JERVIS BAY FLYOVER GETS GREEN LIGHT

The long-awaited Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection upgrade is now one step closer to reality, with the submissions report released today showing overwhelming support for the proposed design. The \$125 million intersection upgrade is jointly funded by the Australian and NSW governments, with the Australian Government committing \$100 million and the NSW Government committing the remaining \$25 million. NSW Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Sam Farraway said the feedback survey results show strong community support for the project.

“The community, businesses and stakeholders had the opportunity to provide their thoughts and helped inform improvements to the design, which is now being progressed,” Mr Farraway said.

“Key changes to the intersection between Jervis Bay Road and the Princes Highway will involve realigning and widening the highway and an overpass bridge over Jervis Bay Road which will provide a better connection for road users.

“According to the survey results, 96 per cent of respondents strongly agree or agree the proposal will improve safety, 89 per cent strongly agree or agree it would improve resilience, and 94 per cent strongly agree or agree it would improve efficiency.”

Senator for New South Wales Perin Davey said the Australian Government was investing in the road infrastructure needed to support the South Coast’s growth into the future.

“The upgrade, including a flyover and roundabouts on either side, will make the intersection of Jervis Bay Road and the Princes Highway safer for all road users,” Senator Davey said.

“This will improve freight productivity, efficiency and network reliability, reduce congestion and support the economic growth of the region.

“We are committed to delivering the road infrastructure that locals, tourists, businesses and freight operators need on the South Coast.”

Transport for NSW received 146 submissions for the Jervis Bay Road Intersection project in its call for feedback on the concept design and environmental assessment throughout June and July 2021.

State Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock said it was important to get the design right and community input was vitally important.

“The community offered some great insights that have helped the project team make additions and changes to the project to better serve the local community,” said Mrs Hancock.

“The South Coast is growing rapidly and the road infrastructure must keep pace with that growth which is why I have been a strong advocate for upgrades to our major highways on the South Coast.

“The Australian and NSW governments are also delivering the \$500 million Jervis Bay Road and Sussex Inlet – Stage 1 and \$500 million Milton Ulladulla Bypass, which will improve safety, capacity and trip reliability on the highway.

“This takes the Australian and NSW Governments’ commitment to the Princes Highway Corridor to \$1.9 billion.”

Following consultation, Transport for NSW will also have more information on how to effectively manage traffic during work.

The detailed design contract has been awarded to Arcadis Australia Pacific Pty Ltd and detailed design work has started.

Princes Highway upgrade

Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection upgrade

We are another step closer to starting work on the [Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection upgrade](#). We're writing to provide an update on our progress.

Project approved

The [Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection upgrade project](#) has been approved for construction. Early work is on track to start in late 2022. This follows the completion of the environmental assessment and consideration of feedback on the [Review of Environmental Factors](#) and [concept design](#).

The detailed design contract for the project has been awarded to Arcadis Australia Pacific Pty Ltd and the next stage of design work has started. This will include finalising the design of the project before construction begins.

Submissions report released

Thank you for your feedback last year on the Review of Environmental Factors and concept design. Transport received 146 submissions from the community, businesses, local government and other government agencies. Feedback raised a number of matters including traffic and safety impacts as well as other matters related to property, biodiversity and Aboriginal heritage.

Design improvements

Following a review of feedback and more design work, important refinements have been made to the [design of the intersection upgrade](#). These include:

Better connection with the planned Princes Highway upgrade further south of the intersection

A new multi-modal transport facility, including bus bays, a kiss and ride facility, car parking and shared path connections, bus shelters, bicycle racks and lighting. This would be subject to confirmation of need and funding.

Extension of the northbound on ramp and merge length for safer entry to the Princes Highway

Safer access to local roads including Old Princes Highway and Willowgreen Road

Changes to improve wildlife connectivity.

Latest News



THE LEGACY of Eringa house and its influence on the people of Kapunda and surrounds has become more profound a month after it was damaged in a fire.

Formerly owned by pastoralist and entrepreneur Sir Sidney Kidman, the heritage-listed

building at Kapunda High School was burnt on Tuesday, March 29. It is thought the fire started in a transportable building and spread to the heritage-listed building. Besides the house, items including old blazers and honour boards were lost. The exact circumstances around the fire are still being investigated.

Kapunda Historical Society secretary and treasurer Meredith Mells said the fire had caused a lot of upset between students and parents, and a good percentage of people in and around the town went to the school.

"It's hit everybody," she said.

Historian and town resident Paul McCarthy taught at the school from 1974-2007. He wrote two editions of *Kidman's Legacy: Kapunda High School: a history*, the most recent of which was published in 2007.

He said the school became a strong part of the personal stories of multiple generations and locals became custodians of it; for example, students in the 1930s, 40s and 50s helped maintain the surrounding gardens.

"People felt pride not just of the house, but the grounds and surroundings - even the most reluctant students," he said.

To this day, admiration for the site holds strong.

8 TIPS YOU CAN DO NOW TO PREPARE FOR STORMS

There are a few simple things that you can do now to help reduce the potential damage caused by severe storms:

- 1** Maintain your yard and balcony by securing or putting away items that could blow around in strong winds
- 2** Clean your gutters, downpipes and drains regularly to prevent blockages
- 3** Trim trees and branches that could potentially fall on your home or property
- 4** Fix any damage to your roof including broken or missing tiles
- 5** Check your insurance policy is current and adequate
- 6** Make a plan for your family that outlines what you would do in an emergency
- 7** Put together an emergency kit
- 8** Listen to your local radio station and other media for weather warnings



New BOCSAR report: The impact of the NSW Youth Koori Court on sentencing and re-offending outcomes

A new Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) evaluation has found that participation in the NSW Youth Koori Court is associated with a reduction in incarceration, without any adverse impact on re-offending.

The study compared 151 Aboriginal young people referred to the Youth Koori Court with 2,883 similar Aboriginal young people who had a criminal matter finalised in the Children's Court through the usual court process.

Findings:

- Youth Koori Court participants were 5.9 percentage points less likely to be sentenced to a juvenile control order than comparable Aboriginal young people proceeding through the Children's Court (a 40% reduction).
- The evaluation found no statistically significant reduction in reoffending rates among Youth Koori Court participants. However Youth Koori Court participants who did reoffend were 7.6 percentage points less likely to be sentenced to a juvenile control order at re-conviction (equivalent to an 84% reduction).

Conclusion:

The results suggest an association between participation in the Youth Koori Court and reduced risk of imprisonment, without any adverse impact on re-offending.
