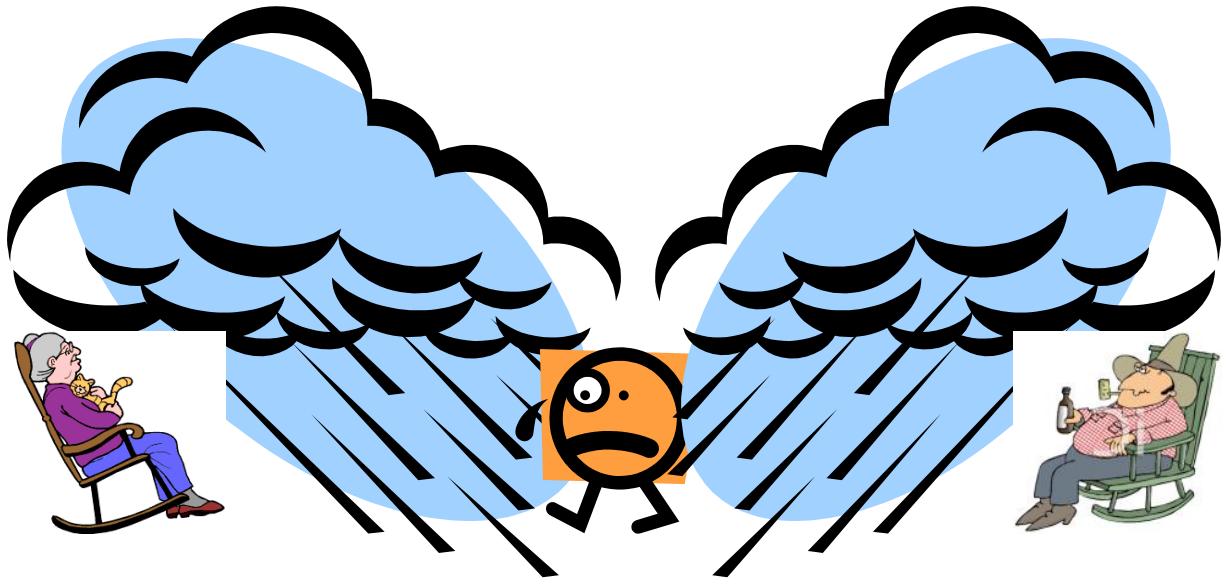

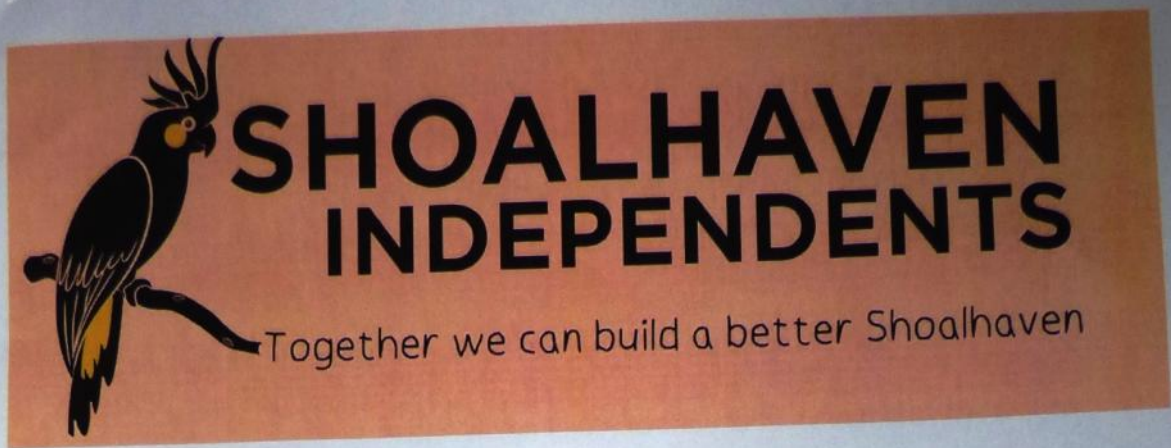

## **Marine Rescue Sussex Inlet - Autumn 2024 Report**

With the poorer weather felt for much of Autumn our tempo slowed a bit for much of this period. With some glorious days towards the end of May we have enjoyed the opportunity for more training and fewer assists/call-outs than over Summer.

Assists/call-outs:

Of six call-outs scattered across March, only one, a jet ski that broke down near the surf zone off Bherwerre Beach in Wreck Bay, resulted in a tow (back to Lions Park boat ramp in Sussex Inlet). The other five call outs were resolved before our main Rescue Vessel Sussex 20 arrived and the crew was stood down.

April bucked the March “stand-down” trend with six call-outs, with five of the six being vessels in St Georges Basin, two were towed back to Sussex Inlet and the other two were towed to Sanctuary Point/Erowal Bay. One vessel was a large motor cruiser that had a fire on board off Basin View that required a multiple rescue agency response as well as a tow. The only assist outside of the Basin being a jetski that was towed from Berrara to Bendalong after its impeller was jammed with rope.

Finally, May was relatively quiet for callouts except one that was just outside the Bar on the last weekend of the month. The vessel had been taking part in the very successful BROE Fishing Classic over the weekend of 25-26 but had trouble starting and running. It was escorted back to the Lions Park boat ramp in Sussex Inlet by Sussex 20. While Sussex 20 was ensuring the safety of boaters engaged in the BROE, our two Rescue Water Craft (jetskis) participated in a large search and rescue exercise with all the other Marine Rescue Units in the Ilawarra.

Fundraising: The only paid members of Marine Rescue are staff based at the MRNSW Headquarters in Sydney. All of the volunteers across the State (over 3,000), including Unit Commanders and other office holders at each Unit, are unpaid. While the State Government through our HQ provides some funding to Units, it is not enough to fully cover operations and other running expenditures. This is why you always find MRNSW members doing BBQs, Raffles and other events to raise money.

At our Sussex Inlet Unit we have raised much of our funds over Autumn through providing Boat Licensing Courses for the public at our base, a food van BBQ and raffles at the Sussex Classic Car Show, and just around the corner will be the Vikings Festival on Saturday 8 June.

In addition to our own fundraising, Marine Rescue Sussex Inlet is very grateful to our Major supporters including: St Georges Basin Country Club, Sussex Inlet Bowling Club, Sussex Inlet RSL Club, Sussex Inlet Chamber of Commerce and our other notable supporters – fishing clubs, the local community and visitors!

Our mission of saving lives on the water requires the Unit to have sufficient trained volunteers on roster available to respond 24 hours a day to any emergency that might happen on the water. Recently, three more Crew, one Coxswain and a Radio Operator were assessed after their training and qualified, adding to the Unit’s capability.

David “Crossed the Bar” on 5 May at 79 years of age. David was greatly respected in the Sussex Inlet community for his long and active role in a number of local organisations. RIP David.

As you are probably aware, The Country Club Board & Management have been diligently working to ensure the long-term viability of The Country Club Vincentia. I am excited to share, that within the next several weeks, we will be able to provide the community with more specific details of our proposed plans.

We acknowledge that the interpretation of the information provided thus far has led to a mild degree of speculation as to the bulk and scale of the proposal, and to the future of golf at Vincentia. Nothing has changed in this regard with the Board consistently resolving to maximise the likelihood of sustainability, including the continuation of a nine-hole golf course as previously indicated. Negotiations of this nature are complex and time-consuming, but they are necessary to achieve the best outcomes for all involved. By committing to this process, we believe we have secured far greater potential to ensure the future viability of a golf course and an integrated clubhouse and carpark.

Here are the key components of our proposed partnership:

A top-tier seniors living community, primarily located on the existing clubhouse site as well as the provision of a nine-hole golf course as indicated earlier.

A new, more efficient integrated clubhouse in conjunction with the seniors living clubroom, and a pro shop with rationalised staffing and overhead needs, all designed to be easily accessible to our members, the senior's community, and the general public.

An inviting alfresco area adjacent to the new clubhouse for everyone to enjoy.

Financial reserves to capitalise on future opportunities and to manage any unforeseen issues that may arise from time to time.

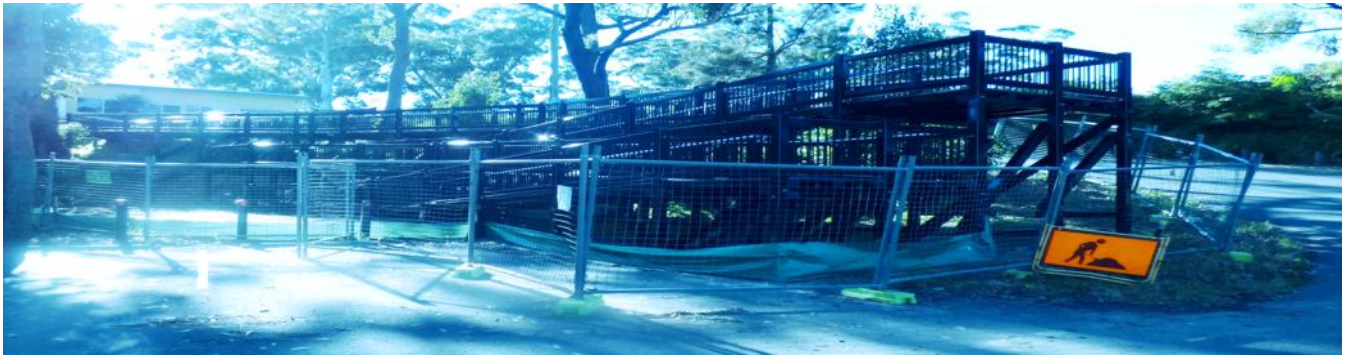
We recognise that the initial suggestion by the consultant to sell the entire Vincentia Golf Course site, contained within the feasibility report, was quite confronting for many people. However, while optimal business suggestions may not always align with community preferences, our commitment has been to take the necessary steps to sustain the golf course and this community asset in a financially responsible manner.

Although we have received numerous ideas from our membership and the public, they have largely been assessed as burdening the club with significant financial risks and have not been considered by the relevant industry experts as adding to the overall sustainability of the organisation.

The development of a senior's community not only provides the financial means necessary to deliver a quality product but also ensures a steady influx of customers necessary for sustainability.

In the coming weeks, we aim to provide additional details and keep our members and the wider community informed as much as is possible. We will provide updates online, through letterbox drops, and at information sessions, culminating in a vote to re-classify that parcel of land that is required for the senior's community, from core to non-core, thus allowing the Board to transact only on that parcel of land and not the entire golf course. Details of the proposal will be provided to members before the meeting to allow the members to make a fully informed decision about the future of the Country Club Vincentia. For the benefit of our community, we provide the below map, which delineates approximate boundaries and a designated area for the proposed seniors living community.

## IMPACT OF LABOR'S HEALTH CUTS REVEALED

The NSW Opposition has slammed the Minns Labor Government's cuts to health funding for putting major pressure on the state's hospital system and creating an emergency department crisis.

Shadow Minister for Health Matt Kean said that the health system is falling apart because of Labor's cruel cuts.

"Data released by the Bureau of Health Information (BHI) today show a hospital system under immense strain. People are waiting longer to be seen and their health is at risk," Mr Kean said. "The number of people treated at emergency departments within four hours is in freefall, with the January to March quarter producing a record low."

"This is a consequence of Labor's budget mismanagement. They have lost control of the Budget and as a result have embarked on a rampage of health cuts hitting palliative care, frontline services and emergency departments."

Shadow Minister for Regional Health Bronnie Taylor said the latest BHI data shows waiting times are up and the elective surgeries backlog is growing.

"While the Government are focused on cutting ribbons on health facilities that were delivered and funded by the former Liberal and Nationals Government, patients are left waiting in emergency departments around the state," Mrs Taylor said.

"Across our regions our dedicated frontline workers are holding together a healthcare system in rapid decline under the Minns Labor Government.

"AMA (NSW) President Dr Kathryn Austin described this as a catastrophe waiting to happen. I urge Chris Minns to immediately reinstate critical health funding and stop putting politics and photo opportunities before the health of our state."

The Opposition has also criticised Ryan Park for failing to acknowledge the impact of Labor's cuts including:

- An increase in the number of people leaving emergency departments without treatment
- Record high emergency department overcrowding numbers
- An increase in the average length of stay in hospitals
- An increase in mental health admissions
- An increase to the backlog of elective surgery and
- Stagnant ambulance response times

"The Minns Labor Government has no plan to address this health crisis, which is of their own making. Shamefully the Minister failed to even acknowledge the emergency department crisis today in a pathetic attempt to sweep it under the rug," Mr Kean said.

"Chris Minns and Ryan Park must reverse these cuts and restore hospital funding in next month's Budget otherwise this crisis will only deepen."

- ✓ Food and drinking water
- ✓ Mobile phone wall and car charger

## New Publication: Attrition of sexual assaults from the New South Wales criminal justice system

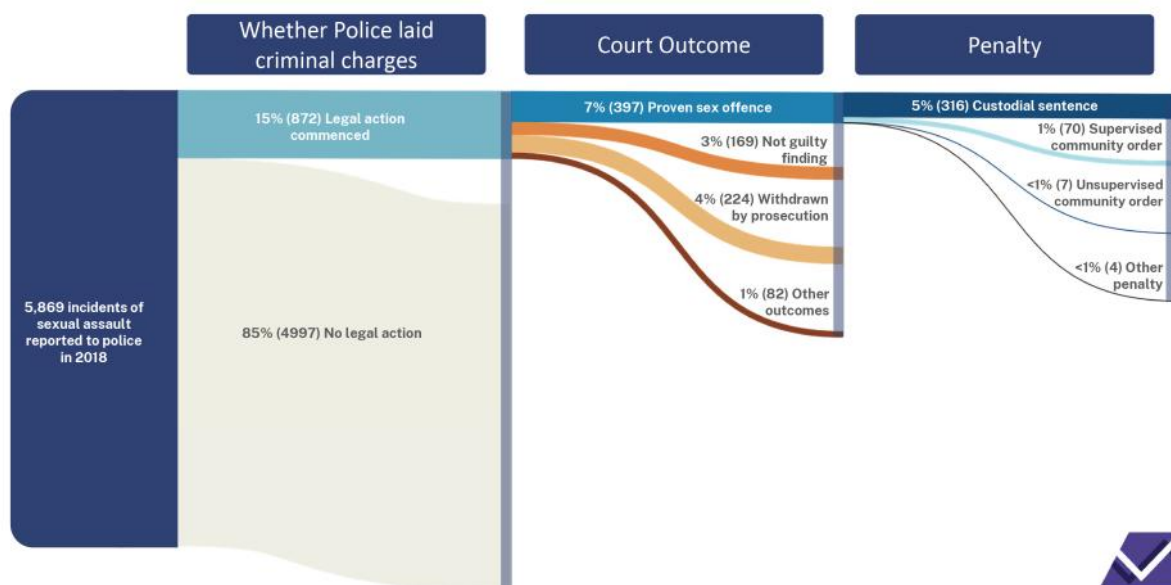
The NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) has released a new study tracking the progress of sexual assaults reported to the NSW Police in 2018 through the NSW criminal justice system.

Of sexual assaults reported to police, only 7% result in a proven court outcome. Similar patterns are observed for reported incidents of adult sexual assault, contemporary child sexual assault and historic child sexual assault.

The largest point of attrition is at the police investigation stage with only 15% of reported sexual assaults resulting in a legal action being commenced by police.

Among the matters that do proceed to court, fewer than half result in a proven sexual offence.
