Residents urged to take part in online research

Summary

The NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) and Bushfire and Natural Hazards Cooperative Research Centre are conducting research in to recent fire conditions and are encouraging residents across NSW to take part.

NSW RFS Commissioner Shane Fitzsimmons said the research will focus on community preparedness and actions taken during the fire conditions across January, February and March this year.

"Earlier this year, we experienced the worst ever fire weather conditions in NSW, with large parts of the state affected by forecast Catastrophic fire danger and several areas being impacted by significant fires, " Commissioner Fitzsimmons said. "This research will help the NSW RFS and other fire services across the country better understand the community's perception of the bush fire risk and how people prepare for it.

"The survey is looking at how people received information and warnings during the fires, to see if there are ways of improving the way we get information to communities." Researchers from the University of Wollongong are particularly interested in hearing from people who were in fire affected areas, as well as residents who experienced the Catastrophic fire danger during February.

The survey follows face-to-face interviews with researchers and people in bush fire affected areas earlier this year. "It's important that we look closely at these events, and particularly how the community responded, to learn and improve," Commissioner Fitzsimmons said.

"This research will help all agencies better understand people's actions and ensure lessons are continued to be learned." The online survey can be accessed through the NSW RFS website at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/research. The survey takes approximately 20-30 minutes to complete. 

Council Continues to Support Australia Day Celebrations and Awards

23 August 2017

Shoalhaven City Council has determined to retain the Australia Day Awards/ Shoalhaven Medals for 2018.

A Mayoral Minute was considered at Council's Ordinary meeting held on 22 August 2017 to determine whether the awards should be deferred for 2018 to allow Council to review all the awards and events that are hosted and, ensure that Council is allocating its resources wisely.

The Mayoral Minute also sought to allow focus and resources to be placed on the Queen's Baton Relay which is to be held in Nowra on Monday, 5 February 2018.

It was clear from discussions at the Ordinary meeting tonight that Councillors would like to retain the Australia Day Awards/Shoalhaven Medal and ensure that these continue for 2018.

Mayor Amanda Findley said, "I put forward the Mayoral Minute to enable Council to discuss the Australia Day awards for 2018. In previous years, Council had struggled to obtain nominations from the community."

"I believed that it was prudent to review all the events and awards that Council holds to ensure that we are delivering for our community and responding to their needs. It is clear from my fellow Councillors that they would like the awards to continue into the future and that the celebrations around Australia Day remain unchanged.

The meeting also reconfirmed Council's financial support for the current community celebrations which Council has supported for many years.

"My intention by putting forward the motion was not to change any Australia Day celebrations. Clearly the Minute supported the continuation of these celebrations into the future. I simply wanted Council to consider whether the awards fit within all the other awards and events that Council holds throughout the year."

"It was important to discuss the awards for 2018 to ensure that Council is using our resources wisely, given that we also have the commitment of the Queen's Baton Relay shortly after."

Mayor Findley continued, "Council will continue these awards for 2018 and will be promoting the opportunity throughout our community to encourage more nominations this year to ensure that we have a successful awards event for 2018."

This article has been included, in appreciation and respect for the dedicated Patrol Officers with the NRMA who are at the ready to attend to your call for road side assistance 24/7... 365 days per year...

And for the helpful assistance of Michael, the patrol officer who came to our assistance, when my wife's car broke down on Walmer Avenue, Sanctuary Point NSW, with a transmission problem, on the 31st August 2017. Michael arranged picking me up at our residential address



and conveyed me to Kate's car so that I could drive it to our motor mechanic at Optimum Automotive & Towing, while he followed behind, in case I could not safely ferry the car to the mechanic. After delivering the car to our mechanic, I was driven by the NRMA back to my residential address... All part of a days work for the Patrol Officer.

One of the comments Michael spoke of, was when the NRMA are called on emergency assistance, primarily when keys are locked in a car, when the driver has got out of a vehicle and before they take out their pet or baby from the car, the door locks behind them with the key left inside. These are emergency situations and the Patrol Van turns on the flashing orange lights and wastes no time getting to the location, where emergency assistance is required, to unlock the vehicle and safely remove the pet or child from the vehicle. Some people impede the progress of the NRMA and even report that an NRMA vehicle was speeding past them.

As in the case of Flashing Lights from Police, Fire and Ambulance vehicles, you pull over and let them pass you... This is also the case with NRMA vehicles with flashing lights, they are not playing games, they are on emergency missions and someone's life is being threatened... Just think about it, one day it might be your life or someone you love, they are racing to help...

If you see flashing lights behind you... Pull over and let them pass, it could be someone you know, they are racing to assist.



Of the 9 tips on what to do when you find yourself locked out of your car, number 7 is...

If a child or pet is locked in the car, your request will immediately be prioritised whether you are a Member or not. In this case, call <u>13 11 11</u> immediately ...



with Senior Constable Anthony Jory Barbecue's, Frauds and Traffic

There have been instances where backyard barbecue get together's have exploded out of control in more ways than one.

There have been instances where the humble bar-

becue has blown up due to poor maintenance or construction, leaking gas cylinders or poor gas connections. This can cause serious injury or death. Other problems arise when you pour water on a grease fire underneath the barbecue or squirt accelerant on a fire. If there are people nearby they could be badly hurt and you may be looking at criminal charges in relation to a negligent act. What I am trying to say is, be careful with what you are doing, alcohol may cloud your judgment and you may not see the danger in your actions. The consequences may well change your life.

Frauds are still the flavor of the month for me. I know you have heard it all before and it's becoming boring, but until everyone takes their valuables such as wallets out of their vehicles and then lock the vehicle I will continue to rant about it. Your Credit cards within the wallet can be used at any shop that has paypass/paywave. You could lose over \$1000 overnight before you realize the cards are gone. One simple action can stop an enormous problem for you. I promise.

Traffic: Has everyone seen the Highway Patrol cars out and about? It would be in your best interests to slow down and follow the road rules because they are there, if you get a ticket whilst you are speeding you only have yourself to blame.
