

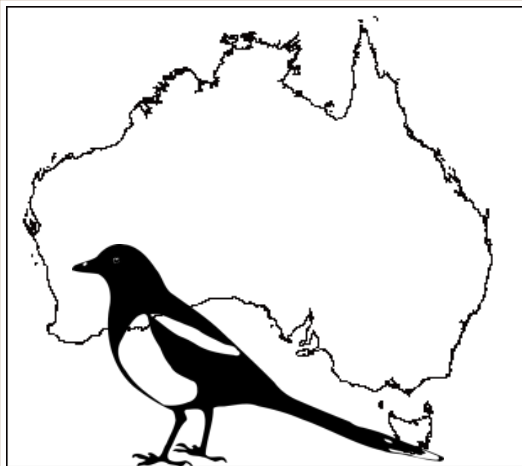

\$8 Million Funding Secured for a Brand-new Artie Smith Oval

Shoalhaven City Council has secured \$8 million to upgrade Artie Smith Oval in Bomaderry thanks to Stage 1 of the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund, co-funded by the Australian and NSW governments. The upgrade is part of Shoalhaven Community and Recreation Precinct (SCaRP) project in Bomaderry.

Council has allocated funding towards the delivery of this aspect of the project and to progress the planning and investigations for future stages of the broader SCaRP precinct. Shoalhaven City Council Mayor Amanda Findley said “Council is excited to be delivering an integrated community and recreational precinct for the Shoalhaven community.

This project is part of a long-term plan for the next 40 years and is intended to meet the needs of a growing community now and into the future”.

“The NSW Government funding will support the development of the southern section of the SCaRP Project being the Artie Smith Oval redevelopment, which will be upgraded to a state-level facility for AFL and cricket, with new croquet lawns and associated infrastructure,” Cllr Findley said.

Council has been working with the user groups and state sporting bodies to develop the plans for this great facility.

Council expects plans will go out to tender in late August with works to get underway late 2021. The project is expected to be completed by first half of 2023.

The new Artie Smith Oval will provide a state-level standard facility:

New AFL/Cricket with 5 turf pitches, lighting, irrigation drainage, picket fencing electronic scoreboard, sight screens, and spectator seating/mounding AFL/Cricket Clubhouse and amenities Cricket Practice facility (4 X Synthetic pitches, 4 X turf pitches, storage



shed) Four croquet courts; Croquet clubhouse and amenities; Onsite car parking, Open space embellishments, (pathways, landscaping, furniture, etc.) Perimeter security fencing.

Our local GPs and health workers do an amazing job but we need to support them more. The Gilmore electorate has been battling a critical lack of GPs for far too long, resulting in the closure of some practices, a blowout in waiting times to see a GP and many practices closing their books to new patients.

For your information, this shortage of general practitioners, has actually become the subject of a Senate Inquiry. The Morrison Government was not interested in voting for this inquiry. However, I am pleased to say that Labor, along with several crossbench Senators, have successfully established this inquiry.

We need practical, positive solutions to make sure Australians have access to quality health care regardless of where they live. Under the Morrison Government's current system, most of the NSW South Coast is classified as a "non-Distribution Priority Area" (DPA), which is why it's difficult for local practices to access GPs.

The Senate Inquiry will specifically examine reforms made to the DPA classification system and GP training.

At a time when our community is in lockdown, it's more important than ever to have access to GPs - which is why this inquiry is so important.

Green Ceramics MICROfactorie™ Comes to West Nowra

Shoalhaven City Council has received grant funding of \$500,000 from the Environment Trust to enter into a partnership with University of NSW's Sustainable Materials & Technology Centre (UNSW SMaRT Centre) to establish a Green Ceramics MICROfactorie™ at West Nowra.

The UNSW SMaRT Centre is a leading national research centre that works in collaboration with industry to ensure new recycling science is translated into real-world environmental and economic benefits. Essentially, waste is reformed into value-added materials for re-use and re-manufacturing.

The grant funding will see a processing facility housed at Council's West Nowra Recycling and Waste Depot. Waste materials such as plastic, glass and textiles and mattresses will be processed to produce a range of "green ceramics". Additionally sorted and cleaned waste plastics will be processed into pellets or 3D printing filament.

These green ceramics are a new generation of high performance, non-toxic, engineered bio-composites, for use in buildings, as furniture and ceramic tiles and for various architectural and decorative applications.

"Green ceramic" products are typically made from the types of waste glass and textiles that are either too highly contaminated (i.e.: spoiled) or made from composite materials, rendering them difficult to recycle.

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor Amanda Findley said "We are adding another R: Reform, to the traditional three Rs of Reduce, Reuse and Recycle, by seeking partners that share our vision that "traditional" is no longer enough. We need to be transforming unavoidable waste into value-added materials".

"With the addition of the Green Ceramics Microfactorie™ the Shoalhaven continues to lead the way in using innovative and emerging technologies to reduce the regions' carbon footprint and repurpose waste materials giving them a second life", Cllr Findley said.

Council will commence the construction of the Green ceramics MICROfactorie™ in late 2021 and anticipates the new facility to be completed by mid 2022.

Image: The glass pictured came from the remnants of broken and dirty glass from the materials recovery facility. This material is generally considered too dirty for recyclers. However, Council has developed a washing and crushing and sizing plant that can recycle it into glass sand.

EXTRA COVID-19 TESTING CLINICS OPEN IN THE SHOALHAVEN AND INCREASED VACCINATION ROLL-OUT IN THE WORKS

Minister for Local Government and Member for the Shoalhaven Shelley Hancock has welcomed the opening of two more COVID-19 testing clinics in the Shoalhaven from today, as well as NSW Government plans to extend the vaccine rollout in coming weeks.

The Local Health District has also advised a number of outreach vaccine clinics have been held, including a clinic at Cullunghutti Aboriginal Child and Family Centre in Nowra yesterday, following confirmation of two COVID-19 cases in the area.

“As I had hoped, extra COVID-19 testing sites are open from 8am today in the Shoalhaven, one at Bomaderry and another at Huskisson,” Mrs Hancock said.

“It is great to see a targeted and rapid response following the confirmation of two COVID-19 positive cases in the Shoalhaven.”

Both positive cases were notified late Thursday afternoon. One person has links to Sydney with no venues of concerns identified, and the other remains under investigation.

Details of the additional testing clinics open from today, September 4, are;

In addition, further plans are in the works to extend the offering of AstraZeneca in Nowra in coming weeks.

COVID-19 vaccination is also still available at Shoalhaven Hospital and at a number of locations, including two dedicated GP respiratory centres at Ulladulla and Sanctuary Point.

Many GP practices and pharmacies also provide vaccination.

The Local Health District is also working with the local Aboriginal Medical Services to support further vaccination of First Nations peoples.

Council Payments Online or at Australia Post

In line with the current NSW Public Health Order Stay-At Home restrictions, Shoalhaven City Council is reminding residents that the Nowra and Ulladulla Administration Offices are closed, and payments can be made online, over the phone, or at their local Australia Post outlet.

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor Amanda Findley said "residents can pay their rates or water bills in a range of COVID safe ways rather than face-to-face".

"While the NSW Health Orders are in place residents are reminded there are a variety of accessible ways to make payments without making the trip to town," Clr Findley said.

"Gone are the days where you need to walk into Council's Nowra or Ulladulla Administration Offices, as you can now make a payment online or at your local Post Office outlet.

"For some, paying a bill online will be a new experience, and Council's customer service team can assist with finding the method that best suits your needs.

"I want to acknowledge that the past few months have been challenging for many ratepayers and if you are experiencing challenges, I would encourage you to contact Council and advise them of any problems so arrangements or an agreement can be put in place," Clr Findley stated.

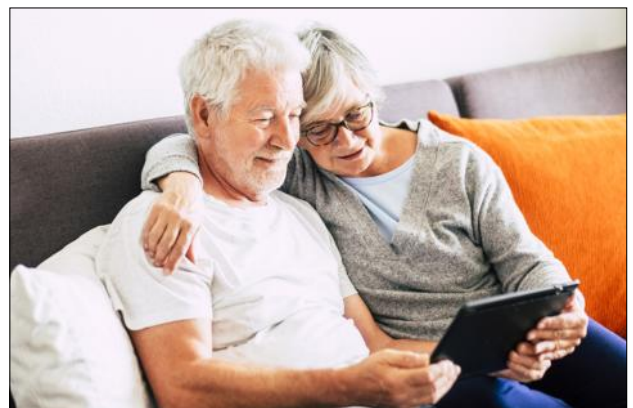
