Information on the property sales program is on the <u>Get Involved website</u> and includes an interactive map of the properties.



Shoalcoast also offers telephone advice & information. Phone our staff to complete a client intake and a solicitor will call you back or an appointment will be made for the next time we visit your area.



Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection Reviewed 24 Apr 2024 Project overview

The intersection upgrade will improve safety for all transport customers, reduce congestion, improve access to local roads and growing tourist and residential areas, improve network resilience, support active and public transport users and support the growth of regional economies.

March 2024 - Major work now under way

Major work is now under way on the Jervis Bay Road intersection upgrade. During March and April, work will continue within the project area including:

- installing safety barriers
- clearing vegetation
- carrying out utility, geotechnical and survey investigations
- removing existing fencing and installing new boundary fencing
- relocating existing utilities, including water, electrical and telecommunications
- building a temporary u-turn bay and a local driveway access road from the Princes Highway.

During work, there will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work area is safe. Partial lane/shoulder closures and reduced speed limits of 40 km/h may be in place on the Princes Highway and Jervis Bay Road.

Motorists are advised to drive to conditions, follow the directions of signs and traffic control and allow an extra five minutes' travel time during night work.

3 May 2024 OPPOSITION CALLS FOR NSW GOVERNMENT TO CONSIDER BAIL REFORM PROPOSAL

The NSW Opposition is calling on the NSW Labor Government to consider urgent bail reforms when Cabinet meets today.

Leader of the Opposition Mark Speakman said the Liberals and Nationals are urging immediate action to implement commonsense bail reform.

"The Opposition has put forward three measures that will improve safety for women who are victims of family and domestic violence," Mr Speakman said.

"The Government's response needs to be holistic and far broader than just bail reform, but this is a good starting point."

"The NSW Labor Government can consider our proposals today, which address violence against women, improve protection for victims and survivors of domestic violence and enhance community safety."

The NSW Opposition has proposed a three-point initial bail reform response: 1. Expanded use of electronic monitoring devices to bail on serious domestic violence charges.

2. Expanding grounds for staying the granting of bail for serious personal violence charges.

3. Removal of the power for registrars to determine bail for serious personal violence charges where bail is opposed, given the widespread audio-visual capacity across our courthouses enabling magistrates to make orders from centralised locations if necessary.

The Opposition will consult on the initial three-point plan and on any other measures which are suggested to be appropriate.

"The NSW Opposition is committed to working constructively across the Parliament to ensure meaningful action is taken to reduce and prevent domestic and family violence across our state," Mr Speakman concluded.
