to help assist repair local roads. Last year Shoalhaven City Council received \$620,868 in funding under the Fixing Local Roads Pothole Repair Round and will once again benefit from the significant funding announced today.

"The application process for Shoalhaven City Council to access funding will be simple and the cash will be made available immediately so Council can get on with the job of urgently restoring our local road network.

"So many of our towns and villages have only one access road in and out. Whether Bendalong Road, Greenwell Point Road, Sussex Inlet Road, or Matron Porter Drive, it is essential that accesses to homes and businesses are repaired to ensure safety for local residents.



Boardwalk Construction - Ray Brooks Reserve, Sanctuary Point Update.

Project Status In progress Where <u>Greville Avenue, Sanctuary Point 2540</u>



The project involves the replacement of the existing boardwalk, including demolition,

construction, and associated concrete works.

The boardwalk project commenced on 21 July 2022. To facilitate this work, the existing access boardwalk had to be removed.

The original completion date of this project was scheduled for the end of November 2022, however, due to unforeseen, prolonged weather events, and extended material lead times, the construction program has experienced significant delays. Council will be proceeding with construction works over the coming months, with the new construction completion



date, anticipated to be March - April 2023.

During this time vehicle access to the reserve will remain unrestricted, however pedestrian access to the reserve, in close proximity to the construction site, will be closed. Pedestrians are advised to access the reserve via the walkway between 216-218 Greville Avenue Sanctuary Point (please see the image below). Council will be providing directional signage indicating alternative pedestrian access to the reserve.

The new accessible boardwalk has been jointly funded by Council and a grant from the Australian Government - <u>Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Fund</u>.



Public homage as Benedict lies in state

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI 's body, his head resting on a pair of crimson pillows, lay in state in St. Peter's Basilica as thousands of people filed by to pay tribute to the pontiff who shocked the world by retiring a decade ago.

As daylight broke on Monday 10 white-gloved Papal Gentlemen, lay assistants to pontiffs and papal households, carried the body on a cloth-covered wooden stretcher up the centre aisle of the mammoth basilica to its resting place in front of the main altar under Bernini's towering bronze canopy.

A Swiss Guard saluted as the body was brought in via a side door after Benedict's remains, placed in a van, had been transferred from the chapel of the monastery grounds where the increasingly frail, 95-year-old former pontiff passed away on Saturday morning.

His longtime secretary Archbishop Georg Gaenswein, and a handful of consecrated laywomen who served in Benedict's household, followed the van by foot in a silent procession toward the basilica.

Just after 9am, the doors of the basilica were swung open so the public, some who had waited for hours in the dampness before dawn, could pay their respects to the late pontiff, who retired from the papacy in 2013 to become the first pope to do so in 600 years.

Sod turns to start work on Jervis Bay Road flyover

Four years of community campaigning has come to an end, with work officially beginning on the Jervis Bay Road flyover.

But the turning of the first sod on Friday also brings the start of four years of construction work and the associated delays it will cause, beginning early in 0223.



Vincentia Matters secretary Liz Tooley said the prospect of traffic problems at the intersection with the Princes Highway would not stop the celebrations among Jervis Bay residents. "We're absolutely delighted, this is such an important day," she said.

"The early works have started on schedule, which was promised all along, the design is absolutely fantastic, and the community is absolutely delighted with what is happening." The organisation's chairman, Ross Popplewell, said debate over the Jervis Bay Road intersection had brought the community together as it fought against earlier proposals including traffic lights and a roundabout.

"We had 14,500 written signatures to say that they wanted the flyover, and it was taken to Parliament and all sides of Parliament supported it on the floor.

"For this to happen today, one the last couple of days of working time in 2022, will show the community that Transport for NSW is delivering," Mr Popplewell said. "We're very happy and we've got a great relationship, they ring us and ask us our views."

Kiama MP Gareth Ward praised the community's work on the issue, and the role in rejecting early plans until the right one was found.

"Because of consistent community campaigning, we've seen an interchange which is the best option for what is a busy intersection and a dangerous intersection, and the community should give itself one hell of a pat on the back," he said.

South Coast MP Shelley Hancock said the planned flyover would end traffic and safety concerns in the area, once completed. "It has been an extraordinarily long process to get to this, because I think everybody, including the community and the tourists who visit this area in increasing numbers, know the JB intersection has been a problem for a long time, and whilst we've put in some improvements over the years, we really haven't come this far," Mrs Hancock said.

Gilmore MP Fiona Phillips said the Federal Government acknowledged the need for an urgent upgrade at the intersection, and was contributing \$100 million to the project. "We know that this intersection is the most dangerous intersection from here to the Victorian border," she said.

"We know that this is where many, many accidents occur, and it's vital that it's upgraded to improve the safety of people's lives."

The sod turning involved all three levels of government, with deputy mayor Paul Ell representing Shoalhaven Council.



New data: New South Wales Criminal Courts Statistics Jul 2017 - Jun 2022

Release Date: Thursday 15 December 2022

The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research has released the latest Criminal Court Statistics showing court processes from 2017/18 to 2021/22.

Link to report summary: <u>New South Wales Criminal Courts Statistics</u> Jul 2017 - Jun 2022

Key results include:

• The pandemic has disrupted the operations of the Criminal Courts. In the 12 months to June 2022 the NSW Criminal Courts finalised 131,610 court appearances; this is 6% fewer than in the previous 12-month period and 6% fewer than in the years prior to the pandemic (2017/18 and 2018/19).

The reduction in finalisations has been particularly pronounced for

• defended matters finalised in the Local Court. In the year to June 2022 the Local Court finalised 11,617 defended hearings. This was 29% fewer than in the year 2018/19 (n = 16,699).

• As a consequence, time to justice for defended hearings in the Local Court has risen significantly. In 2021/22 the median time to finalise a

defended hearing in the Local Court rose to 279 days from arrest to

• finalisation; this is an 82 day increase from median time to finalisation in the year 2018/19 (198 days).

• About a third of defended hearing the Local Court are domestic

• violence related. For domestic violence related defended hearings time from arrest to finalisation rose from 160 days in the year 2018/19 to 271 days in 2021/22.
