

The land for the Men's Shed allows the members to join with Council staff to take the major step of designing a building to house the shed projects. People often think the shed projects are all about making wooden toys. The actual truth is the men bring their own skills and interests to the shed. The variety is a reflection on our community. Metal engineers, carpentry and joinery, electric train sets, painting and even some adventurous types are forming a kayak group and plan bush walking trips. CCTV cameras for Sanctuary Point!

COALITION COMMITS \$450,000 FOR CCTV ACROSS GILMORE

Shadow Special Minister of State, Bronwyn Bishop today announced that the Coalition will invest \$450,000 to install CCTV cameras in four locations across Gilmore - Kiama, Bomaderry, East Nowra and Sanctuary Point.

"Our community has had enough of armed robberies, assaults and lawlessness on our streets," says Liberal Candidate for Gilmore, Ann Sudmalis.

"Kiama Newspower has suffered from armed robberies in the last 18 months and so too has Bornaderry Newspower.

"This story of criminal behaviour is being repeated across Gilmore, and something must be done. CCTV is a proven criminal deterrent.

"Not only does CCTV stop crimes from first being committed, but it helps catch perpetrators after the fact. The first thing Police always look for after a crime is CCTV footage.

"Today's announcement by Ms Bishop that a Coalition Government will grant \$300,000 to Shoalhaven City Council and \$150,000 to Kiama Municipal Council for these cameras can be credited to a concerted anti-crime campaign by locals across the region.

"This promise will be fully funded from the Coalition's \$50 million Safer Streets Safe Communities program which will reinvest 'proceeds of crime' directly into solutions that combat antisocial behaviour in our community.

Shadow Minister for Seniors and Shadow Special Minister of State, Bronwyn Bishop also said that she was pleased to make today's announcement, as she knows the Gilmore region very

"Jo Gash was a strong local advocate for this region, and today's announcement proves the people of Gilmore have a strong representative that will continue this work in Ann Sudmalis.

"I'm so pleased to make today's announcement, as the Coalition strongly supports Gilmore, and will always work with the community here to make streets safer," Ms Bishop concluded.

While in the region, Ms Bishop also announced that a Coalition Government will give \$10,000 to both the Nowra PCYC and the Sanctuary Point Mens Shed for new equipment, as well as invest \$300,000 for much needed upgrades at the Berry School of Arts.
