## Ann Sudmalis calls on all government representatives to show their support for Yerriyong Motorsports Complex

September 28, 2017

The Federal Member for Gilmore Ann Sudmalis has today called on both Local and State Government representatives

to back the new campaign for a Shoalhaven Motorsports complex.



Mrs Sudmalis said she was thrilled that the Yerriyong Motorsports Complex Notice of Motion got up in Council last night despite some minor opposition.

"We need to investigate ways of working with the public servants employed in the Office of Environment

and Heritage (OEH) to emphasise the incredible need for this project.

"It is now time for Councillors and State Members to stop the Political charades and support this project, because the community absolutely wants such a facility to be built here in Nowra.

"I've been working with a group of courageous and passionate motorsports enthusiasts from the time of the application's withdrawal from the approval process."

In May this year Motorcycling NSW chose to withdraw the Development Application due to an environmental study finding a reportedly endangered species of plant in the area, the Leafless Tongue Orchid and pressure from the Joint Regional Planning Panel.

"The application withdrawal was tactically a great move by Motorcycling NSW because it then meant that a formal decision could not be made on the project, leaving it open for another shot". (Continued on Page 2)

Mrs Sudmalis said the Federal Government has established processes for land exchange and or financial recompense for environmentally sensitive land use; however the State Government at the time of application did not, but may have now.

"There is supposed to be an alignment of environmental value between the State Governments and the Federal Government, however the primary decision is to be made at the State level."

Mrs Sudmalis said she will continue to advocate for the project on the basis that:

- 1. The species was historically listed as vulnerable, with no conservation plan or other formal species protection action, back in 1992. This orchid is not as rare as some proponents inferred.
- 2. Our region is desperate for a catalyst project that will deliver real jobs as well as construction jobs.
- 3. There was a possible land off-set proposal in train and it never had a chance to be considered.
- 4. There is a potential for a staged development which would then allow economic sustainability for the project and then further stages to be developed, and
- 5. Most importantly, the community really wants this project to go ahead. "Unlike many others, I wish to represent real people and their needs not just environmental projects," said Mrs Sudmalis.

Last Friday, Council hosted a thank you dinner acknowledging members of the RFS and SES for their years of service. On behalf of the community thank you to all the SES and RFS volunteers in the Shoalhaven.







Shoalhaven Water's Director Carmel Krogh has confirmed that with no rain on the horizon, the Shoalhaven is quickly heading towards its first restriction on water since February 2010.

Level one water restrictions are just weeks away with Shoalhaven Water preparing to turn off pumps shortly.

The Shoalhaven's main storage supply at Bamarang is an off-creek storage dam and is reliant on water being pumped from Burrier to maintain its capacity and when the pumps are turned off at Burrier the Shoalhaven is reliant on the current dam capacity. When the level of water in Bamarang Dam starts to decline, the next level of water restrictions is implemented.

# Land and Environment Court Hearing Update from Basin Villages Forum

### **Basin Villages Forum**

Representing the St Georges Basin Villages Community

#### **ANSON STREET 4 STOREY DEVELOPMENT**

**UPDATE: 26/9/17** 

The first Anson St hearing (for 2 blocks of flats) in the Land & Environment Court was held at BLacket Park SGB on 4th September, 2nd day of hearing held in Sydney on 5th. Some local residents attended that hearing and were disheartened although they had been told by Council previously that the DA complied with issues raised and that Council would have to state this. The Developers attorney picked out some issues with the residents speeches and Council's rep (as a Town Planner) and the developers Town Planner took the stand under oath responding to questions.

There was to be a 3rd Hearing day (22nd Sept) but the Commissioner was ill and notice was given late Thursday afternoon (about 5pm) that the Hearing would not be held but adjourned.

Have been advised by Council staff that no date has been set as the Commissioner is still not well and of course no decision will be reached on that last hearing day. The Commissioner will then take her time to read documents and make a decision. Possibly will take a few months and even though the height is permissible in the zone the buildings are definitely not in character with this area. It is possible the Commissioner who has visited the site and the area will realise this during the time taken working on her decision.

All of the community members who have been working to get the word out as well as speaking to the community and Commissioner have done the best they can and hopefully the outcome will be the best for our area.

A refusal with this first DA could make all the difference to the outcome of the RA proposal for the Master Concept Plan for 14 blocks of 4 storey flats in Anson St that is also in with the Land & Environment Court for which no date for conciliation or hearing has been announced.

There is still a decision to be made by the Dept of Planning for a proposal to come out for community consultation to lower the height now permissible on the blocks of land that the 14 blocks would sit on. This would mean the height that is now 13metres (4 storey) would be lowered to 8.5metres (up to 2 storey) A long way to go but is in the process.

A positive outcome for this also will make all the difference to Anson St development proposal.

#### Inspirational Water Director signs up for five more years

Shoalhaven City Council General Manager, Russ Pigg, is delighted to announce that a new five-year employment contract has been negotiated with the Director of Shoalhaven Water Carmel Krogh.

Ms Krogh commenced with Council on 11 September 2007 so the new contract was finalised and signed on Monday, the day that marked her 10th anniversary.

Earlier in 2017, Ms Krogh was awarded the "Water Professional of the Year" at the Australian Water Association NSW Branch Awards.

#### From On The Beat - NSW Police Shoalhaven Crime Prevention

### Scams are like flathead. Once you take one out another takes its place.

One of the most recent scams involves a call from a person stating that they are from Telstra.

Picture this, the phone rings and you answer it. The person on the other end strikes up a conversation with you. The person seems confident and nice.

Eventually the person advises you that he could fix any problem that have on your computer. You give permission for the caller to have access to your computer remotely. At this time you think that it all seems a bit dodgy and you voice your concerns.

The caller states that he is authorised to deposit funds into your bank account. While the conversation is taking place the crook accesses your bank accounts and moves money about from one account to another to give the appearance that money has been placed into one of your accounts.

You will then be asked to go out and purchase iTunes cards and forward the numbers of the cards to him. Eventually the crook will get away with money from your account equivalent to the ITunes card purchases, which can amount to thousands of dollars. Please don't fall for these elaborate scams.

Do not give any person remote access to your computer. Do not go out and buy iTunes scams for any unknown individuals. Always check the bonafides of the callers. You can always ask for the phone number of the person ringing you and then phone the organisation that the person purports to be from to get confirmation.

Don't use any numbers that are given to you by the caller, look in the phone book or Google white pages to get the number. The best way of thwarting phone scammers is a two part process. The first part involves you hanging up the phone as soon as you realise that something is a bit odd. The second part is walking away from the phone (landlines) or putting your phone in your pocket (mobile) and getting on with life.

Remember: Do not Drink and Drive, and you can Dob in a Druggie any time you like, by contacting Nowra Police or ringing Crime Stoppers.
