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

They disembarked in Egypt on 3 December and began training at Mena Camp, 10 miles from Cairo. On 21 December Major General Sir William Birdwood took over command of the Australian and New Zealand troops in Egypt, who were renamed the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps or ANZACs.

Early in the morning of 25 April 1915 ANZAC troops began to land at Anzac Cove on the Gallipoli Peninsula in Turkey. The small beach was surrounded by steep cliffs held by the Turkish forces.

The first casualty lists and accounts of the landing reached Australian newspapers in early May 1915; the official British report was not published until August 1915. By the time the failed campaign ended with the withdrawal of ANZAC troops from 19-20 December 1915, Australia had suffered 17,924 casualties and 8,709 deaths.

Gallipoli battlegrounds such as Lone Pine and the Nek quickly became familiar to households back home in Australia. The Anzac spirit, based around ideals of courage, endurance, mateship and humour, had been born.



Rather than acting as a drain your Yard Gully provides an escape for backed up sewage in the event of a blockage.

The grate is loose fitting and is designed to 'pop off' completely allowing sewage to escape.

To make sure your Yard Gully works in an emergency, check that:

- It's not covered or obstructed by soil, pot plants and other objects
- The grate is loose and able to 'pop off'
- It's not connected to your drainpipes or stormwater pipes (this is actually illegal)

- Ihere's a clear drainage path leading away from your Yard Gully so any spills drain away easily from your house
- It's been installed correctly. It should be at least 15cm below the lowest floor drain in your house. 10cm above ground level on a grass surface or 5cm above a paved surface. Water shouldn't be able to drain into it

Prevention is better than cure

Avoid a sewer overflow by following these simple tips:

- Scrape food scraps into the bin before washing dishes and use a sink strainer
- Pour cooking oils into a jar or old tin and place in the bin, not down the sink

- Use paper towel to wipe off excess oil before washing up
- Place feminine hygiene products, contraceptive items, cotton buds and wet wipes in the bin not down the toilet
- Don't plant trees and shrubs over sewer lines or near your Yard Gully.

DEFENCE TRAINING IN JERVIS BAY

Federal Member for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis, is advising local residents that the Australian Defence Force is training on the South Coast this month.

"There is nothing to be alarmed about and it should not interfere with our everyday activities," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"It is a routine training exercise and is taking place from 27 April to May 29.

"Local residents may see more military vehicles and personnel; however they should not be worried.

"There will be a simulated terrorist incident on board merchant ships around Australia's key maritime facilities, which includes Jervis Bay.

"This means that residents may see personnel in military uniform, carrying weapons and equipment.

"There will also be simulations for the use of ammunition and handheld weapons during this training period.

"Training in populated areas is essential. This provides ADF personnel with realistic environments, so when they are faced with real life incidents, they are well prepared.

"I would like to thank local residents and businesses in advance for their cooperation during this valuable training period," Mrs Sudmalis concluded.



\$1.5 MILLION UPGRADE FOR NAVAL COLLEGE ROAD

Gilmore MP, Ann Sudmalis, and Shoalhaven City Council Mayor, Joanna Gash, today announced the upgrade of Naval College Road, also known as Jervis Bay Road, Worrowing Heights, funded through the Federal Government Black Spot Programme.

Work has already started with Council engineers inspecting the site and design work commencing.

"Naval College Road(Jervis Bay Road) is a notoriously dangerous piece of road, known for being busy, with many narrow sections and a number of crashes occurring there," Mrs Sudmalis said.

"With the support of this \$1.5 million grant from the Australian Government, Shoalhaven City Council will be able to upgrade the road and make it much safer for motorists."

"Shoalhaven City Council has received more than S5 million of funding from the Black Spot Programme to assist in upgrades and safety features across the region.

*This project is a great example of how different levels of Government can work together effectively to find solutions for our region."

"Road crashes seriously impact our communities and this round of Black Spot Funding has targeted more than 19 locations to be fixed across Gilmore," Mrs Sudmalis concluded.

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor, Joanna Gash said this is great news for road safety in the local community

"In particular the funding will help to make significant safety improvements, including a nonskid asphalt surface on the road, audio tactile features (which make a sound when you veer off the road), reflective markers and safety barriers.

"These safety improvements will make the journey out to Jervis Bay a safer one which is great news for the many thousands who use the road every year."

Traffic Incidents and Road Conditions

The Transport Management Centre plays an important role in the collection and dissemination of information. Information about current and planned events on the NSW road network are now available via the link above



The TMC's Incident Reporting Internet Service, IRIS, provides real-time information on traffic incidents and road conditions from the Transport Operations Room (pictured right).

Road Occupancies and Developments provide information about planned activity on NSW state roads and other roads within 100m of traffic signals.

With your input the TMC can attend to traffic incidents faster and get you on your way sooner. Road users can call 131 700 to report incidents affecting traffic flow 24 hours a day.

Another Up-date on CCTV cameras for Sanctuary Point.

I received information from council on the 1st May 2015, that council staff would undertake a site inspection at East Nowra and Sanctuary Point on Friday 1st May 2015 as part of the works to deliver CCTV in these areas. In all, 12 cameras will be installed in these areas with 6 in each location.

Please excuse me for feeling very cynical and some what negative on this information, as after all it was only the 23rd of May 2014 (almost 12 months ago,) when Shoalhaven City Council put out a media release titled "Council calling for community to have their say on CCTV camera locations".

I hope these council staff who are handling this delivery, do not expect any thanks from Sanctuary Point, because since the incidents which have occurred, in Sanctuary point over the last 12 months, I can assure all of the readers of my Newsletter, that both Kate and I really wonder, if anything has changed in Council, over the four years we have been putting out the newsletter... 12 Months to arrange for 6 cameras in Sanctuary Point, would start the bells ringing, if I ran a company like that!

The Shoalhaven LAC Police Force

had pleasure in celebrating 100 years of Women in Policing on Thursday 2nd of April 2015 with the 100 years of Women in Policing Baton Relay and Shoalhaven Community Engagement, that was held at the reserve next to Stocklands Nowra (eastern end of Junction St, Nowra). It was an extremely special event for NSW Police and was celebrated throughout the State. 100 Years of Women in NSW Policing April 1914 - April 2015 

Shoalhaven Police welcomed the opportunity to celebrate 1915 the year New South Wales Police Department advertised two positions for female police, and from the near 500 women who applied for the positions at the time, Lillian Armfield and Maud Rhodes were the chosen applicants. They were subsequently sworn in as Probationary Special Constables and became the first two women in NSW Police.

The event commencing, coincided with International Women's Day on 8 March 2015, the 100 Years of Women in Policing Baton Relay started in Sydney then travel through the state over a 6 month period. The baton relay passed through the Shoal-haven area on Thursday 2 April 2015, where the Shoalhaven Local Area Command participants ran their dedicated component of the relay through Nowra CBD and to the Showground with local participants.

As part of the local leg of the Baton Relay Shoalhaven police held a community engagement event from 10am to 2pm at the reserve next to Stocklands Nowra (eastern end of Junction St, Nowra).

The Baton Relay started from Nowra Police Station at 10am and made its way through the CBD, before heading back to the community engagement event.

Entry to the event was free and the Local Area Command thanked the local community who came along and cheered on their Baton Relay participants and joined them in celebrating...
