MEMORIALS FUNDING BOOST

The South Coast is being encouraged to apply for funding grants of up to \$10,000 to restore and protect war memorials.

Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock MP said Community War Memorials Fund grants help protect, conserve and repair war memorials in NSW.

"Funds can be requested for specialist heritage advice or physical conservation work on halls, honour rolls, avenues of trees and stone monuments," Mrs Hancock said.

"Our war memorials give us a place to reflect and pay our respects to those brave soldiers who fought for the freedom we enjoy today."

Acting Minister for Veterans Geoff Lee said public commemorations at community war memorials didn't happen on Anzac Day this year because of COVID-19 but it only highlighted their importance.

"A lot of people missed the special connection you get from attending your local war memorial with your community on Anzac Day," said Mr Lee.

"That just reinforces the need to make sure these precious monuments are protected not just for this generation but for many more to come."

You Will Be Caught Illegal Dumping

At the start of April, Rangers located 10 cubic metres of household waste in Council owned bushland off Albatross Rd, South Nowra. Rangers have since identified the person responsible, in what is a great outcome for the Shoalhaven City Council Ranger Services team.

Council's Rangers engaged in an investigation following the illegal dumping. Their investigation led them to an individual who was formally interviewed and has since admitted to the act. The individual has been issued with a \$4,000 penalty notice and a cost compliance notice. This will see Council recover all costs incurred for the clean-up, transport and disposal of the waste from the offending individual.

The community is being reminded that fines apply for individuals and corporations caught illegally dumping in the Shoalhaven.

Residents are also reminded that West Nowra, Huskisson and Ulladulla Recycling and Waste Depots are still in operation. However, Council asks residents to restrict their activities at this challenging time to protect the health of staff, themselves and the community.

Fines for Irresponsible Dog Owners

Shoalhaven City Council has adopted a zero tolerance for unregistered dogs, dog attacks and unsafe dog behaviour.

A dog attack outside of a dog owner's property, no matter how minor, will now attract a penalty up to \$1320. Owners who are also caught with an unregistered dog will be given a \$305 on the spot penalty notice.

Council will continue to monitor dog owners to ensure correct control requirements are put in place to ensure the animal is appropriately housed, posing no risk to the community.

Berry Street Nowra, Streetscape Upgrade Works Commence

On Monday 27 April 2020, Shoalhaven City Council will commence works to upgrade the Berry Street, Nowra streetscape.

This project will modernise the streetscape (footpath and plants) while removing uneven ground and providing safer road crossing options.

Motorists are advised traffic controls will be in place until the works are completed in July 2020, weather permitting. During the upgrade, detours will be undertaken for northbound traffic on Berry Street between Worrigee St and Junction St and delays should be expected.

Council is committed to supporting the local economy during this time and is dedicated to continuing with all construction contracts. Council has appointed Contractor Vogue Landscape & Design to undertake the upgrade and has contacted relevant residents, community groups and bus services regarding the works. Council would like to thank road users for their patience during this process.

COVID-19: Resumption of elite and community sport

The National Cabinet has endorsed measures for the resumption of sport and recreation activities across Australia, including in Gilmore.

Senator for New South Wales Jim Molan said a set of National Principles along with the Australian Institute of Sport's, Framework for Rebooting Sport in a COVID-19 Environment, will be used to guide the staged return of activity as efforts to stop the spread of the virus continue.

Minister for Youth and Sport, Richard Colbeck, said the announcement signalled an important step as Australia, slowly and resolutely, emerges from the pandemic.

"The National Cabinet decisions map out a careful and sensible road ahead for the safe resumption of sports and recreation in Australia," Minister Colbeck said.

"Both the National Principles and the Framework recognise the key role sport and recreation plays in the Australian community and the many health, economic, social and cultural benefits it provides."

Senator Molan said planning for the future of sport and recreation in Gilmore would be a critical part of our recovery.

"I fully support the National Cabinet's firm resolution that the resumption of sport and recreation activity — at any level — must not compromise the health of individuals or the community," Senator Molan said.

The National Principles make clear how sporting and recreational activities can only happen where stringent, public and personal health measures are observed and required standards met.

The Framework for Rebooting Sport in a COVID-19 Environment was developed by the AIS after extensive consultation with sports organisations.

LOCAL MANUFACTURERS MISS OUT

Yesterday, the Morrison Government announced grants to help boost manufacturing. However, only one business in the Gilmore electorate received funding under the program, despite the region's high unemployment rates and the double hit of bushfires and COVID-19.

Member for Gilmore, Fiona Phillips MP said that while it was fantastic that Nowchem had received almost \$100,000 under the Manufacturing Modernisation Fund, she was disappointed that other local businesses had missed out.

"I will always support any program that helps create jobs and supports local businesses to improve their operations," Fiona Phillips said.

"But I know that so many businesses are hurting after the fires and now coronavirus, so I had hoped the Morrison Government would provide adequate support to local manufacturers," Mrs Phillips said.

Even before the impact of the fires and COVID-19, Nowra, Ulladulla and Batemans Bay's unemployment rates were 17.5%, 9.3% and 9.9% respectively*.

"We know that the South Coast has some of the highest unemployment rates in the country, even before the economic crises that have unfolded this year," the Gilmore MP said.

"The government needs to get serious about creating local jobs and stimulating our economy. We hear promise after promise of support but this is just another example of that support failing to eventuate,"

"After everything our community has been through, we need a government that is willing to step up – not one that has us living on false hope," Fiona Phillips said.

Yes another week has gone by and it is time for the next riveting episode of on the beat. The Crime report that's got more information contained on one page than all the info in wiki leaks and the National Library combined. Today's topic is Fraud. The offence of Fraud is contained in the Crimes Act

40/1900, Section 192E it carries a maximum penalty of 10 years in the Big House, AKA Her Majesty's Time Share resort. At the moment there are a number of persons who will have the pleasure of getting a phone call from me soon because they have failed to pay for fuel at the Petrol Station. A few people make a genuine mistake and forget to pay for some reason or another; however others just fill up and drive off.

Ladies and Gentlemen. It is an offence in this State and possibly every other state in the known universe to pull up to a Petrol Station, place fuel into your car and then drive away without paying. Even if you do not mean to do it, you are risking your good name and possibly a trip to Nowra Local Court when you get caught, and many do get caught. NSW Police have a system in place whereby Petrol Stations report all fail to pays and here in the Shoalhaven all reports are investigated. Don't be a fool. Pay for your fuel.

Purchases on Line:

On line purchasing takes the hassle out of shopping. You just get onto the Google net and peruse eBay and other buy sell sites, a couple of clicks with the mouse and you've got a bargain. Or have you? With internet shopping there is always the possibility that you could get scammed. If the item you are bidding for is unbelievably cheap and too good to be true, then it may be a scam. There are people out there that sell items that they do not have.

A picture of an item is posted and a cheap price quoted. You get interested and make a bid on the item. Let's say a 3D Television is on offer at a third of the price. You make a bid and suddenly you win the bid. You're excited. You contact the seller and he or she gives you some story about having problems with Pay Pal so you agree to put the funds into the Bank account quoted by the seller. Everything goes smoothly until you don't receive the goods. You try to contact the seller but you can't get onto him/her. You then realise that you have blown your hard earned money and somewhere out in cyber space you are getting laughed at. This is a real scenario and a number of people have been scammed. To make sure it does not happen to you. Your vigilance should always be maintained when buying goods on the internet and definitely do not wander away from the eBay rules.
