

Shoalhaven City Council is seeking feedback on the Community Strategic Plan - Shoalhaven 2032 (CSP).

In 2021, Council asked the community to tell us about their priorities for the future. Using this valuable input, the CSP has been drafted and is on exhibition for feedback. This ten-year plan will guide Council's actions and goals, for delivery in collaboration with all levels of government, businesses, industry groups, community organisations and individuals.

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor said, "Last year we checked in with the community to review and update the Plan to ensure it reflects the community's vision for the city and is our guide for action over the next 10 years to 2032."

"Not only did Council talk to the community, but your 13 elected councillors have been intensely listening. Sometimes things change along the way, so it really is important for you the community to have your final say, as we lock in this important guide for action."

"The Shoalhaven Community Strategic Plan is a long-term plan that identifies the main priorities and aspirations of the community for the future It tells us what we are striving to achieve, the strategies we use to achieve it and outcomes that tell us if we have reached our goals."

"Each of the key themes and priorities were identified by our community as well as a broad range of issues that are important to them."

"Now is the chance to have your say and check that the draft Community Strategic Plan 2032 reflects what you have told us," Mayor Findley said.

2022 COMMUNITY BUILDING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM OPEN

Member for South Coast, Shelley Hancock MP today announced the opening of applications for the 2022 Community Building Partnership program, unlocking \$37.2 million for community infrastructure projects across NSW.

Mrs Hancock said \$400,000 is available for projects in each NSW electorate, including South Coast and urged local councils and not-for-profit groups to apply for the funds they need to deliver projects with social, environmental and recreational outcomes.

"Local sports clubs, charities, schools and museums are just some of the groups that benefit from this program," Mrs Hancock said.

"If your organisation or club needs extra funding for infrastructure, such as playgrounds, accessible features, equipment or refurbishment, then I'd strongly encourage you to apply."

Community Building Partnership (CBP) 2022 Program

Need help funding a community infrastructure project? Apply for a CBP grant.



The NSW Government is excited to announce the 2022 Community Building Partnership program. This program invests in infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes, while promoting community participation, inclusion and cohesion.

In 2022, there's a maximum of \$400,000 to allocate in each electorate. Incorporated not-for-profit community organisations and local councils are eligible to apply for grants of between \$5,000 and \$150,000.

Projects must be for building, refurbishing or repairing community infrastructure, or for buying freestanding equipment or vehicles with an individual value of more than \$5,000.

Applications open at 9:00am on 16 May 2022 and close at 5:00pm on 10 June 2022.

The Community Building Partnership program has awarded more than \$399 million to over 18,000 projects since it commenced in 2009.

"This program means that you can support your community group to improve the places you meet, train or play," Mrs Hancock said.

"Take the time to prepare and submit your application so your community group doesn't miss out on a share of \$400.000."

Applications are open from Monday 16 May and close at 5 pm, Friday 10 June 2022. Applicants must read the program guidelines to ensure their club or organisation and proposed project are eligible. Moggie a wanderer? Time to stop puss in his tracks

Eleven NSW councils will participate in a new project aimed at educating cat owners about the importance of protecting our wildlife by keeping their moggies at home.

It is estimated that nationally, domestic cats kill about 390 million animals every year. The Keeping Cats Safe at Home project will, launched by the state government and RSPCA NSW hopes to drastically reduce that toll.

"Owners who let their cats roam might not think their moggie is doing much damage, but we know that on average, each roaming pet cat kills an average of 186 reptiles, birds and mammals per year in Australia," said Environment Minister James Griffin.

"The majority of animals killed by pet cats are native Australian species. Cats roaming away from home is disastrous for our native species and the ecosystems that rely on each species' existence.

"Cats are lovely companion animals, which is why we're working with RSPCA NSW to encourage pet owners to keep their cats at home."

Each council involved in the program will get a tailored program to address specific needs and challenges they encounter in their local government areas.

The project will also improve access to free desexing and microchipping for cat owners in target areas.

<u>RSPCA NSW</u> chief executive Steve Coleman said initial research showed the owners of Australia's estimated 3.8 million cats are starting to understand the importance of keeping them at home.

"Although our surveys have found that at least 50 per cent of people contain their cats, either indoors or through outdoor enclosures, it's vital that we continue to increase this figure and improve the lives of our pets and our wildlife," he said.

"Pet cats kept safely contained live up to 10 years longer than cats allowed to roam, making it an important change to adopt for their overall health and safety."

Councils involved are Blue Mountains, Byron, Campbelltown, Parramatta, Hornsby, Northern Beaches, Shoalhaven, Tweed, Kyogle, Walgett and Weddin.







NSW Custody Statistics March 2022 released today



Link to report summary - <u>NSW Custody Statistics: Quarterly update March 2022</u>

The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research have today released adult prison and youth custody statistics up to March 2022. **Key results:**

Adult Prison

From December 2021 to March 2022 the adult prison population grew by 1.5% to 12,352 (up 184 inmates). This growth was due entirely to an increase in the re-





mand population, which increased 4.8% (212 people). The adult prison population is still approximately 1,600 people lower than before the pandemic.

Youth Detention

From December 2021 to March 2022 the youth detention population increased by 14.4% to 183 young people (up 23 detainees). The number of Aboriginal young

people in custody increased by 25 detainees or 36% over the same period. In March 2022, Aboriginal young people made up 51.4% of the total youth detention population, the largest proportion observed since January 2019.
