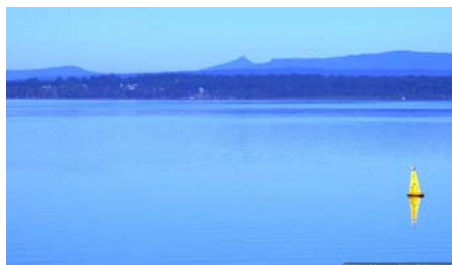

FUNDING FOR NEW POLICE STATION

Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock has today welcomed additional funding towards the new police station in the Bay and Basin area.

The 2016/17 State budget has allocated \$1.24 million towards the new \$5 million project.

Mrs Hancock said this was welcome funding for the new station.

"The new Bay and Basin station will be a relocation of the Huskisson Police Station to a more central location which will better support policing across the community," Mrs Hancock said.

"Investigations are currently underway to identify a suitable site for the new station.

"Our local police work exceptionally hard protecting our community and this relocation will improve response times and efficiency for officers."

Deputy Premier and Minister for Police Troy Grant said the new police station will benefit the new community and the officers stationed there.

"The new station will be a state-of-the-art police station which will service the community now and in to the future," Mr Grant said.



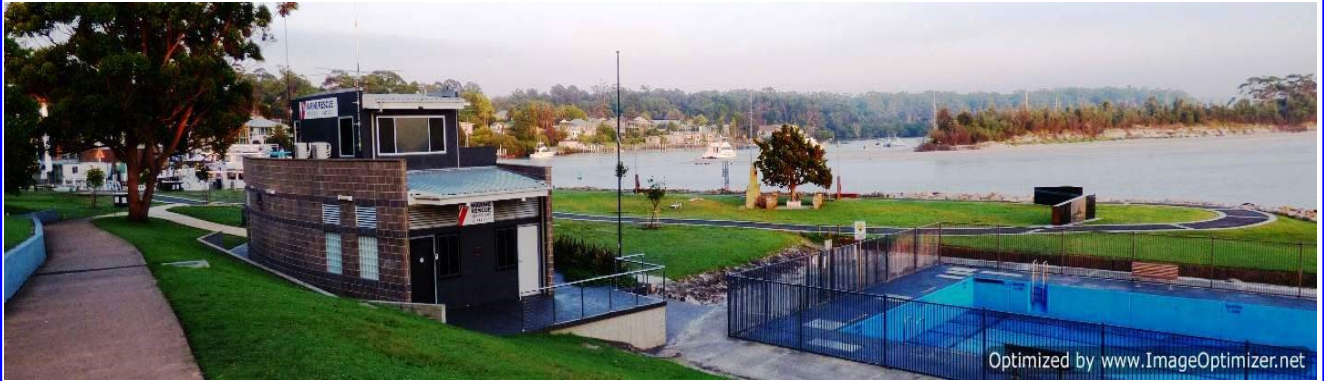

DANGER
Check for danger/ensure area is safe
• to yourself • to others • to the casualty

RESPONSE
Squeeze the person's shoulders. Shout "are you okay?" and check for consciousness.

A Guide to Resuscitation

A AIRWAY	CHECK, OPEN AND CLEAR AIRWAY IF BLOCKED, Roll onto side, support head, clear mouth and airway.	REMEMBER, PHONE 000 Ask for assistance, phone '000' or mobile '112' for an Ambulance.	
	B BREATHING	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'YES' Position person on their side, and ensure the airway remains clear. Continue to monitor breathing.	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'NO' Turn person onto back. Support head and jaw. (A slight head tilt may be necessary to open airway) Give two breaths.
C COMPRESSION	CHECK FOR SIGNS OF LIFE If no response and not breathing, give 30 compressions in centre of chest.	CONTINUE TO GIVE 2 BREATHS AND 30 COMPRESSIONS Only stop to check casualty if they start breathing normally. Continue until emergency services take over.	
	HAND POSITION	ADULT 2 hands (one on top of the other), in centre of chest	CHILDREN 1 or 2 hands in centre of chest
COMPRESS	1/3 the depth of chest		
RATIO	Give 30 compressions at a rate of 100 per minute and then give 2 breaths		
CPR	Repeat 30 compressions and 2 breaths sequence

I congratulate Shoalhaven Council for erecting these signs at the aquatic areas of our recreation and as this guide is part of the First Aid Training Courses I undertake, it is also applicable to any instances where First Aid is required.

I have include this in my newsletter and perhaps it might one day save a life, or inspire other concerned citizens to undertake a first aid course!

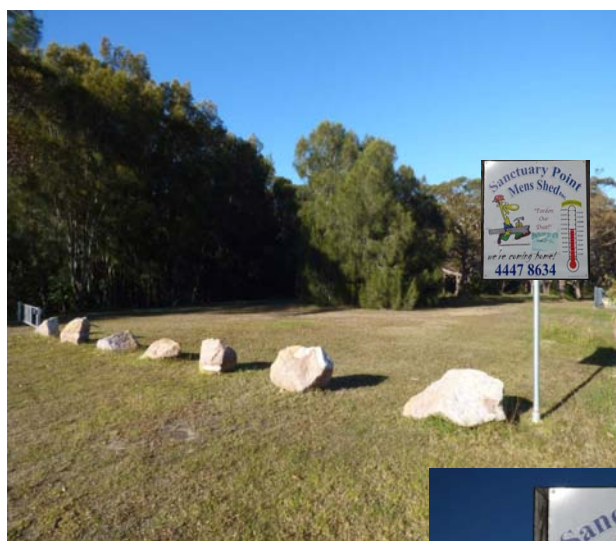

Internet fraud

How many computers do you think there are in the world? If you said, 'Almost two billion' you would probably be right. I also found out that there are at least three billion people that have access to the internet. I know this because I googled it on the interweb. There are

lots of things that you can do on the internet from meeting your next partner to ordering your next take-away, from downloading music to face booking a friend, from buying a car to losing your money and not getting the goods. What! It's true. Do not believe everything you see or hear on the internet.

Be very careful when getting involved in any transaction online. Make sure you do background inquiries before getting involved in buying or selling, getting work done or sending property away to get fixed. If you don't you may never see your money or property again. Don't fall for the "Send me half now and the other half on delivery" trick. Be aware of fraudsters. If it sounds too good to be true it probably is.

Motor vehicle collisions:

This is a true story: Once upon a time in a land far far away called Victoria, a 50 something female (let's call her Kevin) was travelling in her car at a speed of 90kph with her young niece and nephew in the back seat. Everything was great, the sun was shining and the birds were singing when all of a sudden the day took a very bad turn. A vehicle travelling behind sped up and crashed into the rear of Kevin's vehicle. The offending vehicle somehow became stuck on the rear of the car and forced Kevin's vehicle off the road. After a side panel broke off the rear vehicle the unknown driver drove away. Kevin's car eventually came to a stop just before the tree line.

The only known evidence at this time was a description of the offending vehicle. No CCTV available and no ID of the driver or number plate of the vehicle. At this point Kevin feared that the offender would never be caught. Most of us would think the same. However a strange twist of fate suddenly appeared on the back of Kevin's car in the guise of impressions in the dust at the rear of his vehicle. Remember, Police will follow up if need be and be mindful that there may well be witnesses, CCTV or even dust impressions that may result in a knock on your door if you try to get away with it.
