



Greg Watson 40 years in Local Government 22 September 1974 - 22 September 2014

When the young Greg Watson was elected in Ward 2 he was confronted with the huge infrastructure backlog, of hundreds of kilometres of gravel urban streets... Yes I said Gravel! Which included some of the Nowra Streets. He also was confronted with an overloaded sewerage scheme, that needed an urgent upgrade and a water supply which failed completely in the summer months in Huskisson, north Nowra, Bomaderry and Shoalhaven heads and at times at Berry.

Greg's positive Council initiatives lead to him becoming extremely popular in the Electorate to the extent when he stood for Council just three years later he was swept to power with a massive 74% of the vote in "B" Riding (Ward 2) going to his ticket the greatest percentage of the vote ever achieved by a local government Councilor in Shoalhaven. So great was

Greg's vote he took all of the other members of his ticket into Council with him. This gave him the numbers along with supporters in the other Ridings to be elected Shire President (at that time the President or Mayor was elected by the Council). Over the next 12 months as part of his process to drive change Greg submitted over 80 Presidential Minutes aimed at changing Council's direction and catching up on the backlog of works.

Stuart Angus had been successful in establishing 9 new manufacturing industries. Greg was of the opinion that this success was worthy of an invitation to the Premier of New South Wales the Hon. Neville Wran MLA to perform the opening. Wran accepted the invitation and was the Honoured guest at a dinner that evening in the old ex-servicemen's club auditorium. At that dinner during his welcome, Greg suggested to the Premier that the Council would very much like for him to agree to the area being declared a City, Neville Wran responded saying "my colleague Harry Jensen may not like what I'm going to say, but I don't see any reason why the Shoalhaven should not be a city".

To name but a few of the countless issues that Greg Watson lobbied and turned around, for a better future for the Shoalhaven.

- Introduced the first integrated accounting and word processing computer system powered by Digital PDP11 and the old IBM Golfball typewriters became a thing of the past.

In the past six years Greg has continued to fight to get the best of possible outcomes for the community albeit in a quiet and non-public way. He said the real enjoyment that he gets out of being part of local government in the Shoalhaven is being able to help other people solve their problems and also to make the Shoalhaven a better place for all.

Greg Watson has not only achieved so many positive achievements for the Shoalhaven. Greg has always recognised that employment opportunities now and in the immediate future are likely to primarily come from development and as a result he has driven development at every opportunity with a view to generating every employment opportunity he could for our city's residents.

Time Line for CCTV cameras for Sanctuary Point.

On the 9th September 2014 I was informed of the time line for the installation of CCTV cameras at Sanctuary Point, Bomaderry and East Nowra and although many of you may have already heard the news, no doubt others are still wondering when they will be installed.

I grew up in a society where windows were ment to be left open at night to capture the cool night breezes, doors were left open during the day, window shopping at night was a treat for the whole family, trains, trams and buses were for transport and if something was not yours, you left it alone!

Today's society has changed and although we are a more affluent society, there are many amongst us who have wandered outside of Law and Order and has created a society of distrust and suspicion, where unfortunately we have come to the need of CCTV to protect what is ours from those who won't leave us alone!

The CCTV cameras for each of the Towns and Villages mentioned, will be Six (6) and will come at a cost of \$16,666 each camera, that will include contractual costs, installation and camera cost

Information received from Shoalhaven Council

"We are awaiting the initial designs from the consultant engaged to develop basic draft designs for the locations, a review of the Nowra CBD CCTV system with the aim of all these systems being integrated. We expect these in the very near future. This is a separate process from the Commonwealth funding.

Timelines for the project are as follows:

- Signed application is currently with the Commonwealth Attorney General. Yesterday we received confirmation that they are processing payment of the first instalment of funds.
- We envisage Project Delivery will Project Manage the installation. Their role will be to oversee the tender, liaise with consultant and contractor throughout the process as I have little expertise in this area.
- End of September: engage an independent security consultant to oversee final design, specifications and installation of cameras.
- October 2014: Engage contractor to install cameras
- December 2014: Installation completed with a final report to the Commonwealth in January 2015 and an evaluation report by January 2016."

More Police on the ground, or a 24/7 Police Station in the Bay & Basin



COMMUNITY PROFILES 2011

To put things into perspective, I have included Community Profiles at 2011 and Police Officers by jurisdiction, per 100,000 persons (NSW around 220).

Australian Institute of Criminology



Correct me if I am wrong, but! If the Australian Institute of Criminology suggest 220 police for every 100,000 in a jurisdiction, then where are the 58 Police required in the Bay & Basin in 2011 (220/100,000 * 26624 = 58.57).

With respect... Shelley Hancock MP Member for the South Coast since 2003 and Speaker of the NSW Legislative Assembly since 2011, has said it is the Police Commissioner who decides on upgrading of Police Stations and he is of the opinion, it is not a priority at this stage in our Jurisdiction.

If I don't ask now, I will ask when I have the next opportunity to ask... If Huskisson Police Station, manned with 11 Officers and 1 Sergeant is primarily responsible for covering the Bay & Basin's 29,624 persons over a 37,626 hectares area, on what basis does the commissioner base his opinion of Priority?

We are not bleeding down here, we are haemorrhaging down here, from lack of a 24/7 Police assistance within our local area, instead of being shunted off 30.5 km to Nowra or 90.1 km to Warilla and if police are immediately dispatched from Nowra it takes 30 minutes and the offenders once again have left the scene, to offend again and again and again!

Possible solution would be to utilise what you already have in the area and minimise the cost outlay of another police station, by obtaining land at the Crossroads Vincentia, near the new Crossroads Fire Brigade. Build a new building to accommodate the force needed for the present and future expansion of the area, transfer the 19 hour staff at Huskisson, assign another 5 hour shift to make it a 24/7, transfer all of the present equipment from Huskisson and then sell the prime real estate at Huskisson, to offset some of the cost to build the new appropriate facilities at the Crossroads. Then the distance to travel from Vincentia to Sanctuary Point would only be 6.3 Km or nine (9) minutes... "always!" As I said this is just a possible solution... Who knows, it might be better than what we have at present and it just might work!

Sanctuary Point Boat Launching Ramp is Overdue for some attention!

"St Georges Basin offers a number of boat launching ramps. The boat ramp at John Williams Reserve, Sanctuary Point is poorly regarded. It is deficient in various respects, in particular its lack of loading facility, limited ramp capacity, flat slope, and high wind wave exposure. Wrack accumulation is also an issue. Shoalhaven City Council (SCC) is supportive of an upgrade."

The above comment is not the Editors comment, although I fully support the comment! It is the first paragraph, of a 68 page report to Shoalhaven City Council in May 2012, from gbaCOASTAL Pty Ltd Consulting Engineers, that Council chose to provide an Investigation and Design for the Sanctuary Point Boat
