

#### SENIORS TRAVEL CARD - 20,000 GET MOVING

Just three months after applications for the 2021 Regional Seniors Travel Card opened, the popular initiative has had more than 300,000 applications across regional NSW.

Member for South Coast, Shelley Hancock MP said it was fantastic to see the keen response to year two of the trial of the \$250 pre paid Visa card.

"The Regional Seniors Travel Card was a commitment we made before the 2019 NSW election, and I'm proud to say it's one we have delivered for the people of regional NSW," Mrs Hancock said

"The card has been an overwhelming success, last year easing the burden of 337,500 seniors.

"Already in year two of the trial, 19,956 applications have been received from our South Coast seniors.

"This card is great news for regional seniors and another way we are injecting money into the bush with the benefit flowing for fuel stations, taxi drivers and local economies."

Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Paul Toole said it was exciting to see such high interest in the second year of the trial, which puts \$250 into the pockets of eligible seniors to spend on pre-booked NSW TrainLink, regional train and coach services, fuel, and taxis.

"The card helps ease the burden of travel costs for eligible seniors in regional, rural and remote areas of NSW, making it easier and more affordable for them to travel," Mr Toole said.

"We know how much seniors value this card – it can mean the difference between an extra few trips to visit grandkids, the ease of seeing friends locally or just getting to the shops or attending medical appointments.

"The card injected more than \$60 million into regional economies in the first year of the trial, putting money in local cash registers at a time when it was needed the most.


"Not only is this card a game changer for regional seniors, it's another way we are injecting money into the bush with the benefit flowing to fuel stations, taxi drivers and local economies."

Eligible seniors have until 30 November 2021 to apply. Seniors must be an age pensioner with a valid Pensioner Concession Card or hold a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card issued by either the Department of Human Services or Department of Veterans' Affairs.

### Have Your Say on the Draft Millards Creek Flood Study

Shoalhaven City Council is inviting community input on the Draft Millards Creek Flood Study. The <u>online survey</u> is now open for feedback from the community until Friday 7 May 2021.

Council engaged Water Modelling Solutions to assist with the preparation of the Millards Creek Flood Study.

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor Amanda Findley encouraged community members to provide feedback on the draft study.

"It's vital that the community has the opportunity to provide input into the development of the Draft Millards Creek Flood Study. The outcomes of this project can help provide protection for you, your family and your property from flooding", Clr Findley stated.

"I encourage you to have your say to help inform the draft study.

"The objective of this study is to improve understanding of flood behaviour and impacts, and better inform management of flood risk in the study area. The study will also provide a sound technical basis for any further flood risk management investigation in the Millards Creek area", Clr Findley said.

Council endorsed the public exhibition of the Draft Millards Creek Flood Study at the Southern Floodplain Risk Management Committee Meeting on 31 March 2021.


Council received financial support from the State Floodplain Management program managed by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) to undertake a flood investigation of the Millards Creek Catchment. Assistance provided under the NSW State Floodplain Management program is \$2 from Government for every \$1 provided by Council.



It will also include an exhibition area, community/multipurpose space, outdoor terrace, courtyard.


