COVID-19 Tasmania: Hobart's Jean Hutton, 105, gets her vaccination

At 105, Tasmania's Jean Hutton has become possibly the oldest Australian to get the AstraZeneca vaccination.



Mrs Hutton rolled up her sleeve at the Health Department community clinic at Rosny, in Hobart, on Wednesday to receive her first dose.

Having survived the 1918 Spanish Flu, she said the best thing she could do during this pandemic was to get vaccinated against COVID-19.

"I feel it is the right thing to do for the community," Mrs Hutton said.

"I get a lot of visitors in my home and the vaccination will help keep everybody safe."

The third-generation Tasmanian lives independently in Hobart where she's been most of her life, apart from some time on Bruny Island.

Daughter Lynne Pope said her mum had embraced and coped with change all her life.

This included getting her very first heat pump this winter, having chopped all her own firewood until this year - despite living with deteriorating vision.

"I'm surprised she's still got 10 fingers," Ms Pope said.

Mrs Hutton was born a twin, but sadly her birth-sister died at nine months.

Her timber-mill working father lived to the age of 89 year and her mother to 93 years.

Health Department deputy secretary Dale Webster congratulated Mrs Hutton for rolling up her sleeve to get vaccinated against COVID-19.

"Mrs Hutton has set the example for every one of us to follow and get vaccinated," he said.

"If she can do it, then everyone else who is eligible for a vaccine can do it too.

"Without doubt Mrs Hutton is a very special Tasmanian, and I'm pleased she's getting vaccinated, not just for herself but to help protect her family and friends.

"Her actions her today are to be commended."

As of June 22, more than 154,600 Tasmanians had received a first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, and 40,728 the second dose.

It means more than 195,400 vaccinations have been administered in total.


The map shows the areas where the restrictions apply

"I look forward to learning more about the nominees and their stories, alongside a number of exciting local activities and events planned for NAIDOC Week that will run from 4-11 July 2021."



Rate & Water interest charges recommence 1 July 2021

In January 2020, Council resolved to waive interest charges on outstanding rates and provide financial assistance for some water charges. In addition, from 1 July 2020, Council waived interest charges on all outstanding rates and water accounts until 30 June 2021.

This was just one of the ways Council offered financial relief to Shoalhaven residents in the wake of the Black Summer fires and the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. Just a reminder for all residents, from 1 July 2021, Council will reinstate interest charges on overdue accounts at an interest rate of 1.5% p.a. Reinstating at this low interest rate will allow Council to continue supporting the community in the wake of 2020 financial strain while remaining financially viable.

Shoalhaven ratepayers will receive details about this change in your Rates notice in early July 2021. If you are experiencing financial hardship and need assistance managing outstanding rates or water payments, Council has a number of ways we can support you. Winter is the Time to Watch Out for Woody Weeds; Bitou Bush

Shoalhaven City Council is encouraging the community to be on the lookout for Bitou bush as winter takes hold. June marks the start of Council's annual Bitou bush control program, with the aim to prevent the further spread of this invasive weed across multiple beaches across the region.



Bitou bush is an introduced species that thrives in coastal environments with significant infestations in the Culburra, Berrara and Bendalong areas. Shoalhaven City Mayor Amanda Findley is encouraging everyone to play their part by locating these invasive weeds.

"Council is commencing the annual Bitou bush control program. The program will aid in the protection of the Shoalhaven's native flora and fauna and our Environmental Officers need the community's help in locating these plants." Clr Findley said.

"Integrated controlled techniques are used to provide targeted control of the weed. Spot spraying, hand removal, biological controls and licensed drone spraying of Bitou bush in manually inaccessible areas such as cliff lines at Bendalong: these are all methods being employed starting in June and continuing throughout the Bitou bush control season," Clr Findley said.

"It is important that the community report any isolated Bitou bush plants as they can potentially create large infestations within the area, resulting in significant environmental damage," Clr Findley said.

"As a community we have put so much effort into controlling this ferocious growing woody weed, it would be sad to see us return to the infestation levels of the past. We really need our citizen patrol to be out there looking and even weeding if they have the knowledge to do so," Clr Findley said.

A Bitou bush can be identified by its multi-stemmed bush with bright green, round, fleshy leaves and distinctive yellow 'daisy' flowers, which are clustered at the end of branches. The main flowering season is May to July, which makes it easy to spot along coastal dunes. Further to this, the bush may also have ripe berries containing hard seeds which are black and fleshy.

Community members are encouraged to report isolated Bitou bush plants or infestations they see along the coastline; residents are also reminded to not remove the plant themselves as this may result in accidental spread of the weed.

The South Coast is a 'massive winner' following the release of the 2021-22 NSW Budget yesterday.

Vital funds have been secured for projects on the South Coast including new schools, upgrades to the Princes Highway and Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital.

Funding secured as part of the <u>2021-22 NSW State Budget</u> for the South Coast includes:

\$11.691 million to commence early construction works on

the redevelopment of the Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital

- \$61 million for the Berry to Bomaderry upgrade
- \$72 million for the Nowra Bridge replacement

\$88 million to continue and finalise planning on Princes Highway projects

\$13.404 million to commence construction on Budawang School for Milton

\$5.269 million for a new primary school for South Nowra/Worrigee

\$2.094 million to upgrade Bomaderry High School

The Budget will also deliver an increase in the <u>Community Building Partnership Program</u>, with the South Coast electorate receiving an additional \$100,000 in funding, totalling \$400,000 available for community projects.

As a mother and grandmother, I am pleased to see the NSW Government allocating \$44 million for swimming lessons. South Coast families will be able to use a \$100 Learn to Swim voucher for children aged three to six, making a huge difference and could help save lives.

This Budget shows that the <u>NSW Government</u> is working hard to deliver for South Coast people and their families.

Crime statistics March 2021: Sexual assault spikes in March Release date: 10.30am, Thursday 10 June 2021

Link to reports summary:

NSW Recorded Crime Statistics quarterly update March 2021 Why did sexual assault reports spike in March 2021?

Latest crime statistics released by the NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) show a sharp and unexpected jump in sexual assaults reported to NSW Police in March 2021. Police recorded 940 sexual assaults in March 2021; 300 more than in February 2021 and 61% more than the monthly average.

The increase appears to be due to a temporary rise in victim willingness to formally report sexual violence. The timing of the increase closely aligns with saturation media coverage of numerous sexual assault allegations in late February and March 2021. This triggered a wide-spread community conversation about sexual violence and consent of a scale not previously seen.

Sexual assaults involving victims aged 13 to 20 years accounted for two thirds of the increase and the vast majority involved female victims. The rise in sexual assault reports was as much to do with an increase in recent contemporary assaults as it was related to reports of historical offences.

General Crime Statistics

In the 24 months to March 2021, two of the 17 major crime categories showed upward trends, ten trended downwards and the remaining five were stable. The offences trending upward were sexual assault (up 14.4%) and domestic violence related assault (up 1.1%). The offences trending downwards were:

- Robbery without a weapon Down 21.9%
- Robbery with a firearm Down 35.2%
- Break and enter dwelling Down 27.1%
- Break and enter non-dwelling Down 32.6%
- Motor vehicle theft Down 16.3%
- Steal from motor vehicle Down 29.1%
- Steal from retail store Down 29.0%
- Steal from dwelling Down 13.8%
- Steal from person Down 45.2%
- Fraud Down 17.9%

The large decreases reported in many offences represent falls in crime associated with the response to the pandemic in 2020. Since April 2020 violent offending has returned to pre-pandemic levels, but many property offences, including car theft, break and enter and retail theft are still below pre-pandemic level.

Commenting on the findings, BOCSAR Executive Director, Jackie Fitzgerald, said the spike in reported sexual assault incidents was remarkable and preliminary April data suggests reports have since come back down. "Typically only around 10% or 15% of adult sexual assault victims report to police. The March 2021 increase shows that, under the right conditions, more victims will come forward. More now needs to be done to make sure that victims who reach out are appropriately supported."
