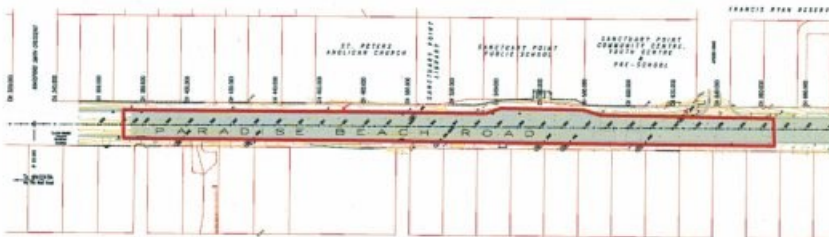
**Upcoming Roadworks – Paradise Beach Road, Sanctuary Point**

Council wishes to advise that road reconstruction works are scheduled to commence at Paradise Beach Road, Sanctuary Point, on Monday the 16<sup>th</sup> of May 2016.

The works are being undertaken from Kingsford Smith Cres to the Sanctuary Point commercial area. See work zone plan below.

The project involves the reconstruction of the road pavement and adjacent shoulder. The existing pavement will be reshaped and stabilised with a slag/lime binder to a depth of 250mm and sealed with a two coat bitumen seal.

While these works are undertaken, changed traffic conditions, traffic control and parking restrictions will be in place. To assist us in completing these works, please ensure that vehicles are not parked on the road, during working hours 7am to 5pm Monday to Friday, or as directed outside these times.

**Check out a few other photos I have shown on page three, I kid you not! They have been taken in front of my place, all over Sanctuary Point they are the same, or worse.**

**See how the shoulder is disappearing, with grass growing up to the road.**



These are but a few photos in our close proximity, the really nasty roads are in other locations within our communities, you know the ones that, when you are walking along the road, because there are no footpaths and when you have to get off the road, you almost trip over the rough shoulder and fall into a deep hole! Or perhaps you are the driver of a motor vehicle and when you want to park on the shoulder, you only see grass up to the road and you wonder if you should park on the road, for fear of annoying a resident for parking on his or her grass.

I know and you know the reason why vehicles are not booked, that are parking on the footpaths, is because the roads we have are too narrow to have vehicles parked opposite on both sides of the roads... So why have our council now allowed our residents; to replace what shoulders we now have, with grass?

This surely this will only make our roads more narrower and antagonise residents and motor vehicle drivers, into disputes as to where they should park!

**Please... Bring back the big yellow graders and return the shoulder of the roads, back into "SHOULDERS," where people and cars can safely use... AND THE STOMEWATER CAN FIND ITS WAY TO THE STORM DRAINS, like they do in the bigger towns and cities!**

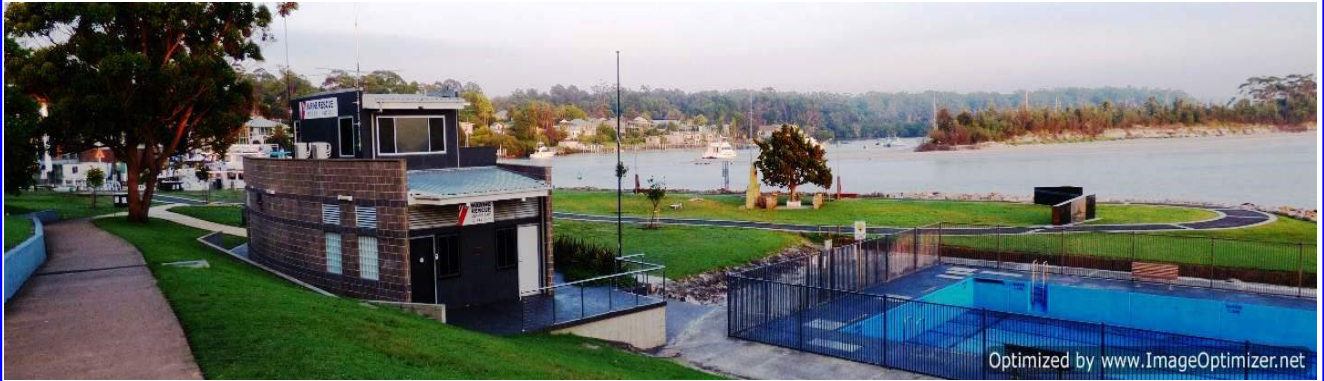

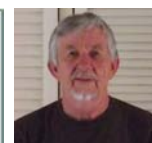

## HMAS Adelaide in Jervis Bay

HMAS Adelaide sailed into Jervis Bay NSW during the April school holidays and remained until 22 April 2016. During which time, residents and visitors to Jervis Bay had the opportunity to see the Royal Australian Navy's newest and largest warship.

HMAS Adelaide was in the Bay to conduct training to provide humanitarian aid and disaster relief, readying her for missions like that recently completed by her sister ship, HMAS Canberra.



Canberra had recently returned to Australia after spending a month in Fiji assisting locals rebuild after the nation was devastated by a cyclone in February 2016.

Adelaide Commanding Officer, Captain Paul Mandziy, said "the crew, were undertaking routine training and visitors to the region during the school holiday period, might find it a bit unusual." Captain Mandziy also said "Beecroft Peninsula will remain open to the public but we will need to close small sections of Target and Long Beaches on occasions to practice beach landings, an essential part of humanitarian aid and disaster relief training."

Captain Mandziy said "Navy had worked with local government and environment leaders to ensure the training had minimal impact on residents, holidaymakers and the surrounds. maintaining Navy's strong community and environmental stewardship, which is important for ongoing co-habitation of Jervis Bay," he said. "The Royal Australian Navy's links to Jervis Bay date back to its establishment in 1911. Known as the cradle of the Navy, Jervis Bay has been the home of the Naval College for Officers since 1913 and remains an important training ground for the country's warships," he said. "Adelaide provides the Australian Defence Force with one of the most capable air-land-sea amphibious deployment systems in the world. This is a new capability for us and to optimise the use of this impressive ship requires significant effort in training the crew members who bring the ship to life through skilful and professional execution of their tasks."

## From On The Beat - NSW Police Crime Prevention



In the next month or so you are going to hear all about the Dob in a Dealer Campaign that is coming to the Shoalhaven in May. The Australia wide campaign started in February and has been rolling through the city and country areas of our great land. It is a community engagement campaign focused on gathering local intelligence and engaging every Australian in contributing to making their communities safer places. Crime Stoppers provides the community with a safe and secure avenue to pass on information confidentially.

This means that you can ring Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 and tell the operator about anything suspicious that you may have seen or come across. For example, you may be thinking that the bloke in the house next door is selling drugs because there are a lot of people coming and going at all times of the day and night. He could be a dealer so Dob him in. If you have friends or know people who take drugs and you know who supplies them, Dob in the dealer.

Remember; It doesn't matter if it's a bloke or a Sheila, if they're selling drugs, DOB in a Dealer. If they are selling in your street and you want them to go, just ring 1800 triple three triple 0 Remember. You can call anonymously with your information no-one else needs to know. The information does not have to be about drugs, the information can be related to any crime.

On a completely different note, hands up if you are reading this article and your car is out in the driveway unlocked. If you put your hand up, please give yourself an uppercut (Not too hard), finish reading this great literary masterpiece and then walk to your vehicle with the key and lock your car. People are still having wallets and other valuable items stolen from their vehicles during the day and at night. If you lock your car there would be 1 less opportunity for a crook.
