

Your vehicle may well become a target for thieves and opportunists who would love to steal your laptop or wallet. They are proficient in turning your I Phone into an I don't have a phone.

Police have continually advised the Public to lock their cars wherever they may park. The message is simple but there are still incidents occurring. At the risk of sounding like a broken record, please lock your vehicle at all times while you are not with it.
