COUNCILLOR GREG WATSON

Ms LIZA BUTLER (South Coast) (14:00): I congratulate Councillor Greg Watson from Shoalhaven City Council on his retirement from local government after 50 years of continuous service. Councillor Watson was first elected to Shoalhaven Shire Council, as it was then known, in September 1974. Three years later, at the next local government elections, Councillor Watson was elected as the shire president. What was outstanding was that Greg was voted in with more than 70 per cent of the vote in ward 2, taking his whole ticket into council with him, something that I am not sure anyone has achieved since. Many are envious of that and, I am certain, would like to repeat it.

In July 1979 the then Governor of New South Wales, Sir Roden Cutler, proclaimed the Shoalhaven a city, and Greg Watson's title changed from shire president to mayor, a position that Greg held until 1983. Councillor Watson remained on council as a councillor for ward 2 until 1999, when he was again elected as mayor, a position Greg held until 2008 when, once again, he remained a councillor. Councillor Watson has seen many changes to the council through his lifetime. Fifty years ago, when Greg first ran for council, the majority of our small coastal towns and villages had gravel roads and no town water or sewerage. I asked Greg what achievements he was most proud of. There were many. However, sealing 175 kilometres of gravel roads to bitumen in 2½ years would have to top the list. The cost of the program was \$3.5 million, which in today's terms would equate to well over \$80 million. The project commenced in 1978 and was finished in 1980. It was achieved by using in-house employees, which is truly commendable. It was done in-house, on time and within budget, something I am sure the residents of the Shoalhaven would like to see today.

When Councillor Watson was elected to council, only the towns of Berry, Nowra and Ulladulla had town water. While Nowra has had a wastewater treatment plant since 1937, other towns and villages across the Shoalhaven were not connected to a treatment plant. With the help of the New South Wales Government—namely Jack Ferguson—Greg Watson was able to get funds to have water and sewerage connected to most towns and villages throughout the local government area. The Shoalhaven now has 13 waste treatment plants, with the majority of those delivered during Greg Watson's two terms as mayor. Another of Greg's achievements that endures today is the Flinders Industrial Estate at South Nowra. Greg was instrumental in developing that land and, with the help of Neville Wran, in getting 15 manufacturing businesses to move from Sydney to Nowra. Neville Wran travelled to Nowra to help celebrate that achievement, which saw the creation of many jobs for the region.

Councillor Watson has seen and been a part of many events over his lifetime. During my time on Shoalhaven council, Greg was a source of knowledge and was extremely generous in sharing the history of past events. In the same year that Greg was elected to council, the Shoalhaven experienced one of the worst floods in its history. My good friend and Federal colleague Fiona Phillips tells the story of how Greg Watson rescued her from that flood at Terara, and literally saved her life. I think this really sums up Greg Watson. He was and is a man of the people of the Shoalhaven.

It is not easy being in public life, especially for your family. Families are often impacted by what goes on in our communities, and it is quite often the wives, children and other family members that feel the hurt for their loved ones. I extend my gratitude of thanks to Greg's wife, Robyn, and their children for sharing Greg with the community over the past 50 years. On behalf of the residents of the Shoalhaven, I congratulate Councillor Greg Watson on this outstanding achievement of serving his community for 50 years. I thank Greg for his years of service to the Shoalhaven. I know Greg is watching. I wish him and his family all the very best in his retirement.





Closure of The Country Club Vincentia With No Other Viable Way Forward.

My Fellow Members,

The Board of Directors of St Georges Basin Country Club deeply regrets to announce the immediate cessation of operations at The Country Club Vincentia, following the outcome of the General Meeting held yesterday 25th August 2024. The resolution proposed to develop a small portion of the Vincentia land for a senior living community, aimed at ensuring the long-term viability of the Club's presence in Vincentia. Unfortunately, this resolution was voted against by the members

We respect and acknowledge the decision made by our valued members. However, it is with a heavy heart that we must also confront the financial realities we face.

Over the years, the Vincentia premises have incurred significant financial losses, despite considerable efforts and substantial investments made to improve the Club's operations. These financial challenges have persisted, prompting the Club to bring in industry experts to explore viable opportunities. The proposed development was the only option with an acceptable level of risk, designed to secure a future for the Club in Vincentia with a brand-new clubhouse and quality 9-hole course for community enjoyment.

Regrettably, the Board has been left with no viable alternative to maintaining operations at the Vincentia premises. This decision reflects the financial constraints and the responsibility to protect the broader interests of St George's Basin Country Club and its members.

We understand that this news will be met with disappointment and concern. The Vincentia premises have been a cherished part of our community, and its closure will be felt by many. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all of our members, staff, and the wider community for their support and patronage over the years.

Our focus now turns to assisting our staff and members during this transition. We will be in communication with those affected to offer support and guidance as we navigate the next steps together.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation during this challenging time.




BOARDWALK CONSTRUCTION

Council is seeking feedback on two draft planning documents proposed to guide the development and delivery of a future new residential area in the new suburb of Badagarang, north of Nowra, known as the Moss Vale Road North Urban Release Area.

The draft Development Controls and proposed Local Infrastructure Contributions Framework for a 266-hectare site north of Moss Vale Road have been prepared to complete the initial planning work necessary to guide and enable the development of the new Urban Release Area.

The Urban Release Area was first identified for development in 2008 and will provide land for between 2,000 and 2,500 new homes, a local shopping centre, parks and supporting road infrastructure, over the next decade.

The Urban Release Area will include a range of lot sizes and a mix of housing types including dual occupancies and secondary dwellings.

"The Urban Release Area will contribute a significant supply of new homes close to the key existing centres of Nowra and Bomaderry," said Manager of Strategic Planning, Gordon Clark.

"Delivery of this future residential area is pivotal in ensuring Shoalhaven meets the housing targets set by the NSW State Government."

The draft Development Controls will guide design of subdivisions and dwellings, the street network, protection of the environment as well as management of flooding and bushfire.

The proposed Local Infrastructure Contribution Framework identifies essential infrastructure and potential ways to fund and deliver it.

"Setting an appropriate contributions framework which works with the cap imposed by the NSW Government on developer contributions is essential to support the delivery of this new urban release area," Mr Clark said.

The two draft documents are on exhibition from Monday 26 August until Monday 23 September 2024.


Aust Banners Triathlon Huskisson

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NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research Release

New publication: The involvement of young people aged 10 to 13 years in the NSW criminal justice system.

Link to report summary: The involvement of young people aged 10 to 13 years in the NSW criminal justice system Release date: Wednesday 14 August 2024

The NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) has released a new paper examining interactions between young people aged 10 to 13 years and the NSW criminal justice system. The study finds that most 10- to 13-year-old children who appear in court are from a disadvantaged background, have been a victim of violence, have had significant contact with the child protection system, and have a parent with a history of offending. Aboriginal children and children living in regional and remote NSW are disproportionately affected.

In terms of their criminal justice pathway, the study found that:

- Most young people aged 10 to 13 years are dealt with under the Young Offenders Act which aims to divert young people from the court system were possible. In 2023, NSW Police commenced 4,662 legal proceedings against young people aged 10 to 13 years; two-thirds (63) were formal court diversions.
- Of the 719 criminal court appearances finalised in 2023 involving defendants aged 10 to 13 years, only 20% resulted in a proven outcome; half (53%) had all charges withdrawn and a quarter (25%) had a not-guilty finding. Even where an offence was proven, half (50%) resulted in a court ordered caution or youth justice conference.

There were 171 distinct young people aged 10 to 13 years who had an episode of youth detention in 2023. These young people all entered detention on remand, and three quarters (74%) of detention episodes were for 24 hours or less.
