Get Ready Weekend 2018



The NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) is inviting people to get involved in Get Ready Weekend and come along to a local event to meet their local firefighters. Over the 22-23 September NSW Rural Fire Brigades will host more than 600 events across the state featuring firefighting vehicle displays, information stands, kids activities and workshops.

This is a great opportunity for families to have fun, get to know their local firefighters, find out about the local fire risk and learn just how easy it is can be to prepare for the bush fire season.

IT'S A FACT! If you follow the five simple steps to getting ready and have a bush fire survival plan you will reduce the risk to you and your home.

Working together we can all help make our communities safer this bush fire season.

Top five actions

Don't know where to start? You can:

- 1** TRIM overhanging trees and shrubs.
- 2** MOW your lawn and remove all the cut grass.
- 3** REMOVE material that can burn around your home (e.g. door mats, wood piles, mulch, leaves, outdoor furniture).
- 4** CLEAR and remove all the debris and leaves from the gutters surrounding your home.
- 5** PREPARE a hose or hoses that can stretch all around the house. Just a few small actions now could make all the difference if fire threatens your home. Take a few moments out of your weekend to make a start towards preparing. It might be easier than you think! (Included as a community Service by the Editor for NSW RFS.)

Pambula Wetlands and Heritage Project Inc.

WETLANDS

This is a diverse estuarine and freshwater wetland comprising billabongs, saline areas, a tidal channel, tidal mud flats, mangroves and saltmarsh. These wetlands provide a final filter for the town storm water and floodplain runoff before entering the Pambula Lake, and at times are dry. They provide important breeding and nursery areas for a large range of animals including birds, fish and invertebrates.

HERITAGE

The floodplain has a wealth of history. For thousands of years it was frequented by Aborigines of the Thaua clan of the Yuin nation. Its first white settlers arrived in 1835. Since then these fertile river flats have provided valuable farming land for dairying and grain production. It was here the original township of Pambula was devastated by flood. Syms Covington, Charles Darwin's assistant, owned cultivation blocks on the flats. Tallow and hides processed on the floodplain were shipped down the river. Chinese market gardeners grew vegetables for gold miners, and for one hundred years keen racegoers attended meetings of the Imlay Racing Club, until 1997.

DOGS

This is a conservation area and no dogs are permitted within the fenced areas, including the racecourse.

Panboola aims to:

RESTORE the Pambula floodplain as a significant natural wetland.

CONSERVE fauna and flora native to the area.

PROTECT Aboriginal and cultural values attached to the land.

MAINTAIN the floodplain for passive enjoyment and educational use.

ENCOURAGE public participation in the management of the wetland.

What is Panboola?

Extending from the bottom of Pambula township to the Pambula River, Panboola (the Aboriginal name for the area) consists of 82 hectares of land. Local benefactors to the community donated 55 hectares which is managed by the Pambula Wetlands and Heritage Project Inc.

The Old Pambula Racecourse has 27 hectares of Crown Land and is managed by the Pambula Wetlands and Heritage Reserve Trust.

These two areas are jointly administered by community volunteers.

What does the management of Panboola involve?

Panboola is being rehabilitated with community assistance as a wetland for the purpose of nature conservation by protecting and restoring habitat for native wildlife.

A system of walking tracks continues to be extended leading visitors to destinations such as saltmarsh, the Pambula River, Old Pambula Racecourse and opportunities for nature watching.

An area of farmland is managed in an environmentally sustainable way to assist with recurring costs.

Funding grants are sourced and community volunteers, business and professional people, schools and government agencies provide energy, guidance and assistance.

We invite your interest and help to restore, revive and respect the site for all to enjoy.

The 'Friends of Panboola' meet at Robs Shed each Thursday morning from 9am to 12 noon to undertake maintenance and development. Everyone is welcome!

Annual membership is \$10 per individual or household and assists greatly in the conservation and protection of our community asset ensuring Panboola continues to grow as a special place to visit. Members receive our quarterly newsletter, invitations to special events and free entry to activities conducted by Panboola.

For six years I have fought for funding for the New Nowra Bridge. The Federal Government investment of the initial \$10 million for the location and geotechnical studies combined with the commitment of \$155 million, half the construction costs now matched by the State Government, will deliver -

- shorter travel times
- accessibility for tourism
- productivity gains for the freight demands
- better servicing for our locals travelling between Bomaderry and Nowra.

Now, the concept design and environmental assessment for the new Bridge is available for review and public comment.

Providing for easier, safer and quicker access to local roads, the New Nowra Bridge will allow more large freight vehicles to travel through the area without height restriction, thereby unlocking economic opportunities for Gilmore.

New cyclist and pedestrian links are also central to this project and will make the bridge much more user-friendly.

Community members are invited to help refine the concept design and review the environmental assessment until Friday, 28 September 2018.

Roads and Maritime Services is hosting five drop-in sessions between 1 and 13 September 2018.

The Nowra Bridge project is jointly funded, with the NSW and Australian Governments contributing \$155 million each. The project is expected to be completed by mid-2023.

NSW GOVERNMENT PURCHASES SHOALHAVEN ANGLICAN SCHOOL SITE

Minister for Education Rob Stokes and Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock today joined the local community to announce the NSW Government had purchased the former Shoalhaven Anglican School.

The purchase of the Shoalhaven Anglican School site by the NSW Government guarantees education will be provided on the site for decades to come.

The announcement follows a lengthy campaign by the Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock and the entire southern Shoalhaven community, generating over 10,000 petition signatures, an address to the State Parliament, debate on the floor of Shoalhaven City Council and countless representations to the Minister for Education and the Anglican Schools Corporation.

"The Shoalhaven Anglican School announced the closure of its Milton campus in 2016, after the closure of its secondary education streams the year before," Mr Stokes said.

"I am pleased to confirm the Department of Education has reached an agreement to purchase the site following negotiations with the Anglican Schools Corporation, with contracts now exchanged."

Member for South Coast was overjoyed at the result and expressed her appreciation to the community who joined with her for the entirety of the campaign.

"We did it!" Mrs Hancock said.

"It was not always easy, and at times it did not look like we were going to get across the line, however thanks to the NSW Government and Minister for Education Rob Stokes, this site has now been secured as an education facility.

"It makes perfect sense to continue providing education on the site and I am keen to work closely with Minister Stokes and the community as consideration is given to deliver the most suitable education salutation to meet local needs.

"Thank you to everyone who made this happen. Without your support, your voices, your signatures and your encouragement, we would not have been able to secure this site as a school.

"Now, this is well and truly the community's school and I look forward to working with them to determine the future plans for the site," Mrs Hancock said.

The Shoalhaven Anglican School site contains former school buildings that are readily and easily adaptable for use by the department, with the potential to accommodate students with specific needs.

Three additional government schools serve the area: Milton Public School, Ulladulla Public School and Ulladulla High School.

The NSW Government's is also investing a record \$6 billion school building program over the next four years which will deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities throughout NSW. This is the largest investment into public school infrastructure by any state government in Australian history.

Shoalhaven Cancer Care Centre

The Shoalhaven Cancer Care Centre (SCCC) opened in 2013 and provides essential cancer services for the growing South Coast population through every stage of the patient journey. SCCC provides integrated multidisciplinary cancer care with increased access to medical oncology, radiation therapy, allied health and support services.

The \$5.3m second linear accelerator was purchased and installed at the Shoalhaven Cancer Care Centre. The linear accelerator commenced operation in March 2017.



THE SCCC HOUSES:

- Inpatient partnership with Wollongong Hospital and Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital
- Medical Oncology consultation and treatment facilities
- Day Oncology (6 chemotherapy/ infusion chairs)
- Haematology consultation and treatment facilities
- Radiation Oncology consultation and treatment facilities (1 linear accelerator)
- Research/Clinical Trials
- Patient support areas
- Cancer Council NSW Patient Information Centre
- Accommodation

SCCC Accommodation – the cost of accommodation is \$43 for single, or \$60 for double. These prices are subject to change so please call the Cancer Council on (02) 4223 0215 and confirm at time of booking. If you live more than 100kms away from the centre and are not in a private health fund, you may be eligible to claim costs from Isolated Patients Travel & Accommodation Assistance Scheme (call IPTAAS on 1800 478 227 to determine your eligibility). If you are not eligible for the IPTAAS rebate and are having trouble with the cost, please contact the hospital social worker regarding accessing some financial assistance to cover or help with the costs. Some private health funds will rebate accommodation costs, please check with your provider.

SHOPPING SECURITY.

Let us revisit shopping security. When you go to the shops to get your groceries (Don't forget the chocolate for the Friday night movie) make sure that you have your purse, wallet, handbag or whatever container that you keep your money and cards in with you at all times. Do not leave it in your Shopping Trolley and then wander off to grab a bargain. Even if you are gone for a nano second you have just given a thief plenty of time to grab your purse or wallet, disappear down the chip aisle, past the deli and out the store. If you have the tap and go cards in your wallet the thief may also use them before you cancel the cards and you will be further out of pocket.

BizKeys:

BizKeys allows business premises location, key holder, security and hazardous material information collection in such a way that authorised users can access it from anywhere on the NSW Police computer network. Therefore, if you have a business, and your information is not on BizKeys you should think seriously about doing it. The information could help Police contact you if you have a fire, a break in, a smashed window or even storm damage. The sooner you know about a problem the sooner you can get it fixed. Also we would like to know if there is any hazardous material around the place so Police can take the appropriate action in a crisis.

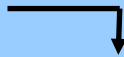

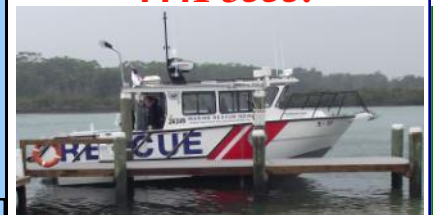
