Pedestrians walking, Parents Wheeling Prams, Disable riding motorised scooters, children walking to school, people walking their dogs, must find it very frustrating, avoiding the challengers they encounter, either on the verge or shoulder of the road, when footpaths are not available.

Overgrown bushes, vegetation, paspalum, motor vehicles parked, trailers and other equipment, overtaking the verge, while grass has been allowed to encroach up to the edge of our roadways and eliminating the shoulder, that is primarily for the use

of motor vehicles to park and allow the main roadway clear for motor vehicles to use in safety.

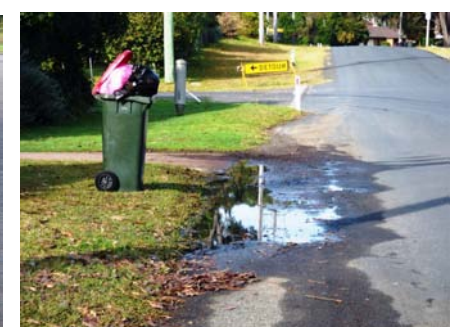
If most of the 49 towns and villages of the Shoalhaven are in such a distressed state , as are the road shoulders, lack of pathways, and excessive vehicles, equipment and other obstacles being parked across the verges , as that which is experienced in Sanctuary Point! 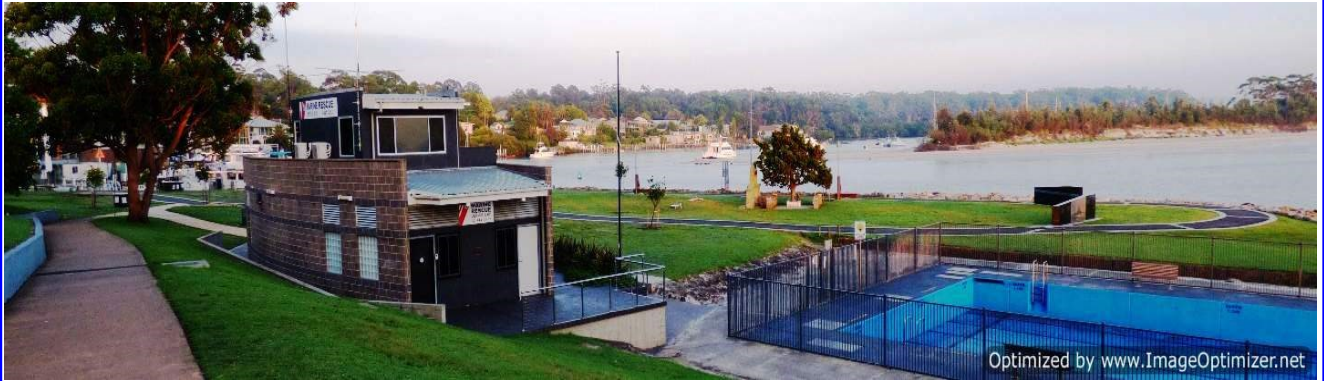

A Guide to Resuscitation

A AIRWAY	CHECK, OPEN AND CLEAR AIRWAY IF BLOCKED, Roll onto side, support head, clear mouth and airway.	REMEMBER, PHONE 000 Ask for assistance, phone '000' or mobile '112' for an Ambulance.	
	B BREATHING	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'YES' Position person on their side, and ensure the airway remains clear. Continue to monitor breathing.	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'NO' Turn person onto back. Support head and jaw. (A slight head tilt may be necessary to open airway) Give two breaths.
C COMPRESSION	CHECK FOR SIGNS OF LIFE If no response and not breathing, give 30 compressions in centre of chest.	CONTINUE TO GIVE 2 BREATHS AND 30 COMPRESSIONS Only stop to check casualty if they start breathing normally. Continue until emergency services take over.	
	HAND POSITION	ADULT 2 hands (one on top of the other), in centre of chest	CHILDREN 1 or 2 hands in centre of chest

The messy truth about flushable wipes

Wet wipes are wreaking havoc on Australia's plumbing and waterways.

Water Utilities working together 12th May 2016

Wet wipes are a growing and serious problem for sewer systems across the nation with 75% of sewer blockages being caused by wet wipes or similarly branded items. Carmel Krogh, Director of Shoalhaven Water who recently interviewed on Power FM 94.9 explained that people might be misled with package labelling which indicates products are flushable, and they are not.

The wipes simply do not break down in the sewerage system and instead create blockages. The interview and discussion can be heard by visiting [Power FM](#). Welcome to “On the Beat” for this week. I know that you have been shaking in anticipation for the next installment. Wait no longer. Today we are going to learn about locking mechanisms in vehicles.

There are a few tools that you will need when unlocking and locking a car door. A key ring: This is required to put your car key on to. A Car Key: This is required to be put on a key ring. Once you have the Car key on the key ring, you must decide what you want to do with the vehicle. If you are going to drive the vehicle, you will have to approach it first. If you have electric locks, push the open padlock icon on the black part of your car key and the doors will unlock. If you don't have automatic locking, place the key into the driver's side door lock and turn anti clockwise, you are then able to enter the vehicle and drive to anywhere you want.

When you have made it to your destination, alight from your vehicle. Once outside your vehicle face the door. For automatic locking, push the closed padlock icon on the black part of your car key and the doors will lock. If you don't have automatic locking, place the key into the driver's side door and turn it clockwise. You will find that the car door is locked from this point on. Repeat this sequence every time you go out in the car and when you return to your home.

Next week's topic of On the Beat will be “How to open the car door, remove your valuables and re lock the car.
