



NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK 2023: BE A VOICE FOR GENERATIONS

Reconciliation Week from 27th May to 3rd June provides an opportunity for the people of New South Wales to come together and learn more about our shared histories, cultures and achievements. It is also a time for us to think about the contribution we can make to achieving reconciliation.

Leader of the Opposition Mark Speakman said that the Reconciliation Week 2023 theme encourages all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation and it is an opportunity for us to consider what we do in our everyday lives that will lead to a more equitable and reconciled nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.



Green Ceramics MICROfactorieTM

\$500,000 from the Environment Trust to enter into a partnership with the University of NSW's Sustainable Materials and Technology Centre to establish a Green Ceramics MICROfactorie™ at West Nowra Project Status Where 120 Flatrock Road, Mundamia 2541 Last reviewed 09 February 2023

About the project

The UNSW SMaRT Centre is a leading National research centre, that works in collaboration with industry, to ensure new recycling science is translated into real-world environmental and economic benefits. Essentially, waste is reformed into value-added materials for re-use and remanufacturing.

Waste materials such as plastic, glass, textiles and mattresses will be processed to produce a range of 'green ceramics'. Sorted and cleaned waste plastics will also be turned into pellets, or 3D printing filament.

These green ceramics are a new generation of high performance, non-toxic, engineered bio-composites, for use in buildings as furniture and ceramic tiles and for various architectural and decorative applications. Green ceramic products are typically made from the types of waste glass and textiles that are either highly contaminated (i.e. spoiled) or made from composite materials, making them difficult to recycle.

The new facility will annually process approximately 450 tonnes of glass and mattresses and produce green ceramic tiles, and other furnishings, including kitchen benches and tabletops

Broken and dirty glass leftover from the kerbside recycling sorting process is typically considered too contaminated for recyclers. Council Waste Services has developed a washing, crushing and sizing plant that can recycle it into glass sand and green ceramic products.

Shoalhaven is leading the way by using innovative, cutting-edge technology to solve our growing waste problem. In the near future, Council aims to accept waste plastics, glass and mattresses Nationally to help reduce these types of waste going to landfill.

The construction of the Green ceramics MICROfactorie[™] facility starts late 2022 and aims to be completed by mid 2023.



NSW LABOR TO SCRAP THE REGIONAL APPRENTICE AND UNIVERSITY STUDENT TRAVEL CARD

The New South Wales Labor Government has refused to rule out cutting the Regional Apprentice and University Student Travel Card in its September Budget.

The former Liberal and Nationals Government travel card has been instrumental in assisting over 5,000 regional apprentices since its inception this year to manage the cost of travel associated with their studies or apprenticeships.

NSW Nationals Leader, Shadow Minister for Regional NSW and Member for the Dubbo electorate Dugald Saunders said the comments by Labor last week just confirm what we already knew - if you don't live in Sydney, Newcastle or Wollongong the Labor Government doesn't care.

"When we launched the trial of this card in Dubbo in February I met with Luke Prentice, a mature-aged apprentice electrician with a young family who was going to benefit by being able to use the card to buy fuel to get to work and to training," Mr Saunders said. "Luke described the card as a welcome boost to his family's budget, and there would be thousands of people in regional NSW like Luke who will suffer because Labor doesn't care about the bush.

"I asked the Regional Transport Minister Jenny Aitchison on Thursday last week in Parliament whether she would cut the program. It was a simple yes or no question which the Minister spent seven minutes failing to answer. Labor needs to come clean about whether it truly supports cost of living measures like this card."

Shadow Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Sam Farraway said he has been disappointed by the lack of commitment from the current government given the investment he had previously put forward as the Minister.

"We know the difference this card is already making, and will continue to make right across regional NSW. Labor needs to come clean on its plans and not keep stringing people along pretending it cares about cost of living."

The NSW Liberals and Nationals remain committed to advocating for regional apprentices and university students, and will continue to put pressure on the Government to stop cutting support in a time of unprecedented cost of living pressures.



New BOCSAR Criminal Court Statistics: January 2018 to December 2022

NSW Criminal Courts Statistics Jan 2018 - Dec 2022

The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research has today released its latest NSW Criminal Court Statistics report, showing the court process from January 2018 to December 2022.

The key findings include:

- The number of court appearances finalised in the NSW Local Court in 2022 exceeded pre-pandemic years for the first time suggesting a resumption in regular court operations post-COVID. In 2022 the Local Court finalised 134,610 court appearances. This is up 12% from 2021, and up 6% from 2019.
- There are, however, some notable patterns in the nature of Local Court finalisations. The rise in Local Court finalisations is due to an increase in matters withdrawn by the prosecution (up 41% over 2019), ex parte convictions (up 29% over 2019), and matters dismissed on mental health grounds (up 28% over 2019). The number of matters finalised by guilty plea was largely equivalent to 2019. By contrast, in 2022 the Local Court finalised 14% fewer defended hearings than in the year prior to the pandemic (2019).
- Time to finalise defended hearings in the Local Court remains substantially longer than prior to the pandemic. In 2022 the median time to finalise a defended hearing in the Local Court was 310 days; this is more than three months longer (108 days) than in 2019 when delay was 202 days.
- Sentencing figures show a reduction in both the number and proportion of proven offenders receiving a custodial penalty in 2022 compared with 2019 (11,083 or 8.7% in 2022 versus 12,129 or 9.7% in 2019). Finalisations in both the District Court and the Supreme Court in 2022 were still well below 2019 volumes. Despite this, however, court delay in these jurisdictions is generally consistent with pre-pandemic levels
