
They call this NATURAL... I call it DISGUSTING!

A SHOT IN THE ARM FOR LOCAL HEALTH SERVICES

Federal Member, Ann Sudmalis MP, has welcomed increased incentives to attract doctors to some of Gilmore's smaller towns.

"The changes to the GP Rural Incentives Programme mean the townships of Basin View, Callala Bay, Culburra Beach, Milton, Old Erowal Bay, St George's Basin, Sussex Inlet, Ulladulla, and Vincentia will be able to offer greater incentives to attract GPs to their communities.

Mrs Sudmalis said the change is a big win for health care in our region.

"South Coast residents know far too well how our communities struggle to attract and keep doctors," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"In the restructure the \$50 million previously used to pay incentives to doctors in regional cities like Cairns and Townsville, will instead be given to small regional townships.

"Under the old structure Gilmore doctors could only receive a maximum incentive of \$12,000.

"A participating doctor in Vincentia will now receive \$18,000 in their fifth year in the region.

"Getting more doctors to work and stay on the South Coast is a big plus for the people of Gilmore." Mrs Sudmalis concluded.

Mayor, Gash welcomes work on new Sanctuary Point Skate Park

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor, Joanna Gash joined Federal Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis in inspecting works on the Sanctuary Point Skate Park at Francis Ryan Reserve this morning.

Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis also took the opportunity to provide Council with a cheque for \$170,000 to complete construction of the high quality facility.

Mayor, Gash said she was delighted to see construction works having already commenced on the new skate park saying she was particularly excited to see the works that had already taken place over the past four weeks.

The Mayor said Council undertook significant consultation with local residents prior to the engagement of a consultant to undertake the detailed design.

"I would like to thank Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis on today's presentation of \$170,000 towards the construction of a skate park in Sanctuary Park," said Clr Gash.

"It was fantastic to see children from Sanctuary Point Public School attend this morning's event. They were over the moon to see the results of their input being used while looking forward to testing out the completed facility."

"Local residents have been working with Council to ensure the development of a skate park at Francis Ryan Reserve for some time and it is extremely pleasing to see this project almost completed.

"Council held a public meeting and engaged with local businesses and schools as well as community groups and local youth in coming up with ideas prior to the development of the project plan."

"These comments were provided to the consultant to incorporate into the design while the community was also provided with an opportunity to comment on the concept designs."

"Once completed, the Sanctuary Point Skate Park will provide the local community with a fantastic recreational facility and a vibrant meeting hub for people of all ages."

Construction on the facility commenced in late April with works already progressing ahead of schedule.

As some of you may have heard on the radio this morning Friday 5th June 2015, our state MP Mrs. Shelley Hancock (as promised) has met with the Minister for Police and Justice, Deputy Premier Troy Grant, about the possible location of and time-frame for the new Bay and Basin Police Station to serve our community in the future.

The Deputy Premier and Minister (who is himself a ex-country policeman) has once again promised that the police station will be built in the area prior to the next NSW State Election due in 2019 and has stated that extensive consultation with the community will be held prior to this time, to determine the exact location, size, scope and features of this facility to best meet the community's needs.

This is a great step forward for the project and our community and we hope to be able to hear from Shelley and the Minister in coming weeks and months in person about what future plans for the facility have been developed and what input we as community members can have going forward and what suggestions we want to see put into action now.

Shoalhaven City Council are getting on with encouraging and welcoming large construction Developments in the Shoalhaven... Another Development has been approved opposite the Bayswood Avenue entrance to Bayswood Residential, on Jervis Bay Road (Naval College Parade).

Council approves \$6.5 million motel for Worrowing Heights

Shoalhaven City Council has approved a Development Application for the demolition of an existing dwelling and construction of an 80 room motel at Worrowing Heights during tonight's Ordinary Meeting.

The \$6 million Development Application allows for the construction of 80 accommodation rooms, manager's residence, reception building, restaurant, pool, tennis court, day spa and visitor parking areas.

Mayor, Joanna Gash said the proposed development would provide the Bay and Basin area with high quality motel style accommodation and ancillary services unique to the area.

The Mayor said that while Council had placed a number of conditions on the DA in order to protect the amenity of adjoining residents she was extremely pleased to see developments of this size coming to the area.

"The Bay and Basin area does not currently cater to large groups seeking high quality accommodation and recreational facilities despite being one of the most visited areas in the State," said Clr Gash.

"Once completed this development will provide the local tourism industry with another huge shot in the arm and help cater to the area's growing overseas and internal visitors.

"Council certainly considered the potential impacts this development may have on adjoining property owners and have implemented a number of conditions on the DA to potentially minimise these."

"While I sympathise with the neighbours of the development, the proposed motel provides a form of accommodation that this area desperately needs if we are to continue growing the local economy."

The Mayor said the development represents a number of changes for the area that includes the recent commencement of works on the new Vincentia Shopping Centre.

Conditions placed on the development include -

- A noise barrier to be set back a minimum of one metre on the access way and 10 metres on the eastern boundary to accommodate a landscape barrier.
- A dilapidation report to be provided on the adjoining residences to ensure any damage incurred during construction is addressed.
- The noise attenuation barrier to be designed and constructed to ensure it provides sound attenuation and an attractive appearance.

The time has come. If you are the owner of a frearm I am sure that you have been waiting in anticipation for this week's episode of On the Beat because as promised I have some info about the safe keeping of your Fire Sticks. There are a number of levels for the storage of firearms which includes Plateds and believe it or not, Cannons. The most common is Level 1 which covers the gun categories of A and B. All illecence holders (Gunp) in NSV/are subject to the general requirement for safe storage of firearms under Part 4-Section 39 of the Firearms Act 1996. Any person in possession of a firearm must take all reasonable precautions to ensure the firearm's section (A), In not feet or stolen and does not come into the possession of an unauthorized person.

Section 40 of the Act provides mandatory minimum requirements for the safe keeping and storage of Firearms hed under a Category A & B licence as follows:

"When any firearm is not actually being used or carried, it must be stored in a locked receptacie of a type approved by the Commissioner of Police and that it is constructed of hard enopty, it must be fixed in order to prevent its easy removal.

"The locks of such a receptacle must be of solid metal and be of a type approved by the Commissioner."

"Any ammunition for the firearm must be stored in a locked containing any such firearm. Failure to meet these requirements is punishable by a fine in excess of \$200 and/or 12 months imprisonment. The minimum standards for the locking mechanisms of a safe/receptacle are as follows:

"The locks must be solid metal lock/s have a minimum of 100 key changes; or be PIN activation, and; or have biometric (fireperpint) activation, and;
