






BOARDWALK CONSTRUCTION as at 3rd March 2024

New data shines light on the appalling state of our major roads

THE appalling state of South. Coast and Illawarra roads has been laid bare by the latest Australian Roads Assessment Program data.

As part of its analysis of roads across the state, Aus-RAP put together information on 1456km of roads on the South Coast and Illawarra, and found none of it qualified for the highest safety rating of five stars.

South Coast NRMA director Marisa Mastroianni said only two per cent of the region's roads received a four star rating, 26 per cent were

given a three-star rating, and 45 per cent was given two stars.

"Alarmingly, 28 per cent received the lowest one star rating," Ms Mastroianni said.

AusRAP aims to have 80 per cent of transport occur on roads at or above threestar level by 2030.

NSW BLUE GROPERS DESERVE BETTER

The NSW Opposition welcomes additional protections the Government has announced for our State fish, the blue groper.

Since 11 January the Opposition has been calling on the Minns Labor Government to invest in greater education campaigns, to improve signage where spearfishing is occurring and to review penalties to ensure they're a sufficient deterrent.

"We welcome the increased penalties for fishing blue gropers announced by the Government this morning," Mr Speakman said. "However, the announced measures are incomplete.

"Banning line fishing will do nothing to stop the main problem - spearfishers illegally targeting gropers and being slapped with pathetic fines.

"While the Government has announced increased maximum penalties, it has failed:

- to explain why it has not reviewed the inadequate \$800 fine imposed on the illegal spearfisher who killed Gus the Groper in Cronulla;
- to explain what education activities it will carry out; or
- to commit to improved signage especially around known spearfishing spots."

"My local community in Cronulla was outraged by the illegal spearfishing of the iconic Gus the Groper. They want our waterways to be a safe home for these 'Labradors of the sea'."

Shadow Minister for Environment Kellie Sloane said there have been numerous blue gropers killed across the NSW coastline in the past few months.

"While most fishers do the right thing, there needs to be better measures in place to protect these wonderful animals," said Ms Sloane.

"The Minns Labor Government needs to explain what its proposed education campaign will involve and ensure improved signage so people are properly informed about these iconic fish and the new protections they enjoy."










The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research has today released adult and youth custody statistics up to December 2023. Key results:



Adult prison population

In December 2023 the adult custody population was 12,091, the lowest level since October 2015 (12,081). The current prison population is 1,544 or 11.3% fewer than four years ago in December 2019, prior to the COVID pandemic.

The fall is due to a reduction in sentenced prisoners (down 22% since December 2019). By contrast, the number of adults on remand has risen substantially, up 416 or 9% over the same period. The number of adults on remand in NSW is now the highest on record. In December 2023, 5,055 people (or 42% of the prison population) were in unsentenced detention. In contrast to the general decline in prisoner numbers, the number of Aboriginal prisoners has increased. In December 2023 there were 3,674 Aboriginal adults in prison, an increase of 3.0% in the four years since December 2019. The proportion of the adult prison population who are Aboriginal is now 30.4%.



Youth detention population

The youth detention population in December 2023 was 174. Overall, the youth detention population has been on a sustained long-term downward trajectory, with 96 fewer young people in custody in December 2023 compared to December 2019 (down 35.6%). In December 2023 there were 107 Aboriginal young people in detention, which is 61.5% of the youth detention population (a new record).
