Sanctuary Point Boat Launching Ramp and Carpark upgrade

I have been into the Shoalhaven City Council web site for further information on the launching ramp and carpark upgrade and I see that council has finalised a tender specification, for upgrading of the boat launching ramp and carpark located on the John Williams Reserve Sanctuary Point.

The project has commenced and is substantially funded from the NSW Better Boating Funding Program.

The completed project will comprise of a two lane boat ramp divided by a user friendly low level jetty as well as improved parking. Work is programmed to be completed before the commencement of the 2016 summer.

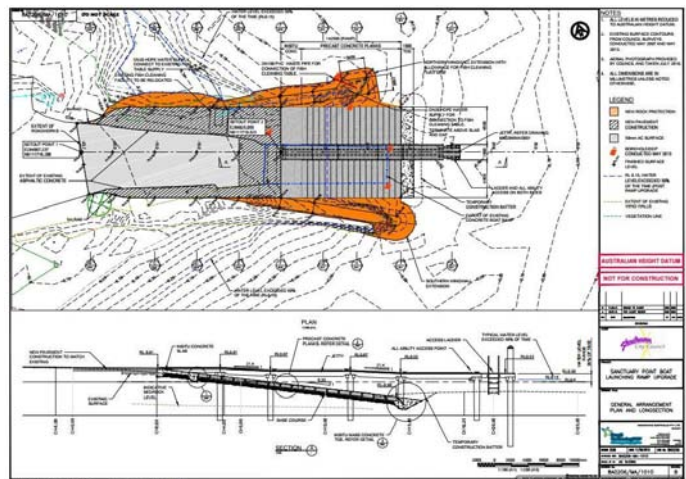

VIETNAM VETERANS DAY

50th ANNIVERSARY LONG TAN COMMEMORATION SERVICE

18 August, 2016

PROLOGUE

Vincenia High School – Beatrix Brady & Matt Brown

Today we commemorate Vietnam Veterans Day; we remember that over 60,000 Army, Navy and Air Force troops from the Australian Defence Force, and members from other Government Agencies served either on the ground, in the air or on the waters of South Vietnam during the period 1962 to 1973 - 11 years.

It was a period when Australia and New Zealand once again joined ranks and upheld the tradition of ANZAC.

Today, the 18th of August, is the 50th anniversary of the battle of Long Tan, where Delta Company, 6 RAR (108 men) came in contact with an enemy force of such superior numbers (2,500) that the results were absolutely astounding.

In a four hour period and with the support of New Zealand's 161 Battery, and the Australian 103 and 105 Field batteries along with helicopter drops of ammunition under withering fire and in torrential rain Delta Company survived and held the enemy at bay until reinforcements from Nui Dat arrived forcing the enemy to retreat. 18 diggers were killed and 24 were wounded but more than 250 Viet Cong were also confirmed killed and an unknown number wounded.

It was one of many battles our troops were engaged in over 11 years, and on each occasion they gave a good account of themselves.

Today we remember those who served their country in the Vietnam War. We also mourn with reverence and pay homage to the 520 men and 1 woman who paid the ultimate sacrifice in the service of our country.

They were the sons and daughter of ordinary parents; some with their own sons and daughters. They had wives in some cases; brothers, sisters and extended families. They were ordinary Australians who became involved in the trauma of war.

On the 18th August 2016 VIETNAM VETERANS DAY was held throughout Australia to Commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan.

I was privileged to have been asked to represent Hon Shelley Hancock MP, the NSW South Coast Member of Parliament and Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, to attend the Commemorative Service in Voyager Park, Huskisson NSW and lay a wreath in remembrance of all Vietnam Veterans from our Australian and New Zealand Defence Forces, who bravely served their countries between 1962 to 1973... **Lest we forget.**

This development has been lodged with Shoalhaven City Council after the re zoning of this beautiful, quiet life style village alongside of the St Georges Basin Waterway, After residents

alongside of this proposed, high rise blocks of flats, purchased their one storey dwellings.

Their homes, have been lovingly purchased or built by the residents, to see out their lives in the tranquilly of their surroundings and the privacy from their neighbours, who have also purchased their one or two storey homes, for the peace and tranquillity...

Having spoken to a number of the residents, who informed me they were unaware that Shoalhaven Councillors had re zoned the building height from 2 storey to 4 storey (this was approved while **Greg Watson** and **Bob Proudfoot** were councillors, prior to Joanna Gash being elected to council in 2012). For further information on this change, please contact **Greg Watson** or **Bob Proudfoot**, who are both running on Greg Watson's New Shoalhaven Independents ticket, in the current 2016 Council elections and giving their 1st preference to the **Country Labour Party** and their 2nd preference to the **Greens Party**... Unlike Team Gash who are not a registered Political Party, they are truly Independent and not giving preferences to any Political Party, as I would like all local council elections to be.

I was recently contacted by one of the Residents alongside of the proposed development of the high rise, multi storey flats, who was 75 years of age and only recently purchased his dream home, who asked me, if I was elected to council, would I support the residents where he was living, to reconsider the High Rise development, for a revised one or two storey development.

After interviewing the resident and his lovely wife, who was also looking forward to their later years of life, in a peaceful environment, I came away with the opinion, that this proposal was a great development for one or two storey, but! In the wrong location for a four storey development, where it would impact severely on too many residents, where they have made their homes, for their family, grand children and friends to visit, without the intrusion of being overlooked by their neighbours from four storey apartment blocks.

The residents who are objecting to this proposed development, only have small backyards, where some of them have lovingly created gardens and play area's where their grand children often play in privacy, when they visit, now! Only to be threatened with the possibility of prying eyes from many windows and open balconies and the depletion of most of the day time sunlight and the soft summer breezes, to cool the long hot days.

In a recent interview with 2 ST Radio, Bob Proudfoot, Candidate for Shoalhaven Council, said, that the DA for the Proposed Development was almost passed.

Applications Details of the DA16/1830 shown below, would indicate otherwise and when and if it was to be passed, Shoalhaven Council, would consult with the affected residents and ask for submissions to be sent to Council.

If this failed to halt the proposal, residents could lodge their objection with the Land and Environmental Court www.lec.justice.nsw.gov.au

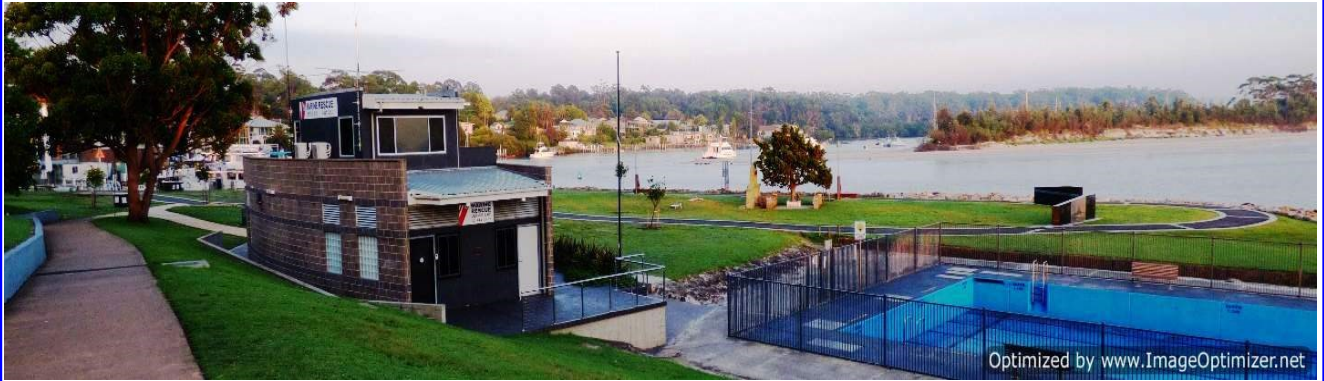

Check for danger/ensure area is safe

Squeeze the person's shoulders. Shout "are you okay?" and check for consciousness.

A Guide to Resuscitation

A AIRWAY	CHECK, OPEN AND CLEAR AIRWAY IF BLOCKED, Roll onto side, support head, clear mouth and airway.	REMEMBER, PHONE 000 Ask for assistance, phone '000' or mobile '112' for an Ambulance.
	B BREATHING	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'YES' Position person on their side, and ensure the airway remains clear. Continue to monitor breathing.
C COMPRESSION	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'NO' Turn person onto back. Support head and jaw. (A slight head tilt may be necessary to open airway) Give two breaths.	IS CASUALTY BREATHING NORMALLY? 'NO' Turn person onto back. Support head and jaw. (A slight head tilt may be necessary to open airway) Give two breaths.
	CHECK FOR SIGNS OF LIFE If no response and not breathing, give 30 compressions in centre of chest.	CONTINUE TO GIVE 2 BREATHS AND 30 COMPRESSIONS Only stop to check casualty if they start breathing normally. Continue until emergency services take over.

I congratulate Shoalhaven Council for erecting these signs at the aquatic areas of our recreation and as this guide is part of the First Aid Training Courses I undertake, it is also applicable to any instances where First Aid is required.

I have include this in my newsletter and perhaps it might one day save a life, or inspire other concerned citizens to undertake a first aid course!

Pauline is a 15-year-old teenager and like most of our teenagers, uses the Internet, tweets, twitters, Snapchats, Facebooks and texts. She has many friends and follows many others.

Pauline doesn't realise that anything she does online can be permanent and what she puts on line today may have an impact on her future. One day Pauline came back from school upset.

Her mother asked, "What's wrong? Pauline said "nothing" and went straight to her bedroom. Sometime later her mother went into Pauline's bedroom. Pauline was curled up on the bed and would not say what had happened to make her upset.

Later that evening Pauline's mother heard a notification alert, she looked around and saw Pauline's mobile phone. She found a message from a kid called Louise who had posted hurtful messages online about Pauline as well as nasty online gossip and chat.

Pauline's mother did not know what to do. It broke her heart that her little girl was upset. After all she was still a baby in her eyes, immature and needing protection.

This is only one example of cyber-bullying. You have probably heard about it before but do you know what to do when it happens to your kid? Cyber bullying occurs when someone engages in offensive, menacing or harassing behaviour through the use of technology.

Cyber bullying is usually carried out by groups or individuals who send messages via mobile communication or social networking which are threatening, intimidating or distasteful in nature.
